A suburban Chicago Muslim group hopes two giant billboards hanging over busy Chicago highways will help to fight terrorism while also combating Islamophobia.

The billboards — which read "Muslims to Muslims: See Something. Say Something. Save Innocent Lives" went up Sunday, one over Interstate 290, the other over I-55. They were paid for by members of the Association of Pakistani Americans of Bolingbrook, a community group that over the last two decades has brought an annual Pakistan Day celebration, two cricket fields and a Pakistani-flag hoisting ceremony to the southwest suburb. Two billboards with the same message had hung in other

"See something: That could mean profiling. That could mean somebody Middle Eastern wearing a long beard. And say something? Say to who?"

Kaiseruddin said he has been asked by officials at the Cook County Department of Homeland Security & Emergency Management to promote the slogan. But he refused, arguing that it is overly simplistic and creates a sense of hypervigilance that could lead to the reporting of innocent people — such as the 14-year-old Texas boy who was arrested in 2015 when his teacher suspected the clock he built may have been a bomb.

as Muslims admitting they have a role in radical acts of extremists involved in terrorist attacks across the U.S. and overseas.

Rashid said while he and other members of his organization know that they have no connection to radical groups, Muslims here and elsewhere are left to explain themselves every time an act of terrorism makes headlines.

There are about 400,000 Muslims living in the Chicago area, Kaiseruddin said, adding that in the last five years eight young Muslims from the Chicago area have been arrested on charges of providing support to terrorist organizations. In only two of those cases, the defendants pleaded guilty. The rest of the cases are still pending, putting families in limbo and leaving the community shaken, he said.

"It may be a small group, a very tiny group of people who are affected by (the arrests), but the consequences are so great that the entire community is panicked," Kaiseruddin

At Chicago's Council on American Islamic Relations, Rehab spends his days defending civil rights, fighting bigotry and promoting tolerance by speaking at schools and other awareness programs. He said he can understand the sentiment behind the Bolingbrook group's billboards, but he favors a more direct approach.

"I'm in the business of countering Islamophobia. I know that work needs to be done," Rehab said. "I just don't think that cementing a misperception on a billboard is going to help."

Still, Rashid said since the billboards went up, he has received more positive than negative comments. He saw one of the billboards himself while commuting to his office in Chicago earlier this week.

"Misguided people are putting shame through the whole Muslim world, and that's very embarrassing," Rashid said. "This is good for everyone. This is good for this country."

"We are trying to tell average Americans this is who we are, and we do not condone (terrorism)," said Talat Rashid, founder of the group, who also is a member of Bolingbrook's Planning Commission and was the suburb's 2003 Citizen of the Year. "If we see anyone in our community that is off track, we will let the authorities know."

But some Chicago-area Muslim leaders question the approach, arguing that the billboards perpetuate hurtful misconceptions about Muslims.

"It's so vague," said Mohammed Kaiseruddin, chairman of the Council of Islamic Organizations of Greater Chicago.

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security uses the slogan, "If You See Something, Say Something," without a reference to Muslims.

Others say the slogan could lead to other problems for the Muslim community.

"I think it's kind of stating the obvious," said Ahmed Rehab, executive director of Chicago's Council on American Islamic Relations. "There's no data to suggest that Muslims who see something don't say something."

Rashid, of the Bolingbrook Pakistani association, said he and members of his organization knew that some people wouldn't like the billboards, and would view the message



ceramic art, carpet weaving, silver filigree, and many more will be other attractions of the event.



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


India Independence Day

History

In 1947, after the World War II, Britain could see that it no longer could hold



comes but rarely in history, when we step out from the old to the new...India discovers herself again." - Jawaharlal Nehru

After more than two hundred years of British rule, India finally won back its freedom on 15th August, 1947. All the patriotic hearts rejoiced at seeing India becoming a sovereign nation and the triumph of hundreds and thousands of martyred souls. It was a birth of a new nation and a new beginning. The only fact that marred the happiness of the fruits by the blood of martyrs was the fact that the country was divided into India and Pakistan and the violent communal riots took away a number of lives. It was on the eve of 15th of August, 1947 that India tricolor flag was unfurled by Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of India, on the ramparts the Red Fort, Delhi.

