RAGBRAI Updates

The Register's Annual Great Bike Ride Across Iowa is coming to the Amana Colonies next week Friday, July 28.

Remember, the four way stop at 220th Trail (Main Street Amana) and Highway 151 will be closed on Friday, July 28 from 10:30 a.m. until the majority of riders have passed through the area. H Street (the street in Amana south of the Ronneburg and Ox Yoke Inn) will be closed as well as bike traffic is routed through Amana.

Veterans of RAGBRAI want us to remind all residents that many RAGBRAI participants do not follow the mapped route, therefore Highway 6 and Highway 220 will most likely be crowded with bikes as will the route which goes down F15 Blvd, Highway 220 from West Amana to Amana and Highway 151 from Amana to Homestead. About 50,000 riders are expected The Register has announced.

"Oktoberfest in July" will be held at the Festhalle on July 28 beginning about 10 a.m. with live music, Oktoberfest-style foods and beverages. Barefoot Becky and the Ivanhoe Dutchmen will perform. The Amana Heritage Society volunteers will be serving brats, beef sticks, chips and pickles on a stick. Plus there will be something new for RAGBRAI - "Brats on a Stick." Bratwurst and other meats will be supplied by the Amana Meat Shop and Smokehouse. The Festhalle will be open till about 3 or so. Bike parking and porta-potties will be set up near the Festhalle.

Emergency medical assistance and rider assistance will be located near the Amana Family Practice Clinic where volunteers will have a free water stand.

The Amana Church in Amana will be open for folks to come inside, cool down and rest.

Millstream Brewing Co is hosting "Bikes, Beers, Bands and Brats" starting at 9:30 a.m. Two bands, Patrick the Gathering and Retro Rockits are slated to perform till 8 p.m. with food trucks in attendance.

Volunteers will be needed to pick up trash in Amana following the great event, please if you can, help is always very welcome. If you live in Amana and wish to place your trash can in a visible spot along the bike route that would be helpful.

Amana Volunteers Head to Pine Ridge

In August six volunteers from the Amana Church will be going to the Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota.

Working for six days with the independent nonprofit group, Re-Member, the Amana volunteers, all adults this trip, will be repairing and winterizing homes, building beds for those who need a bed and other projects. The Amana Church will be sending donations to Re-Member for lumber and building supplies.

Re-Member is a 501.c3 charity working on the Pine Ridge Reservation. It is funded by private donations and guided by leaders of the Oglala community.

Elder Kristie Yoder explained, "This will be our 8th trip as a church and I am often asked, 'Why Pine Ridge?' Or 'Why do we keep going back?' Discussing how great the need is and how positive the experience has been for volunteers, Yoder, who has volunteered there several times, explained more fully.

"These are both great questions and I will try to answer them to the best of my ability. Maybe I should begin with a little background on our Church's mission trips. Our very first trip was to a flooded area in

West Des Moines with Habitat for Humanity. It was a three- day trip and we took high school youth, who were allowed to take part in most aspects of construction. Habitat soon changed their policy and they required volunteers to be 18. After that trip we made a few trips to the Heifer Ranch in Arkansas where we were able to do short, three-day trips for our younger youth, and then week-long trips for those who were wanting to have a fuller experience. The program at Heifer changed over the years and did not provide our youth with a lot of hands-on experiences to serve"

"About this time, Katrina hit New Orleans and we made two trips there to help with restoration work. These were hands-on and positive experiences. .

. .After a couple of years of not going on trips, we contacted Habitat again, and they encouraged us to call Re-Member in South Dakota. The organization came highly recommended for youth and for having a strong emphasis on service"

our long- term relationship with Re-Member, and people from the Lakota tribe, began. The experiences gained from having volunteered are naturally different for all who have gone. As a youth group leader, it was rewarding to watch each of our youth develop and demonstrate a strong work ethic."

"We were often complimented on the work done by 'those Amana kids.' Confidence, willingness to volunteer for extra chores, and a genuine interest in the lives of those they were meeting has always been apparent in our kids. For us as adults, we each find something special about being at Pine Ridge.

.. For us to go as volunteers, to do honest work, and have genuine conversations with the people we meet is the key to Re-Member's success. To me, the most special part of this regular trip to the poorest county in North America is that many residents look forward to what we individually and collectively bring with us. Our work is seen as needed and appropriate, our ability to listen to their stories is appreciated, our efforts to support the work of Re-Member is welcomed."

Yoder added that meeting, getting to know and connecting with people at Pine Ridge has been very rewarding and has meant so much to her and other volunteers.

Re-Member is the longest-serving nonprofit on Pine Ridge and its focus is on serving the immediate needs of the Pine Ridge community. Those needs are great as Oglala County, contained entirely within the boundaries of Pine Ridge, has the lowest per capita income - \$8,768 - in the United States of America. The jobless rate hovers between 70 and 90 percent with very few opportunities for employment in the rural county where few roads and few utilities serve the area. About 18,000 people live on the Pine Ridge Reservation, according to the Re-Member website.
