Exhibits must be registered between 4 p.m. and 8 p.m. on Tuesday of Fair week with judging on Wednesday morning. All products shown must have been grown by exhibitors during the current year.

Amounts in displays must conform with amounts stated in catalog to be judged. Vegetables displayed should be uniform size, not the largest, except in "Largest" classes. Exhibitors should label exhibit as to variety.

The vegetable barn will be closed for viewing during exhibit entry and judging. Judge's decisions are final. All exhibits must be left in place until 9:00 p.m. Saturday.