its power over India. It was becoming increasingly difficult and Indian freedom fighters were in no mood to give up. With the international support also coming to an end, Britain decided to relive India from their power but not before June 1948. However, the impending independence more so enhanced the violence between Hindus and Muslims in the provinces of Punjab and Bengal. The communal violence grew so large that it became impossible for new viceroy Lord Mountbatten to control it and as such, he advanced the date for the transfer of power, allowing less than six months for a mutually agreed plan for independence. Thus, India gained its independence on August 15, 1947 but not without paying a heavy price. Partition was done and a separate state for the Muslims was formed, with Muhammad Ali Jinnah being sworn in as Pakistan's first Governor General in

Karachi. On the midnight of August 15, 1947 India was sworn in as an independent country with Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru as the prime minister and viceroy then as Lord Mountbatten. The official ceremony took place in Delhi. Great leaders and freedom fighters like Mahatma Gandhi, Abul Kalam Azad Jinnah, B. R. Ambedkar and Master Tara Singh are few of the many to whom India owes its freedom.

Celebrations

The day is celebrated to commemorate the birth of the world's biggest democracy as a national holiday. All the schools and colleges across nation hoist the national flag on the rooftops and the buildings to symbolize the stature of the national flag as nation's pride. Not only the educational institutions but also offices and business areas celebrate this day. Since it is declared a national holiday by the government of India, all the institutions, government or otherwise, have holiday. People only go to offices to attend the flag hoisting ceremony. The Prime Minister addresses the Nation after the flag has been unfurled recounting the country's achievements of

the year, discussing current major issues and future plans for the progress of the country. Kite-flying has also become a tradition on this day and people can be seen flying numerous kites of all colors, sizes and shapes symbolizing the freedom.

Independence Day is celebrated throughout India and every corner of the country on 15th August every year. Independence

dences and monuments at dawn. Official buildings, including Parliament House, are decorated and colorfully lit. The prime minister and president address and congratulate the nation and talk about the day's significance. Streets and houses are decorated with candles, oil lamps and pennants.

Independence Day is an official holiday in Pakistan on August 14. All governmental, non-governmental offices, organizations, educational institutions, post offices, and major markets are closed.

The Indo-Pak subcontinent remained a British colony from 1849–1947. The subcontinent's inhabitants did not approve of the British rule in united India. An uprising that occurred in 1857 eventually formed the shape of a freedom movement, which exemplifies the efforts of the people of British India in gaining their independence.

Muslims ruled the subcontinent before the British incursion and suffered due to the 1857 uprising against the British East India Company. Leaders such as Sir Syed Ahmed Khan and Syed Ameer Ali worked diligently for the Muslim people's political advancement.


The Indian National Congress was formed in 1885, which later on became British India's largest political party. Major Muslim political leaders, including Muhammad Ali Jinnah, were members of the Indian National Congress and worked towards Hindu-Muslim unity and In-

dia's independence.

The All India Muslim League was founded on December 30, 1906. There was growing demand for an independent Muslim state in India. In 1930 Muhammad Iqbal presented the idea of a separate Muslim state that would geographically consist of the Muslim majority areas in the subcontinent. The word Pakistan is a conjunction of two words Pak meaning Pure and Stan meaning Land, a name coined by Choudhary Rahmat Ali.

Strong Hindu nationalism gave birth to the Two Nation Theory, an ideology that is accredited as being the basis for Pakistan's creation. In 1940 the Pakistan Resolution was passed in Lahore demanding greater Muslim autonomy in British India.

After World War II, it was expected that the British colonies would soon disintegrate. The Pakistan Movement, spearheaded by Muhammad Ali Jinnah, resulted in creating a Muslim state. Pakistan gained independence from the British rule on August 14, 1947. At its birth, Pakistan had two parts commonly referred to as East and West Pakistan. In 1971 East Pakistan parted from West Pakistan and became Bangladoch

People all over Pakistan celebrate Independence Day with patriotic zest. Many people who attend the Independence Day parades dress up in green and white, which are the Pakistani flag's colors. People visit national monuments and places of national significance to celebrate Independence Day. This is also a time to meet relatives, exchange gifts and visit recreational spots.

Pakistan's national flag is hoisted on public, private buildings, resiFirework shows are put together on the eve of Independence Day.

Pakistan's Independence Day also pays homage to people who devoted their lives for Pakistan's freedom movement and made sacrifices to attain Pakistan's independence. A change of guard takes place at national monuments, including the mausoleums of Muhammad Iqbal, who was a poet, philosopher, and politician, and Muhammad Ali Jinnah, who is considered by many as Pakistan's founder and Quaid-i-Azam (supreme leader).

