June 9, 2019 Solemnity of Pentecost Jn 16:12-15

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Happy Pentecost Sunday! We are reading the dramatic Pentecost story of the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Early Church in the first reading today from Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11. However, the gospel flashes back to Easter where Jesus was getting the apostles ready and primed for Pentecost when He first breathed a portion of the Spirit upon them right after rising from the dead. They needed that first shot back then, because they were fearfully huddled together behind locked doors that morning of the resurrection. Yet, now they receive a full booster portion of God's Spirit and it makes all the difference. They are no longer silent, no longer sheltered in a bunker, and no longer afraid. Now they pour into the streets boldly proclaiming God's saving presence in the world to unite all peoples once more into the *one family of God*. I think of Pentecost as 1)the going out, to 2)draw all people in, or the 'ingathering of all the scattered tribes' of the one People of God. But what about language barriers? God has it covered. The obstacle of different languages is overcome by the tongue of the Holy Spirit (language of the heart?). God speaks to each person in the secret of his/her heart and if it is God speaking, we hear and understand. Psalm 44:22 says "God knows the secrets of the heart". Jesus says, "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them." Do you remember how right after the resurrection the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, heard Jesus speaking straight to their hearts, when they replied later, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way..." (Luke 24:32). So the prayer language of the Holy Spirit of God speaks to every human heart in words, senses and images suited best to that person's understanding. Thanks be to God for such personal relationship from Jesus!

God's language of love draws us back together. But, How did everyone 'go all scattered' to begin with? The Book of Genesis gives the account of how human pride overextended itself in a building project, creating a city and the tallest tower in the world to reach the heavens. However this arrogant project collapsed and led to the dissolution of human unity into a multipli-city of languages and a spread of cultures. Why? Sinfully proud and selfish humans. Humanity tried to egotistically project itself over God. In Genesis 11:4 the people said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the sky, and so make a name for ourselves." How many times has 'selfishly making a name for ourselves' led to disaster? Every time! Isn't this why Jesus says, "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled" (Luke 14:11)? Humans trying to project their own power heavenward, they overshot and ended up being dispersed to the four winds, as Genesis 11:8 says, "So the LORD scattered them out from there over all the earth, and they stopped building the city." The human ego's instinct to selfishly seek only its own gain, ended the project with the scattering of everyone. Inevitably, everyone 'going his/her own way', and just speaking and standing up for oneself (what's in it for me?), led to the shattering of the human family's unity and peoples' scattering out to the four corners of the world.

But God intervenes and provides a solution to unify and bring in all of the scattered peoples. It is the name of God, as Jesus had commissioned us in Matthew 28:19 to go out to all, "baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Humans 'making a name for themselves' led to scattering. But, returning to God, and living under our God-given name (God's will and direction) brings us back together. One language again, the language of the Holy Spirit, draws us back to God. Serving God and God's design above all, is what both glorifies God properly, yet also fulfills our human nature. When we serve God, we are brought back together. Competing and fighting over our petty little human projects (exertions of our human pride) separates and disperses us. When we rise above our differences to see a greater glory, serving and filling our place in the 'universe-all plan of God' for creation, then human cooperation and unity return. The Old Testament prophets foresaw such a unifying 'ingathering' of people by the Living God. Micah 4:1 speaks of "the Mount of the Lord's house, raised above the hills that all people will stream to.." and Isaiah 2:2 says that 'in the days to come, the mountain of the Lord's House will be raised above the hills that *all nations* shall stream toward it." That this high point of reunion is Jesus, can be found in the prophecy of John 11:51-52 that Jesus was going to die not just for one tribe or place, but for everyone. It says Jesus will die, "not only for the nation, but also to gather into one all the dispersed children of God." Jesus Himself explains this in John 12:32 when he proclaims, "And when I am lifted up from the earth, *I will draw everyone to myself.*" Often the word Diaspora refers to this scattering or dispersion, as we see in the letter of James that is addressed "To the twelve tribes in the Diaspora" (James 1:1). But again, Jesus is the solution. His Name, His Will and His Way unites us again!
