BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

BOD Meeting September 2017 The Board of Directors meeting was held on Tuesday, September 19, 2017. There were 8 Board members present. We began the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

A member of the audience suggested that Medvil purchase steel-toed boots for the maintenance team. John Menczywor said he would look into this.

After a motion and a second, Greg McKay was appointed to a one-year term as Director-at-Large. He is replacing Steve Palmer, who resigned in June. The BOD is now back to 9 members.

The minutes from the August 2017 BOD meeting were approved.

Treasurer's report indicates that we are over budget on income and below budget on both expenses and water usage. Great news indeed.

The Maintenance Team has been busy with fall cleanup. The 2 summer employees are done. A new alarm/pump panel was installed at the septic station on Donald Drive. The flooring has been completed at the front entrance and in the library of PLC. It looks great. The backhoe should be back by Friday.

Membership – the BOD ratified 2 email votes for new members who purchased home on Williams Way and on Rachel Circle.

The 2018 Budget proposal was accepted as needed.

The BOD is preparing for our annual meeting, which will be held on Saturday, November 4.

Barbara gave kudos to all 119 Medvil volunteers. We had the Volunteer Recognition luncheon on Sunday, September 17. Attendees had pizza, salad, and desserts. Everyone who was there received a very nice freezer bag with the Medvil logo along with the words "Thank You to all volunteers". If you were unable to attend the luncheon and have not received a bag, please go to the Reception Office to pick one up.

Of her memory, Pauline Lussier was the 2nd Vice President of Medvil, the only one to be Acting President and for most of the term. She was also the only Board Member who died while in office. She also served as Chair of the Membership Committee and Annual Meeting Committee Chair.

Pauline was our Vice President when two board members tendered their resignations due to actions of the President. The President excused himself from the meeting and Pauline then presided over the meeting. We discussed the situation and voted the President out. Pauline acted as President until the end of his term and the election of a new president.

The former owners of our community attended the Annual Membership Meeting that she presided over as Acting President. Before calling the meeting to order, Pauline ordered them out with the reminder that they were not members and had no place in the meeting, repeating, "You too,

Beverly!" The Goffstown Police Officer on duty escorted them from the building and told them to leave the property.

She was born, raised and educated in Manchester. Her professional career was as a Registered Nurse. Pauline graduated from the Notre Dame School of Nursing in Manchester Class of 1963 and was an active member of the Alumnae. Her sense of humor displayed at the annual reunions was appreciated by everyone.

During her career as a Registered Nurse she held various positions in hospital nursing and distinguished leadership with the Visiting Nurses Association of Manchester.

"Pauline posed a kind and generous heart. Her main interest was helping others. She cherished the time spent with friends and relatives". It was her unsung job to keep tabs on who among our residents might present a need for a call to known family members or some intervention by Elderly and Adult Services. She concluded her thoughts with the phrase "bottom line" constantly!

Pauline Lussier – Vice President Board of Directors, Organizer of and Original Chair of Membership committee. Temporary Board President finishing out term of President's departure.

I remember Pauline fondly, not only as my friend, but as the glue and moral conscience of the board of directors during the early rough years of Medvil Cooperative. She worked tirelessly everywhere she was needed. I was extremely lucky to have served on the board with her. She was always forthright in dealing with whatever the issue at hand was and with moral clarity. She spoke her convictions without reservation.

Having to step forward as temporary board chair, she successfully held it together during a very rough patch of time in our early history. I viewed her as my co-president because she always had my back and I made sure to keep her in the loop with all that I dealt with as her opinion was most valuable.

The community owed her a great deal of gratitude for all that she was to the community and

all that she gave in time and talent. Truly one of the Medvil pioneers who made a huge contribution on our journey to being a highly sought after community to live in today. Hope she is smiling on us with approval as we strive to live up to the standards of her legacy.

HELPFUL HINTS

DON'T THROW IT AWAY, GIVE IT AWAY

What do you do with a television that still works but you have decided to upgrade to another model, or that blender that just wasn't the right size for you, so you bought a bigger one? So many things just get dumped in the trash because there is no time for a yard sale and you don't know anyone who can use it. Who wants to pay to dispose of a computer, TV, etc., at the Recycling Center?

There is a great website called **Freecycle** where you can list items to offer or items that you may want for free. The Freecycle network is nation-wide and you choose the site that is closest to the city you live in. For us in Goffstown, Manchester Freecycle is the closest. There are also Concord, Derry, and Salem Freecycle sites. There are rules on the site that should be read before using the site. One of the main rules is that "Everything posted must be FREE, LEGAL, AND APPROVED FOR ALL AGES. Another is that you cannot ask for an item before you offer an item. This item may be as small as a candle holder, or it may be a chair, fax machine, even a piano. Once you have offered an item, you are free to ask for as many things as you want.

A friend has had great success with the site. Both times, items offered were picked up in a reasonable amount of time and went to people that could really use them. Feel good and save the landfills from good, useable items. Cars, furniture, clothes, coupons, tickets, nothing is too small or too large to give or ask for.