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
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


The list is very long . I am humble and very proud to have worked with most of groups organizations and talented Artists.






















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



























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


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Abdul Sattar Edhi & Dr. Akhter Hameed Khan: Two Icons of Pakistan

Pakistan recently lost another icon, Abdul Sattar Edhi, who died in Karachi at the age of eighty-eight. Edhi's services for Pakistan shall be long remembered and he joins the ranks of other great South Asian icons, including the late social scientist Dr. Akhter Hameed Khan. This piece highlights the contributions of Mr. Edhi and Dr. Khan, who shared many similarities and were recognized around the world for their social service.

Like Mother Teresa, Edhi and Dr. Khan were both respected and legendary humanitarians who spent their lives helping the underprivileged. The two men shared much in common. Both were born in British India, Edhi in 1928 in Bantva (Gujarat) and Dr. Khan in 1914 in Agra (United Provinces, now Uttar Pradesh). Edhi arrived in Pakistan in 1947 and Dr. Khan in 1950. Motivated to help their fellow citizens, Edhi opened his first clinic in 1951. Meanwhile, in 1950, Dr. Khan established The Comilla Cooperative Karkhana in Comilla (a poverty stricken area in East Pakistan [now Bangladesh]). Later, in 1957, Edhi launched the Edhi Foundation (EF). Dr. Khan founded his Pakistan (Bangladesh) Academy for Rural Development in 1959 and later the Orangi Pilot Project (OPP).

EF and OPP often filled gaps in services that the state had either ignored or failed

to provide for the people. For example, EF currently runs a wide range of services and facilities, including ambulances, morgues, graveyards, hospitals, educational services, marriage bureaus, orphanages, centers for the abandoned, bread plants and more. Meanwhile, Dr. Khan's OPP focused on healthcare, sanitation, housing, microfinance, education, research and training, rural development, etc. Millions benefit from Edhi and Dr. Khan's services and their respective organizations have received world recognition for their contributions.

Along with their professional similarities, both men had a lot in common personally as well. They were known as honest and humble individuals who provided a beacon of hope for Pakistan. They led a simple lifestyle, despite having resources and contacts at high-levels. Both were non-sectarian and non-communal and believed in serving all members of their communities across faiths.

Despite their noble missions and nature, the two men faced adversity and threats at times. Edhi received threats from the Taliban, who declared him an infidel for his love for people of all faiths. Meanwhile, Dr. Khan was accused of blasphemy and court cases were filed to have him convicted (Pakistan's blasphemy laws carry a potential death sentence); posters ap-


peared denouncing Dr. Khan and some demanded that he be hanged.

In honor of their services, both Edhi and Dr. Khan have been nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize. And both received many prestigious awards, including the Ramon Magsaysay Award (considered to be the Nobel Prize of Asia) and the Nishan-e-Imtiaz (Edhi's award was recently announced), the highest civil award in Pakistan. Pakistan's Beach Avenue has been renamed after Abdul Sattar Edhi, while the Akhter Hameed Khan Resource Center and Akhtar Hameed Khan National Centre for Rural Development have been named after Dr. Khan. Separate books have also been published on both men by a well-known Pakistani publisher under its The Azeem Pakistani (Great Pakistanis) series; the series highlights the achievements of renowned Pakistanis in various fields in order to inspire people, particularly the younger generation.

These men served their country for decades and dedicated themselves to the cause of the nation. Dr. Khan died on October 09, 1999 and Edhi passed away on July 8th, 2016. Their deaths were widely mourned. Dr. Khan was buried in the compound of the Orangi Pilot Project and Edhi in the Edhi Village. These two individuals earned the respect of both the East and West for their services to the humanity. Their exemplary lives are a source of inspiration not only for Pakistanis, but the entire world. Their selfless services and commitment to the human spirit shall live on forever in the hearts of people.



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Legal Battle of the Babri Mosque and Hashim Ansari

After 6 December 1992 a key leader offered him two crore rupees and a petrol pump [in exchange for a compromise]. Hashim Ansari did not only turn down the offer with utter disdain and made that leader run away in shame.

On 1 February 1985 when a law court in Faizabad allowed the reopening of the Babri Mosque to let Hindus to worship there, the whole country plunged into public uproar. While there was a gloom on the faces of every Muslim to contrast with a general scene of celebration and rejoicing in the camps of the communalists. As Doordarshan showed the scenes of worship [inside the mosque], Muslims lost their patience.

