This does not include the mortgage payment of \$3,146.54. There are funds in the building fund account to cover the mortgage payment through December. So far we have received \$ 13,209.00 toward the \$15,000.00 pledge for the building fund account.

Per Capita amount for 2018 is \$44.00 for each confirmed member. The unpaid balance at the end of the year is paid out of the church general fund. Please mark on your check or envelope funds you are contributing to Per Capita.

God speaks to all of us about the importance of giving. Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35) He also said, "Freely you have received, freely give." (Matthew 10:8).
