



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Greetings to you in the holy name of the Lord Jesus, our blessed Redeemer. As always, I hope this message finds you in good health, basking in the joy of the Lord and experiencing the peace of Christ that surpasses human understanding.

As we reflect on the verse from Luke, cited above, we are reminded of the value Jesus attaches to generosity of spirit, which includes showing compassion. In the passage, Jesus instructs us to give generously; in doing so, we will receive generously. This generosity extends beyond financial giving and includes exercising tolerance, for-giveness, and respect toward all people. At United, we strive to embody this spirit of giving. And we believe bigheartedness is preached and practiced from the pulpit to the pews.

Friends, as we continue growing in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus, let us remember that the biblical call for generosity promises benefits and reveals the depth of our relationship with God.

For example, 1 John 4:7-8 asserts that only those who love know God because God is love. The passage further declares that those who do not love do not know God. So, the power to love others from whom one reaps no material benefit is proof of one's intimacy with God. In other passages of Scripture, God explicitly calls us to love one another as Christ has loved us, forgive as we have been forgiven, and treat others as we want to be treated. The preceding references are all examples of generosity of spirit denoted in Scripture.

Now, let me share two ways we at United demonstrate generosity of spirit through mission work. We support home and foreign missions by donating money, goods, and services to the most marginalized people. The One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) and the Helping Homeless Families Initiative (HHFI) are two examples.

Our participation in the 2023 One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) was tremendously successful. With hard work (Ginni Hansen rolled and wrapped hundreds of donated coins) and generous donations from families and friends. UPC is contributing ten times our initial goal of raising \$100.00.

OGHS is an ecumenical offering supported by nine Christian denominations that use donations to help people worldwide. The money is gifted to aid those whose lives are upended by natural disasters. It is also used to fight hunger by providing farm animals and other goods to needy families in some of the most underdeveloped communities in the world. Some contributions fund self-development projects to help people sustain themselves financially. The OGHS reminds us that pooling resources can impact lives beyond our communities.

We are also delighted to report that on behalf of UPC, in March, the HHFI gifted to Newark YM/YWCA the following items1,470 disposable diapers, 1,536 baby wipes (unscented), and 36 Evenflo 8 oz baby bottles for distribution to families with infants and toddlers temporarily housed in the facility. We are collecting donations for the second quarter. We plan to expand our support during the summer by offering no-fee life-skill classes.

May God grant us the grace to remember that every small act of kindness and compassion improves life and pleases God. .

In closing, I thank God and you for supporting UPC missions.

Ascension of the Lord May 18th

Forty days after the Resurrection of the Lord (Easter Sunday), we remember and celebrate the Ascension of the Lord Jesus Christ into heaven. (See Luke 24:50-53 and Acts 1:1-11; see also Mark 16:19-20.) On this day, the church gives thanks for Christ's sovereign rule over all the earth, as well as his priestly intercession for us at the throne of mercy (Hebrews 4:14-16).



Christ is Lord

An excerpt from the *Companion to the Book of Common Worship* (Geneva Press, 2003, 108-109) The seven weeks of the Easter season include the festival of the ascension of our Lord — Ascension Day. With the raising of Christ to a position above all worldly powers, the earthly ministry of Christ begun at Christmas's incarnation now concludes. The path of faithfulness obediently followed by Christ traveled through the suffering of the cross to the exaltation of the glory. From glory to suffering to glory again is the shape of Jesus' ministry as well as ours. We too, are destined for the glory we share now in Christ only by faith. "It does not yet appear what we shall be, but we know that when Christ appears we shall be like him" (1 John 3:2).

Intercultural Church Sunday (May 21, 2023)

"God's Spirit created the intercultural church at Pentecost, leaving cultural and linguistic identities in place."

The Great Commission (Matthew 28:16–20) is an intercultural call to make disciples of all nations. As we engage in fulfilling this call, our commission to discipleship is sharing the good news of salvation with individuals from these nations in their own languages, traditions and cultures.

While in years past making disciples of all nations may have been understood as journeying to every corner of the world, today individuals from every nation are already living in our midst, so we can be faithful to our call right here at home. As we encounter new neighbors we can be transformed when we are willing to receive the good news in their own culture.

An increasing number of immigrants and their children living in our neighborhoods and worshiping in our congregations have been Christians for many generations. They have stories to tell and lessons that we need to learn. Their worship styles, languages, traditions and cultures may be different from ours, but we share with them "one Lord, one faith, one baptism" (cf. Ephesians 4:4-6). And these individuals from every nation are ready to accompany us in the journey to make disciples of us all, at home and abroad.

Intercultural Church Sunday is an opportunity to celebrate and embrace God's gift of diversity. It is expressed in the many cultures and languages of the world that embody all of God's people in a unique and special way.



2023 Theme—May 4th **PRAY FERVENTLY IN RIGHTEOUSNESS AND AVAIL MUCH** JAMES 5:16B "THE EFFECTIVE, FERVENT PRAYER OF A RIGHTEOUS MAN AVAILS MUCH.

The National Day of Prayer is an annual observance held on the first Thursday of May, **inviting people of all faiths to pray for the nation**. It was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of the United States Congress, and signed into law by President Harry S. Truman. The National Day of Prayer task force represents a Judeo-Christian expression of the national observance, based on the understanding that this country was birthed in prayer and in reverence for the God of the Bible.

