The Thin Places Are Looking for You By Pastor Tim

So here it is the middle of summer and the middle of 2016. It's a time for summer time fun, picnics, swimming, and sunshine. It's what you expect you to do in the summer, because it's the season for those kinds of activities.

Yet in those moments fun, seasonal moments, don't forget who is always with you.

Always remember the One who created this good earth.

Always remember we walk with the One who has shared this good gift with us to enjoy and to steward its resources.

And sometimes, if you pay real close attention this summer, you'll be gifted the ability to discover a thin place.

A thin place (in the easiest of definitions) is a place where the connection between heaven and earth is 'thinner' than usual and there is a rich sense of the sacred. It's when you come upon a certain location and you sense the mystical Presence of God in an unusually close way. It's when you recognize that He is with you. Thin places are where you are mesmerized for that moment and realize God is. It's where you're overwhelmed with His love, goodness, and grace.

The ancient Irish (the Celts) apparently used to say something like "heaven and earth are only three feet apart, but in thin places the distance is even shorter."

The point of thin places is that they are not an end in themselves, however, but meant to refresh us for the rest of life's journey. Thin places are calls of renewal to remind us to walk in God's Spirit and feed on His Word and His grace-bearing gifts. Thin places call us to deeper acts of devotion, prayer, and maybe even fasting.

Psalm 19:1 speaks of the thin places on God's good earth. "*The heavens declare the glory of God, the sky proclaims His handiwork*." Yet the psalm doesn't stop there, the Presence, the thin place also calls us back to the Good Word that we can fully know the One who is revealing Himself – "*The teaching of the LORD is perfect, renewing life; the decrees of the LORD are enduring, making the simple wise*." (Ps. 19:7)

One of the amazing things about thin places however is that you don't discover them, they discover you. It might be a quiet place. Or, it could be a crowded market. Yet suddenly you remember you never can go far from His Presence and He's always there and He's always calling you to more. More of what, you ask? More of journeying in His Presence, growing in His Word, and feasting on His life-bearing gifts. Thin places calls us to remember we are not alone but created to be in grace-filled relationships of love, acceptance, and forgiveness. The key (if there is one) is to be expectant.

Jesus spoke often of having ears to hear or the eyes to see. If we walk each day negligent of Him, the thin places will elude us. But if no matter where we are this summer we awake and expect the Lord to bless us with all good things, mystical gifts await us.

May your eyes be on the lookout that His thin places may find you and that you be authentically refreshed.

So now, may the God of peace make you His own completely and set you apart from the rest. May your spirit, soul, and body be preserved, kept intact and wholly free from any sort of blame at the coming of our Lord Jesus the Anointed. For the God who calls you is faithful, and He can be trusted to make it so (1 Thess. 5:23-24)
