The MILWOMEN Region One Conference was held on Tuesday. 22 August. and by all accounts was a resounding success! Under the leadership of Region One Representative Barb Sebring and attended by President Patty Parks, the one-day conference at the Handlery Hotel was packed with networking, information sharing and camaraderie with a theme of "Aging Gracefully."

The conference got "underway" (literally!) Monday evening, 21 August, with an informal San Diego Bay Dinner Cruise aboard the Adventure Hornblower, where members and guests enjoyed a sit-down dinner and watching the San Diego skyline at sunset.

Tuesday began with an all-female color guard provided by the local Sweetwater High School Marine Corps JROTC Unit followed by the National Anthem sung by Linda Chupco, a Malaysian opera singer.

Thirty-one conference attendees included National Treasurer and San Diego Unit #36 (CA) President Monica O'Hara; San Fernando Valley Unit #86 (CA) President Carolyn Agabon; Members-at-large from Las Vegas, NV; and Salt River Military Women Unit #155 officers from Phoenix, AZ.

MILWOMEN attendees and quests were treated to advice and guidance on a wide range of topics such as cosmetics and aging skin care treatments; nutrition and healthy eating; combating elder abuse; Veteran's Administration policies pertaining to women, and information on wills, trusts and estate planning.

The Veteran's Museum and Memorial provided a static display of World War II, Korea and Vietnam-era women's military uniforms, and a hands-on interactive USO Pillow Project demonstration was provided by the Stars & Stripes unit coordinator, Barbara Ellis.

Additionally, a panel of six active duty female officers from various specialties

- aviation, surface, medical service, civil engineering, information warfare, and nuclear service - answered questions from attendees regarding lives of women serving in today's military. Each panelist wore a different style of current Navy uniform and most of the panelists joined us for a networking lunch around the pool.

The day drew to a close with a Memorial Service dedicated to members lost by Region I and culminated in the playing of

Midterm Meeting in Atlanta Ahead of Irma

While keeping a wary eye on the weather, your MWAN Board of Directors managed to complete their decision making and head for dry land before Irma reached Atlanta.

Tackling a full agenda, the BOD met on Saturday, 9 Sep 2017, by ratifying actions taken since the 2016 convention. Items approved included: Appointments of Region II Representative Ginger Daniels, Region IV Representative Ronnie Sujek, Region V Representative Terri Cook, Volunteer Hours Coordinator G. Kathy Dejarlais, Public Relations Chair Susan Lindsey and Scholarship Chair Terry Taylor; An honorary member for Unit 152; MWAN VAVS Representative Diane Culleton was authorized to accept a two-year appointment to the VAVS NAC; Unit name changes for Units 10, 74, 118 and 144; and FY2017 Budget adjustments were made to allow full compensation to Executive Secretary Barb Turner and to reimburse Diane Culleton for expenses associated with her NAC appointment.

The next mission was setting and approving the Fiscal Budget for 2018 (1Aug2017-31Jul2018) (See column at right). Bylaw submissions were then discussed with several being recommended to convention and a few being overturned. Below is a summary of some other actions taken:


- Pursue elimination of State Directors/Organizers positions
- Limit Honorary Memberships to 10% of unit membership
- Disestablish the Stained Glass Window Program
- Remove the silhouette faces from our approved logo.
- Establish a committee to review region size and division
- Revoke charters of three units currently in bylaw violation
- Recognize founding member Esther Govorchin
- Review and update the Procedures Manual biennially

The above list is not all-encompassing and some of these actions require bylaw amendments which you will see at the 2018 National Convention (4-7 Sep 2018) in San Diego.

Additionally, these decisions were reached only after a great deal of discussion and research. If you have questions about a specific item, please contact your Regional Representative (see chart on bottom of page 9). She is your Board of Directors representative.

Women's History Month, she spent many volunteer hours sharing her story with local commands.

Seeing it as "A way to make a life", and see the world, Jo-Anne joined the Navy just two years out of high school, at the suggestion of her cousin. She never thought she would stay for twenty years or achieve the rank that she did. Initially surprised at making Third Class Petty Officer, she would later become the only woman at her
