Dear Fellow Veterans:

"The British are coming, the British are coming..." How many of you remember Paul Revere's ride at the time of the Revolutionary War, but do you also remember what he said the end of this ride? (Answer at the end of this Newsletter.)

"THE HUEYS ARE COMING, THE HUEYS ARE COMING", The Veterans of Foreign Wars Post #313 and the American Huey 369 Museum Association from Peru, Indiana presented a very special and an emotional tribute to Veterans, both passed and living from the Vietnam War.

On the afternoon of Friday, May 27th at approximately 4:30 p.m., the constant "whoop", and the sound of the rotors, brought an emotional pleasure to those who witnessed the Bell UH-1 Iroquois Helicopter landing on the soccer field near the Officer's Club at Fort Niagara State Park. This event in commemoration of Memorial Day Weekend was a joint effort between the American Huey 369 Museum and Youngstown VFW Post #313. This event was also part of Old Fort Niagara's "Soldiers through the Ages" Program held over Memorial Day Weekend.

According to event Co-Chairman Ed Jackson (who served with the U.S. Army First Infantry Division in Vietnam 1968-1969), "To the Soldier the Huey was the life artery to the ground troops in the field. They would bring the needed supplies, ammunition, water and the occasional letter from home to these troops. To the soldier in the field just the sound of the rotors and the constant 'whoop', was a pleasure to their ears, for good things were going to happen when these 'choppers' arrived."

Ray O'Keefe, Co-Chairman, Vietnam Veteran, and former Executive Director of the Niagara Aerospace Museum, also played a vital part in this event and echoed Ed's comments by saying "These particular helicopters represented the sound of hope."

Over the weekend, the Public and Veterans had the opportunity to view, take a ride, and become members of this GREAT Huey 369 Organization. Membership cost \$100.00 and gave you the opportunity to ride in one of these Huey Helicopters, just like the troops in Vietnam did during the war. The ride was open, with a flight crew that escorted you to the helicopter, buckled you in for safety, and talked to you about the experience aboard the Huey. The Huey took 6 passengers at a time and was stationed in the soccer fields near the Officers Club in Fort Niagara State Park. After the ride many pictures were taken and for those who did not wish to ride, they still got a close up look at the Huey and were able to take pictures on the soccer field.

On site, Post members, wives, and friends had a Tim Horton's Coffee and Timbits refreshment stand, along with other goodies for the public to enjoy as they were waiting for a ride or just being a spectator at the event.

The Huey 369 History Museum also had a very informative display where they explained the mission of the museum, while also accepting donations for the museum and answering questions on the Huey. It is with saying "The true price of this history preserved is not the cost of a brick and mortar building, but the number of lives that were exchanged for it!"