All of this was done according to a well thought out plan and the whole of it had happened with the connivance of the politicians and the judiciary.

This scribe was the first Urdu journalist to, under a disguise, succeed in entering the Mosque after its unlocking as, according to a judicial order, the entry of Muslims had been forbidden within the radius of 500 meters around it.

I spent almost an hour inside the Mosque taking account of the situation and writing it down in detail what I had seen there.

This was the time when I had the privilege of seeing for the first time Hashim Ansari, the oldest litigant in Babri Mosque case. He was a man of rustic simplicity. I had to look around for his residence. His was a very ordinary lifestyle. Not many people knew him at that time. However, as the hearing of Babri Mosque case started his name started appearing in the news as the key petitioner.

During our long conversation he told me the story of injustices carried out against Babri Mosque. He had such a rare treasure of information about Babri Mosque that to hear all of it one night sitting with him was not enough.

He told the stories of trickery and deceptions of law enforcement agencies, sadhus and sants. He kept on speaking for a long time and I continued taking notes of it.

Hashim Ansari was a harmless man. He had profound love for Babri Mosque. The reason of it was that until the midnight of 22/23 December 1949 when idols were installed on the pulpit, he had regularly prayed there. Even on the night of 22 December 1949 he had for the last time offered Isha prayers there.

After his last Isha prayers there Hashim Ansari spent all his remaining life waiting to have the privilege to pray in Babri Mosque once again.

But the grand players of religion and politics continued to play their game and justice continued to be their casualty.

The mosque building is not there anymore. An illegal structure of the so called Ram Temple stands in its place. Efforts are underway to strengthen and make it a permanent structure. All the four pillars of democracy are providing protection to this illegal structure. No one is willing to give a thought to whether or not the 500 years old ancient building that stood there until 6 December 1992 had any constitutional and legal status as well nor does anyone want to acknowledge the equal rights guaranteed by the constitution to those with whom the building had been identified


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Hashim Ansari was born in Ayodhya and took his last breath there at the age of 95. Hashim Ansari lived a life of austerity. The case in which he was a petitioner changed the political horizon of Indian politics. If he had wished he could have bargained his conscience and lived a comfortable life. But during this time neither was there any transformation in his life nor his life changed.

I remember when Babri Mosque was unlocked and Babri Masjid Action Committee (BMAC) was formed he used to attend

During every protest demonstration and sit-ins I talked with him and reported his views and feelings the newspaper readers. Each of his talks and discussions on Babri Mosque reflected a pain and agony he had felt for the Mosque cannot be portrayed in words. He longed to see a solution to the problem in his lifetime but woe to destiny that it was not there to happen.

Hashim Ansari belonged to an extremely poor family. He used to work as a tailor to earn his living. Even today two of his sons work as tempo (taxi) drivers in Ayodhya.

In 1949 after the installation of idols in Babri Mosque Hashim Ansari was also the first of those people who the administration got arrested to maintain law and order in the area. He was accused of trying to make a call for prayers inside the Babri Mosque. He was again detained in 1975 after the imposition of Emergency and thus spent eight months in Bareilly Central Jail.

It was Hashim Ansari who had filed a suit in 1949 in an additional court in Faizabad for Babri Mosque and kept fighting silently despite his personal financial poverty. This was the time when people knew very little about Babri Mosque.

In 1961 when Sunni Central Waqf Board filed a suit in this very court Hashim Ansari's name was included among six others as the main petitioners.

Hashim Ansari also pleaded Babri Mosque case in Allahabad High Court as well. This case is under review in the Supreme Court as the parties have challenged the bizarre decision of the High Court in which Babri Mosque site was divided into three parts one of which was granted to NarmohiAkhara and the other two equal parts were handed over to Sunni Waqf Board and Ram Lala.

What is noteworthy here is that despite such a long nerve racking legal battle Hashim Ansari had no bitterness for his opponents. He used to go to the court with his opponent Paramhans Ramchandra Das in the same rickshaw together. When Paramhans Ramchandra died there were tears in Hashmi Ansari's eyes and at Hashim Ansari's death tears were noticed in the eyes of the leader of Rama Temple Gayan Das. He laid a wreath of flowers on Hashim Ansari's dead body and walked with the hearse along with his other Hindu neighbours, up to the graveyard.

