## The Fish That Didn't Get Away

We have all heard stories about the extraordinary fish that got away. We might even have such a story of our own. Two of today's readings are fish stories, but with a slight twist. They are also "call narratives." Last week we reflected on the call to listen and to follow; this week it is a call to go out to bring God's mercy to others. This is a call to "catch" others, as one might catch fish—a metaphor that would have delighted fisher people.

In the beginning of the Jonah story, the prophet did not catch fish; one caught him. Later, the word he preached was very successful, his own spitefulness notwithstanding. The Ninevites were the sworn enemies of the Israelites, and Jonah did not want them to repent, but to be punished by God. Nevertheless, God's mercy was stronger than Jonah's spite. In the Gospel, Jesus calls his followers to set down their fishing nets and to launch into a life of catching people


with the word of God. There is an eagerness here that is absent in the Jonah story. Furthermore, the disciples left their primary commitment—their patriarchal family—to accept Jesus' invitation.

As Pope Francis declared, we are all missionary disciples. Are we eager to respond, as were Jesus' disciples? Or do we think we should attend only to those whom we judge to be deserving? If so, have we forgotten that no one deserves God's mercy? It is a free gift to all.

# Mark 1:15 quotes Jesus as saying, "Repent, and believe in the gospel." Since the Gospels hadn't been written yet, what was he referring to?

These days when we say the word *gospel*, we tend to be talking about one of the four written Gospels of the New Testament: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. But the word *gospel* wasn't originally tied to any particular


written form of communication. In fact, the Greek word we translate to gospel—*evangelion*—simply means "good news."

When Jesus says, "Repent and believe in the gospel," he is basically saying, "Repent and believe in the good news." For Jesus, the nature of that good news is clear: Jesus is announcing the coming of God's kingdom, the initiation of the fullness of God's reign on earth. Jesus preaches this good news in word and action and makes it real through his life, death, and resurrection.

After Jesus' resurrection and ascension, many of his followers

were inspired by the Holy Spirit to go into the world and continue Christ's gospel proclamation. The apostles and disciples did this by word of mouth at first, but within a few decades they decided to commit the message of Christ's good news to writing, giving us the Gospel books we know today.



The Bishop has asked that each Parish have Marriage Preparation Facilitators who will collaborate with the parish's priest or deacon responsible for preparing engaged couples according to the diocesan policy on marriage preparation. "It is highly recommended that married couples, especially those married for at least five years, be invited to be Marriage Preparation Facilitators, since their personal experience in marriage will be helpful as they walk with engaged couples in their marriage preparation journey. However, some individuals may be good Marriage Preparation Facilitators due to their education, experience, and/or gifts in working with couples."

All potential Marriage Preparation Facilitators should exhibit the following characteristics:

- Active Catholics and faithful to Catholic doctrine.
- Have good communication skills with their spouse (if married) and be open to sharing their marital experiences.
- Have effective interpersonal and social skills. The relationship formed with the engaged couple is a key element of the impact and success of the marriage preparation process.
- Be able to inspire trust and maintain confidentiality.
- Have knowledge, experience and/or gifts that will empower, help, or inspire engaged couples Be open to work with and collaborate with the priest(s) and/or deacon(s) of their parish.
- Open to time commitment necessary for training and working with couples. Feel called to serve through this ministry.
