

1828	Dutch pioneer Coenraad van Houten's hydraulic press (separating cocoa butter
	from cocoa solids) paves the way for modern chocolate making
1847	The British company J.S. Fry & Sons introduces the first true eating chocolate
1857	Milton S. Hershey born in Pennsylvania
1867	Swiss entrepreneur Daniel Peters creates the first milk chocolate bar
1883	Frank C. Mars born in Minnesota
1893	M.S. Hershey sees chocolate making machinery at the World's Columbian
	Exposition
1900	First Hershey Milk Chocolate Bar debuts
1907	Hershey Kisses introduced
1923	Frank C. Mars' company launches the Milky Way
1930	Mars introduces the Snickers bar
1934	Frank Mars dies
1941-45	During World War II, Hershey produces more than a billion ration bars
1941	Production of M&Ms begins, initially only available to US military
1945	M.S. Hershey dies
1964	Forrest Mars Sr. take over his father's company, merging it with his own
1970	Hershey launches its "Great American Chocolate Bar" advertising campaign
2022	Mars, Incorporated annual sales hits \$45 billion, including candy, pet food, and
	other products. Forbes ranks Mars as the 4th-largest privately held company in
	the U.S.
2023	The Hershey Company has annual revenue of \$11.16 billion. The company
	reports making about 373 million Hershey Milk Chocolate Bars annually
