Missing Man's Table – There will be a Missing Man's Table at the November meeting. The symbolism of



the Missing Man Table: The table is round, to show our everlasting devotion concern for our fallen and missing comrades. The cloth is white, symbolizing the purity of their motives when answering the call to serve.

The single red rose; displayed in a vase, reminds us of the life and the blood that was shed and their loved ones and friends who keep the faith and await answers. The red ribbon symbolizes our commitment,

and continued determination to account for our missing. A slice of lemon on the plate is to remind us of the bitter fate of those captured and missing in a foreign land. A pinch of salt symbolizes the tears endured by those missing and their families who still seek answers after decades of uncertainty. The glass is inverted to symbolize their inability to share this evening with us. The lighted candle reflects our hope for their return, alive or dead. The chair is empty and tilted - they are not here and will remain so until they return or are accounted for. The Bible represents the strength gained through faith to sustain us and those lost from our country, founded as one nation under God.

- November 5 Election Day.
- November 8, 1895 x-rays were discovered by a German physicist Wilhelm Conrad Rontgen. He received the first-ever Nobel Prize for physics in 1901.
- November 11 Veterans Day. In 1918 World War I ends when the Allied Forces and Germany signed an armistice stating the war would end on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month.
- November 19, 1863 President Abraham Lincoln delivered the Gettysburg Address. Despite being just two minutes long, the speech encapsulated the essential tenets of democracy.
- November 22, 1963, John F. Kennedy, the 25th President of the United States, was assassinated.
- November 28 Thanksgiving Day Many people believe that the first <u>Thanksgiving</u> took place in 1621. A group of English colonists and Wampanoag People came together to share a feast that lasted for three days. This marked the start of a long period of peace between the two groups that continued until around 1675. President Abraham Lincoln made Thanksgiving Day official on November 26, 1863. He declared a national day of Thanksgiving for the last Thursday of November each year
