MEMBERSHIP

Membership levels are as follows:

> Active Membership

- (1) Any individual who has been engaged as a legal secretary, law office administrator, legal assistant, stenographer, typist or clerk in any law office or any person employed in the Court, the trust department of banks or trust companies, or in any public or private institution or office directly engaged in work of a legal nature, including, the public offices of the US Government, states, cities, counties or municipalities for a period of more than 1 year;
- (2) Any individual who has successfully completed a curriculum or full course of studies from an ABA approved or institutionally accredited school or a curriculum or full course of studies specifically prescribed for training as a legal professional from a non-ABA approved non-institutionally accredited school; or
- (3) Any individual who has successfully completed the voluntary certification examination given by NALA, who shall prove that certification or certification renewal by providing documentation of the same to the membership committee and is entitled to the use of the designation "CLA" or "CP"; or
- (4) Any individual who has successfully completed the voluntary certification examination given by the Professional Legal Secretary Association who shall prove that certification or certification renewal by providing documentation of the same to the membership committee and is entitled to the use of the designation "PLS"; or
- (5) Any individual who has been a member in good standing of any organized legal professional association for a period of one (1) year or more.

> Associate Membership

- (1) Any educator, judge, attorney or a university or college student in good standing who has interest in the legal profession.
- (2) Any individual who has been engaged as a legal secretary, law office administrator, legal assistant, stenographer, typist or clerk in any law office or any person employed in the Court, the trust department of banks or trust companies, or in any public or private institution or office directly engaged in work of a legal nature, including, the public offices of the US Government, states, cities, counties or municipalities for a period of less than 1 year; or
- (3) Any individual who is employed in some type of legal capacity and who is interested in supporting the profession but who may not otherwise qualify at present as an active member or may elect to join as an Associate rather than an Active member.

> Sustaining Membership

Will be granted to any individual, firm or organization who has rendered some special or distinguished service to this Association and who is not a member of this Association or who subscribes to the goals of this Association and shares the common interest of promoting the legal professional and in addition contributes annually to the Association an amount equal to or in excess of the current annual active membership dues.



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

THIS IS MY STORY

My passion for the law and my profession began in 1974 as a student at John Tyler High School. (*Yes, I graduated with Earl Campbell!*) At that time, there were not many college scholarships for girls. Linda Reeves Cabell, my government teacher and the daughter of a prestigious Tyler attorney, encouraged and provided me with the guidance necessary to become a paralegal. My dream came true!

When I began working in the legal profession, I often said the words, "I want to be Mary Morris, Smith County Clerk." Ms. Morris was the first elected female County Clerk and served Smith County for 20 years. She was a mentor, educator, and friend to me. Her professionalism and leadership were strong influences on me as well as other young women in the legal profession. Other role models at that time were Judge Ruth Blake and Judge Cynthia Kent. These women, along with many others, raised the bar and set the highest standards of professionalism in the work place. They were a strong force and encouraged women in the legal profession to continue their education and certification. I was certified as a Legal Assistant in 1985 and continued by legal education as a Legal Administrator. As such, I have strived to maintain those same standards of professionalism and service to clients and the people we serve in our community. I have been fortunate to have always worked as a Legal Administrator/Paralegal with and for the finest attorneys in Tyler. Now, I am very proud and honored to be the District Clerk – Elect for Smith County.

My passion for the law and my compassion for helping people defines who I am. My most treasured community service project will always be the Smith County Pro Bono Project. I was an initial member of the Steering Committee of the Smith County Pro Bono Project. This Project was organized by the Tyler Legal Secretaries (now Tyler Area Association of Legal Professionals) and the Smith County Bar Association to provide legal services to those in need by volunteer lawyers and staff. Other similar projects were implemented throughout the State using our organization as a model. Through my work with the Project, I received the State Bar of Texas Liberty Bell Award and the Smith County Bar Association Pro Bono ward and Tyler Legal Secretary of the Year.

My work with the Smith County Pro Bono Project led to my becoming a volunteer for the East Texas Crisis Center and an advocate for women of domestic violence, an organization supported by TAALP for many years. Serving TAALP as a charter member, past-president and in other capacities opened the door to many years of being able to serve the legal community.

I am thankful to God for my many blessings and my family. I grew up in Tyler and married my high school sweetheart, Paul. Our son, Skyler and his wife, Katie, have two wonderful boys, Braiden and Logan, who are the loves of our life. Riding my horses is my everything — it is medicine for my heart and soul!
