### Team USA – World Championships

#### WOW,

Great time in the Netherlands. Team USA came home with a Team Silver medal!! Tracy Bowman came home with individual Gold. I drove Tjibbe for 2 months; he is a 19-yr-old Friesan-cross gelding. Lori Weiss came for the whole trip and Lilla Hewitt came for 6 weeks. I did 2 big shows prior to the World Championships and 1 small schooling show of just dressage and cones. It was an adventure. I was based out of Koos de Ronde's barn; he is one of the top 4-in-hand drivers in the world. They are a very down to earth family that participates in all aspects of their stable. They have a big boarding barn and host various jumping and dressage shows also. Every morning we would arrive and drive Tjibbe; we would see Koos either on his carriage or his tractor. We had full use of an indoor arena and outdoor arena, 2 permanent hazards and cones. We drove around the neighborhood a lot! The countryside was absolutely gorgeous. We stayed at Roompot, a holiday park a few kilometers from the barn and a small town, Brielle, where we did all our grocery shopping. Brielle is a historic fort town; it has Bastillions and a moat all around it. Most afternoons, we would go off



and do tourist things. We went to the town of Delft and went to the museum, we walked around the Hague (the capital), visited Gouda for the cheese and a historic church, Lieden to see the rule of the thumb, Kinderdijk windmills, and down to Zeeland to stare at the water over a submerged town. Much of the Netherlands is below sea level. Where we were staying on the water, it was 2 meters below sea level.

We cooked most of our

meals to save on expenses. The first weekend after I got there, Lori and I took Tjibbe to a National Dutch show and I had British Team driver Mark Carruthers navigate for me while Lori rode for dressage and cones. I had only driven Tjibbe twice. After the

show, I knew I had to work really hard to learn how to drive this horse. I practiced dressage, cones, and obstacles for 2 weeks, and then off to BeekBergen, one of the largest FEI shows!!! over 300 horses, 100 entries!! Wow, it poured down rain. Dressage was a bit of a mess. In marathon, Tjibbe ran faster than I was ready for and I missed a few turns. And cones was a bit of slaughter also! But I learned a ton about the horse! 3 more weeks to prepare for the Worlds! I worked really hard and relied on my experience. Lori and Lilla were great helping me with everything. It is hard to travel when you are in a wheelchair and outside your normal routine. But we figured things out! The day before we left for the worlds, I got to drive one of Koos's teams around the neighborhood. It was a lot of fun. We used a tractor to get me in the carriage!

The barn was a very busy place, with many International drivers in and out on their way to shows. It was great to meet many new people, Marie hosted a few dinners with all the drivers, and we did a taco night once also!!!

The World's was great, located in Exloo Netherlands, about 3 hours from Koos de Ronde's. We got all setup with truck, trailer and tent, table, chairs, refrigerator, and coffee pot! The USA contigient had a lot of support. Tracy



Bowman was there, Chrissy Aitken (competing as an individual), and Bob Giles another team member. There was an FEI vet who checked over our horses every day. We had scheduled driving times as the practice places were limited. Wednesday, we had the jog; Lilla braided Tjibbe and he looked outstanding! Lori and Lilla kept him looking awesome. Dressage was the best test I had done with Tjibbe, no mistakes. I was thrilled with how it went. We had an extra day to walk obstacles as we did dressage on Thursday. Lilla and I walked them over and over and over. We had a great marathon, moving up in our placings and putting the

USA in Silver Medal position!! Cones day was a bit nerve wracking, as I had not had good cones goes at the

previous shows. And the Brits were only 7 points and change behind us. Tracy went clean which took the pressure off a bit, but Bob had 12 points, so I needed to have a good round. We went out on the course, and we were doing great, but got a little behind time, so I sped up a bit. We headed into 16, which was a zig-zag, and I hit 16 D. Uh-oh 3 pts... I went through 17, 18, made a sharp turn to 19, and saw the score board – I had hit 17... I was like, 'shit... that's 6 points' and I knew I was slow. Cone 20 was next which was a skinny oxer!!! I cantered through it clean and had 0.5 time penalties !! Total 6.5 pts. We managed to keep Team Silver!! Wow great show. I thank everyone for their support.








### Celebration of Life – Barbara Robinson

A celebration of life was held in Arroyo Grande on September 30, 2023, for Barbara Robinson who passed away July 5th in Tuscon, Arizona. Brass Oak members in attendance were Ann McClure, Jackie Pamplona, Barbara Meek, and Mary Ann McPherson. Barbara joined Brass Oak in the 1990s and actively showed her Arabian mare Arista Missy and her Andalusian gelding Asome Brio in driving classes held at Vulcan Mesa in Atascadero. Barbara also participated in the combined driving event held at Dragon Trail Ranch in Arroyo Grande. Barbara was also a member of the Santa Ynez carriage driving group and participated in their events, which mainly were group drives on beautiful ranches. Barbara also participated in their Carriage Classic show. Barbara held Horse talk classes that were very popular and one of the weekly sessions was on carriage driving. Barbara loved to drive her horses in Nipomo, especially when the roads were dirt and you could drive for hours. Barbara hosted a few group drives from her home. Ann and I were talking about the group drives at the service when she came up from Southern California with her pair of Morgans and said this is why she moved up to this area. As Barbara aged and could no longer ride, Liz Miller would come to her home and help her harness and hitch Santana for Barbara to drive. Barbara Meek lived on the property assisting Barbara and taking great care of her, which allowed Barb to remain in her home until it became apparent last year that it was time to move to Arizona. Barb was a very accomplished horse trainer and worked in many states training Arabians and Andalusians; Barbara was in on the ground floor working with the Andalusians when they were first imported into the USA in the 1960s. I have enclosed a few pictures of Barb, the collage of driving pictures were on the large photo board that was at the service.


