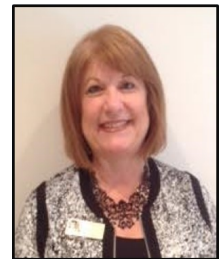

California could be deciding factor in GOP race

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Imagine Ted Cruz walking precincts in Haight-Ashbury, the hippie homeland in Nancy Pelosi's district. Or Donald Trump stumping in Compton, the West Coast capital of hip-hop.

In California, expect the unexpected.

A possibly decisive presidential primary June 7 is going to take Republican candidates where they haven't been before, since they need to collect as many delegates as possible toward the nomination. California awards 172 delegates, the most of any state.

Home to 1 in 8 Americans, California is usually an afterthought in presidential elections, with its June primary arriving long after nominations have been settled. But an erratic Republican contest this year, reordered by the Trump insurgency, has transformed the nation's most populous state from campaign also-ran into potential kingmaker. [Read More](#)

Syrian Refugee Update

In February, a temporary "surge" center was built in Jordan to speed up the vetting process for Syrian refugees. President Obama, and John Kerry had both stated in the last few months that this process takes at least two years, to carefully vet each applicant to make sure he or she poses no security risk.

"The resettlement process usually takes 18 to 24 months. Under the "surge" operation, it will be reduced to three months." said Gina Kassem, the regional refugee coordinator at the U.S. Embassy in Amman.

Three months for a vetting process that many experts in the government think is flawed at two years.

Cost for the refugees. First five years, \$64,370 per individual, \$257,481 per household.

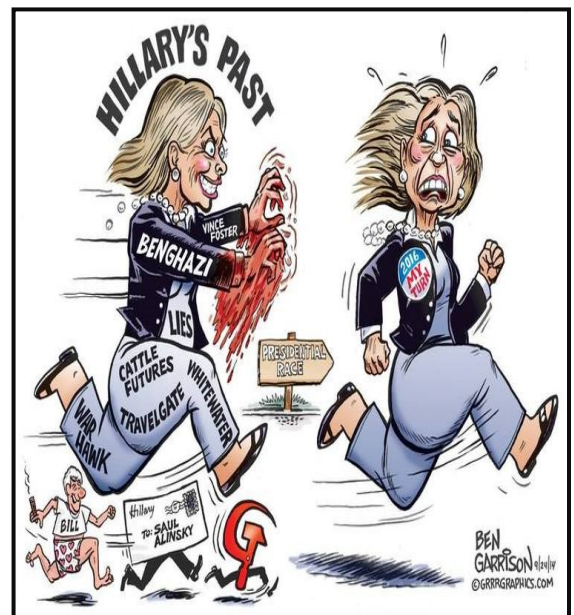

SAN DIEGO COUNTY SUPERVISORS SUPPORT NEW DUI LEGISLATION IN SAC

DUI's might get more expensive.

SB 1046, introduced last month, would elevate a pilot program to state standard. The program requires anyone convicted of a single DUI offense to install an ignition interlock device on each vehicle they own. The device is essentially a breathalyzer that prevents your car from starting if it detects alcohol on your breath. San Diego County's Board voted to support SB 1046 unanimously.

United Through Reading (UTR) is a San Diego-based non-profit organization that helps connect military families around the world through reading.

Even though we live in the age of Skype and Facetime, those who are deployed are rarely in the same time zone as their loved ones. What UTR does is allow those military parents to visit one of 200 locations worldwide and record themselves reading books aloud for their children to view on a DVD at home.

In 1989, the wife of a deployed Naval flight surgeon saw that when her husband returned, their little daughter didn't recognize her dad, and it took time to reestablish their bond. Seeing a need, that military spouse launched United Through Reading. The program creates emotional connections between parents and their children, encourages literacy, and makes homcomings easier.

Last year, the organization distributed more than 10,000 books this way to military children around the globe. To date, almost two million service member families have participated in this program.

One military spouse shared, "Our daughter watches her videos every day and loves them. She reads along with her daddy and dances to his singing. It has helped to keep him in her life constantly and greatly eases the transition of his coming home. Without this program, many children would not know their deployed parent upon their return."

UTR National Program Managers are working directly with nearly 200 Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, Coast Guard, and National Guard commands — and 60 select USO locations that are hosting the program.

Recently, UTR was honored with the Congressional Medal of Honor Foundation's "Community Service Hero Award." The honor was in recognition of the support UTR provides to U.S. military families.
