December 1, 2019 First Sunday of Advent Mt 24:37-44

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Time is up! Recently, our lunch bunch group played a game, where we sat in a circle handing a passing a package to the person beside us, until a bell rang. At the bell, we had to 'stop and hold'. Whoever was holding the package was stuck with it for a minute. The package was gift wrapped in multiple layers of paper, and game's name was 'Bloomers'. The game ended, when someone opened the final layer and they had to put the 'bloomers' on and have a picture taken with the prize! The whole game brought home to me the 'sudden death' sense of being caught by the bell! I don't want to give away anymore of the game's fun, so just watch out for such games! What does that have to do with the gospel? Well, I find that sense of 'surprise and catch' with a bell's ringing, is exactly what Jesus is talking about in today's gospel. The end times and our own final judgment do come for us one day. We don't know the day or hour of the Lord's coming. So, we need to prepare through our constant vigilance and watching or if this tires us too much, then we should simply assume every moment is our last.

Jesus says, "as in the days of Noah, so also it will be with the coming of the Son of Man' (Matt 24:37). If we know exactly the time in advance, that plays to our laziness and procrastination. Jesus emphasizes the surprise and revelation of the true last day. So, be ready all the time, for at any moment, it is all up! (Or we hope, our direction is up!-heaven up!) Jesus is pointing out that in the time of Noah people were going about their daily business, having breakfast, lunch and dinner, going to work and back home, marrying and raising families day after day, until one day it started raining and seemed to never stop. Who would have thought? Even a welcome rain can turn terminal! While we may pride ourselves on finding secret signs of an 'imminent end', more than likely we will be lulled by routine into not being aware or ready at the time. So, Jesus calls for 'constant vigilance'. I hear Him saying, "Assume every moment is your last". This is great wisdom. Completely aware of each moment, a person lives fully now, not obsessed with an 'end'. Seeking out clues as to the end so that I can further control or predict events & secure a gain for myself, only thwarts the more important fact of my living and thriving right now. Epicurus (a Greek philosopher around 300 BC) warned 'The fool, with all his other faults, has this also: he is always getting ready to live." Not living now, but always getting ready to live. How many times do we say to ourselves, "As soon as this happens, I am going to" or "After I retire, then"? But don't all of our conditions like these, only postpone full life now?

I heard a security consultant one time say, 'Always, keep an eye on the door!" I took him to mean, 'Watch who is coming and going!', but he also meant 'Don't rule out escape'. But more closely related to what Jesus teaches in today's reading about us not being caught surprised in the end, I think the professional guard also meant, "Your door-your exit is inevitable!-Accept it and Prepare!" As Jesus said "you too, must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come" (Matt 24:44) Whatever we are doing, beware that both the monotony of the task, and the distraction of novelty may steal our alert focus. Jesus' mention of domestic and routine tasks being performed even at the end time, makes me think that we are to stay engaged in our daily responsibilities, yet keep one eye open to the possibility of each effort being our last. He says two people will be working in the field (planting, cultivating, or harvesting) and two more working at the mill grinding grain, and in each circumstance one is taken and one is not. Instead of getting caught up in who by name specifically is going to be "left behind" or who is saved and who is not, notice that Jesus doesn't identify explicitly the people by name, class or race. He doesn't say "one Judean and one Samaritan will be working in the field", or 'one married and one divorced person will be grinding grain'. No, he only says, 'One taken, one left'. I think Jesus is saying, "Keep an eye 1) on your task and keep an eye 2) on your end." So, keep an 'alert awareness'. We can be lost in either a closed eye in sleep or a bored eye in distraction. So, how are we to finish? Even going out, we need to ask how we will serve our true end as disciples of Jesus?
