



It's easy to request your military service records from the National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) online, by mail, or by fax. Includes DD 214 separation documents, personnel records, replacement medals, and/or medical records. On the internet go to:

https://www.archives.gov/veterans/military-service-records and follow the instructions. Same day service may be available for emergency requests (for example, medical procedures or funerals).

While the NPRC works actively to respond to each request in a timely fashion, the Center receives approximately 4,000 - 5,000 requests per day. They are responding to requests for separation documents within 10 days about 92% of the time. However, requests that involve reconstruction efforts due to the 1973 fire, or older records which require extensive search efforts, may take 6 months or more to complete.






