The first Sunday in November is All Saints Sunday, remembering the lives of all those who have died in Christ. The liturgical color assigned to All Saints Sunday is Gold or White, representing victory and purity, respectively.

Christ the King Sunday (Nov. 22 this year) is the last Sunday of the liturgical year. Again, Gold or White are the colors for the day, as we celebrate the kingship of Christ. Some traditions refer to the Sundays between All Saints and Christ the King as the season of End Times, because of the emphasis in our lectionary on Christ's second coming.

November 29 this year is the first Sunday of Advent, when we look forward to the coming of Christ both as a babe in Bethlehem, and as our triumphant Lord.

Blue is the liturgical color associated with the season of Advent. Blue symbolizes hope, and at the heart of this season is the hope and expectation of the coming of the Messiah, both as a baby in Bethlehem, and at the second coming as our triumphant king.

The season of Christmas lasts 12 days (just like the song says) from December 25-January 5, and is a celebration of the birth of Christ. Christmas coincides with the Winter Solstice, the shortest day of the year, and nature reflects the coming of the Light of the World as the days gradually become longer.

Transfiguration Sunday marks the culmination of the Time after Epiphany, and the liturgical colors of Gold or White are used to point to the revelation of Christ in his full glory.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, a day when we are reminded of our mortality, and when we remember Jesus’ temptation. Black or purple are the colors assigned for Ash Wednesday. Purple is used throughout Lent and has a dual meaning - it represents both Christ’s suffering and Christ’s majesty. The season of Lent lasts 40 days (not counting Sundays), just as Jesus was tested in the wilderness for 40 days. Sundays are passed over as a continuous reminder, even during Lent, of the Resurrection.

The season of Lent continues through Holy Week until the Vigil of Easter. Some traditions assign scarlet as the liturgical color for Holy Week (not to be confused with the red used on Pentecost and festival days) as a reminder of the precious blood of Christ. The altar is traditionally stripped on Maundy Thursday, and on Good Friday, there may be a black shroud draped over the cross. The Vigil of Easter traditionally lasts through the night, recounting stories of God’s salvation throughout the Hebrew Scriptures, until the break of dawn, when the resurrection is celebrated. Easter, much like Christmas, is a season, rather than just one day of celebration, and the season of Easter lasts 50 days.

Forty days after Easter, we celebrate the Ascension of Jesus, when Christ was taken up into heaven. Ten days later, on the 50th day after Easter, comes the festival of Pentecost, when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. This day is sometimes referred to as the “Birthday of the Church” as it was on that day when Peter and his companions were emboldened to preach publicly, and by the gift of the Holy Spirit, some 3000 people came to believe in Jesus. The first Sunday after Pentecost is Holy Trinity Sunday, when we reflect on the mystery that God is One, and yet God is Three.

The long season of the Sundays after Pentecost is sometimes also referred to as “Ordinary Time.” While this may seem to refer to the lack of festivals and holidays, it is actually regarding the way we count time. “Ordinary” comes from “ordinal numbers” (first, second, third, and so forth). These Sundays, whether the “Third Sunday after Pentecost” or the “Twenty-Third Sunday after Pentecost” help us to mark time in our walk of faith. During this season, the liturgical color is green, which reminds us of our continued growth in faith, which is the work of the Holy Spirit in us.