The National Day of Prayer is designated by the United States Congress, when people are asked "to turn to God in prayer and meditation". The president is required by law (36 U.S.C. § 119) to sign a proclamation each year, encouraging all Americans to pray on this day.

The constitutionality of the National Day of Prayer was unsuccessfully challenged in court by the Freedom From Religion Foundation after their attempt was unanimously dismissed by a panel of a federal appellate court in

April 2011; the Alliance Defense Fund (now known as the Alliance Defending Freedom) provided the defense for observance of the National Day of Prayer.

MONDAY May 29, 2023

Observed on the last Monday in May, many people have Memorial Day off from work and use the long weekend to unwind at the beach or fire up the grill for backyard cookouts with loved ones.

Though the holiday is often marked with happy celebrations, it's intended as a solemn remembrance of U.S. lives lost in service to our country.

In 1868, Memorial Day was officially designated as a day to honor those fallen in service to our country during the Civil War.

According to the Library of Congress, three years after the end of the war, John A. Logan, Commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, set aside May 30 for "Soldiers' Memorial Day" or "Decoration Day" as it was previously known.

Eventually, Memorial Day was extended to include fallen soldiers from *all* American wars. In 1971, Congress declared it a national holiday, changing the observance from May 30 to the last Monday in May.

Mental Health Awareness Month

MAY 2023

May is Mental Health Awareness Month. While mental health is important to address year-round, Mental Health Awareness Month provides a dedicated time for people, organizations, and communities to join their voices to broadcast the message that mental health matters.

Looking for signs

<u>Mental illness is just that—an illness. Try to think of your mental health the way you think about your physical health. Here's what we mean:</u>

We all experience ups and downs in our physical health. Some days you might feel a little sore, or tired, or sniffly. That doesn't necessarily mean you're "sick."

Mental illness is the same way. The only difference is that instead of looking for physical symptoms, like a runny nose or an upset stomach, you're looking at your thoughts, feelings, and behaviors. Here are some examples of things that might tip you off:

- You used to be really cheerful and outgoing, but lately all you want to do is sit in your room.
- Things you used to enjoy have lost their appeal. Food doesn't taste as good as it used to, and all your favorite music just sounds boring.
- You're always falling asleep in class. It's hard to pay attention and do well in school.
- Your friend is talking and you're trying hard to listen, but you can't concentrate. All you can think about is bad things that might happen.
- Recently you started hearing voices that no one else seems to hear.
- You can't leave the house without checking all the locks several times. You do this so much that it's making you late for work.
- You're always irritated, and you can't stop snapping at people.

Of course not all of these will apply to you, but they all have something in common: there's some change in your thoughts, feelings, or behaviors that makes it harder for you to live a normal life.


It is with much gratitude that we say "Thank you" to all of you who contributed in any way to our annual Easter Egg Hunt!

CHILDREN'S CORNER

Parents, please read this to your younger child(ren)

Jesus Is the Way

Theme: We can only come to God through Jesus.

Object: Four signs with different directional arrows. (one up arrow, one down arrow, one left arrow, one right arrow.)

Scripture: John 14:1-14

Today I brought with me four directional signs. Each has different arrows. (Show the signs.) Let's see how good you are at following the arrows. As I hold up each arrow sign, look the way the arrow is pointing. (Go through each of the four signs slow, then fast to try to catch them not looking the right way.) You did pretty good. Now as I share about today's Bible lesson, see if you can follow instructions and look the right way when you see a sign.

Stop and imagine how Jesus' disciples felt in our Bible lesson today. Jesus knew that the day of his crucifixion was coming and that He would soon return to His Father in heaven. He was trying to prepare His disciples for the time when He would no longer be with them.

"Don't worry," Jesus said, "I am going to prepare a place for you. When everything is ready, I will come and get you, so that you will be with Me. You know the way to where I am going."

- ⇒ (Show the up arrow sign and have kids look up.) "No, we don't," Thomas said. "We have no idea where you are going, so how can we know the way?"
- ⇒ (Show the right arrow sign and have kids look right.) Jesus answered him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me."
- ⇒ (Show the up arrow sign and have kids look up.) Philip, another of the disciples spoke up, "Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied."
- ⇒ (Show the right arrow sign and have kids look right.) Jesus replied, "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and yet you still don't know who I am? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father! Just believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me." Jesus wanted his disciples to know He and the Father were one, and that if they put their trust in God and in Him, they would one day join Him in Heaven.
- ⇒ (Show the up arrow sign and have kids look up.) Sometimes life can be very confusing and we don't know where to turn or what path to take. It seems that every path we take leads to a dead end.
- ⇒ (Show the down arrow sign and have kids look down.) When that happens, we just need to remember that Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." If we will keep our eyes on Jesus and follow his teaching, we will find the path to our goal -- eternal life in Heaven with him. We can only come to God through Jesus.
- \Rightarrow (Show the up arrow sign and have kids look up.) -


Dear God, help us keep our eyes on Jesus because we know that He is the way -- the only way to You. In Jesus' name, amen.








