


### THE PUBLICAN AND THE PHARISEE

The Gospel reading for the *Sunday of the Publican* and the *Pharisee* is taken from Luke 18:10-14. Two men went to the temple to pray -- a publican and a Pharisee. The Pharisee was a very religious man. He fasted, prayed, and gave away ten percent of his goods. Yet he boasted about his accomplishment, and as a result, God rejected his prayers. The publican, on the other hand, was truly evil -- a genuine sinner. He sought to make a change in his life, however, by confessing his sinfulness and begging God for mercy. As a result, he was justified and accepted by God.

Like the Pharisee, we too are filled with pride and boastfulness; unlike the publican, we often refuse to acknowledge our sinfulness, confess it, and beg for mercy.

On this Sunday we are invited to take a deeper look inward, to search the depths of our souls and to beg for mercy. We are called, through our vision of Jesus Christ, to acknowledge our sins and to fall before the face of God in repentance, making the publican's prayer our own: "God be merciful to me, a sinner!" ### **CHURCH BASICS**

# THE GREAT CANON OF ST. ANDREW OF CRETE

The Great Canon of St Andrew, Bishop of Crete, is the longest canon in all of our services, and is associated with Great Lent, since the only times it is appointed to be read in church are the first four nights of Great Lent (Clean Monday through Clean Thursday, at Great Compline, when it is serialized) and at Matins for Thursday of the fifth week of Great Lent, when it is read in its entirety (in this latter service, the entire life of St Mary of Egypt is also read).

The canon is a dialog between St. Andrew and his soul. The ongoing theme is an urgent exhortation to change one's life. St Andrew always mentions his own sinfulness placed in juxtaposition to God's mercy and uses literally hundreds of references to good and bad examples from the Old Testament and New Testament to "convince himself" to repent.

The Great Canon was written by a holy man to teach himself the right way to live. We cannot benefit from it unless we make it a priority to stand in prayer, in the church, and listen to it, with a great desire and expectation for God's grace to teach us and heal us. Our theology is first and foremost – experienced and prayed, and not only "studied." (St. Nicholas Orthodox Church, McKinney, TX)