It is said that for some time Hashim Ansari had been trying to find an amicable solution of the dispute outside the court. However this effort was fruitless as the second party was pressurising him to relinquish his claim. Ageing and ill health had also taken its toll on his mental capabilities.


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Mahant Gayan Das says that Hashim Ansari was against taking the dispute to the public. He used to come to see me in Hanuman Garhi. He did not like the politics of Hindu and Muslim politicians both.

In 1992 when the Karsevaks torched Hashim Ansari's house, it were his Hindu neighbours who put it down. Readers will be surprised to learn that once when Vishwa Hindu Parishad leader Ashok-Singha's car ran out of diesel and due to a strike petrol pumps were shut and he was left helpless, it was Hashim Ansari who sent some diesel from his house.

In Hashim Ansari's small room that was his bedroom and drawing room as well, there were only two Takhts (hard-bedsits). On one of the walls even today hangs a photograph of Babri Mosque and outside the house there is a signboard with a caption in English, 'Babri Mosque Reconstruction Committee'.

To compose this article, I dug into the labyrinths of my own collection of books and did recover a beautiful and well printed copy titled, "Hyderabad". As typical of Hyderabadis, I was just carrying the book on the back-seat of my car till one day to my surprise, while I was giving a ride to my seven-year old grandson sitting at the back was completely lost in the grandeur of the mosques, mandirs and mausoleums of Hyderabad. It was never possible to see this little monster called "Taamir" delve into a book with such intimacy. Watching him through my rear-view mirror and praying for his future-outlook, I was delighted that my American born grandson is engrossed, enveloped and enticed by the photographs of the city of my birth. When I told him that his Nana, Nani, Mom and an aunt were born in that city his interest piqued.....pointing to a pretty princess decked in gold, he asked me if that was his mother? I pray he visits Hyderabad one day draped in my stories, and enjoys the gullies and chabrootras where his Nana walked with a swagger, ran like a cheetah and lived like a lion. And I hope he will

You can walk with the haunting soors of Bade Ghulam Ali or hum the melodious tunes of Makhdoom.....ek chameli ke mandve tale.....do badan pyar ki aag mein jal gaye. The Sufi Saints are prominent with their graveyards and their legacies. With shamlaas and Warisi qawallis one is reminded of the era that dominated dil, darya and dargahs. Thepenniless- faqir at the chowrastha is all smiles with a shirtless back and a Panasonic cellphone whispering to the winds that he is rich at heart because he hails from a city that allegedly gifted (or was it grabbed) the Queen of England a Kohinoor diamond that adorns her crown. Many children owe their physical rehabilitation to the beautiful-Turkish-Niloufer who donated her "meher" for the construction of a hospital and departed from Hyderabad earning duas from innumerable young ones......amongst them my own youngest brother who eventually became a "Hafiz".

RIYADH: Having to wear ski jackets in Riyadh is unheard of, but a new snow park in the Saudi capital has made them a must despite outside temperatures exceeding 45 Celsius.

Saudi women wearing the compulsory traditional abaya that covers the body from head to toe are now donning thermal coats and cosy boots as they sit on sledges to scoot down the slopes of "Snow City".

Unusually in the ultra-conservative kingdom that applies strict segregation rules and where even restaurants have separate sections for "families" and single men, they are also joined by males.

The complex is a rarity in Saudi Arabia where there are only small-scale amusement parks for children, and where cinemas or theatres are not allowed.

Stretching over 5,000 square metres,

the entertainment project does not have proper ski pistes as such, but its modest indoor slopes still manage to provide frosty fun in a country that is mostly desert and searing heat.

Where's the sun? Surprisingly, women currently represent are subject to strict constraints, including a globally unique ban on driving.

One employee at Snow City said the centre's management initially faced the problem of not having enough boots for women as they had not expected females to represent more than 10 per cent of visi-

In fact, women have so far exceeded 75pc of the numbers flocking to frolic in Alpine temperatures.

"There is privacy and we're enjoying our time here," says one woman who identifies herself as Umm Ahmed, 37. "I like the place. It provides entertainment."

The temperature inside is a cool -3 degrees

A younger boy appears to feel the pinch of the freezing air even more, and suggests a novel way of countering it.

"It looks cloudy and feels very cold. Why don't they also put a sun in here?" asks four-year-old Salman.

The facility is not the first of its kind in the arid Gulf region.

The emirate of Dubai boasts an indoor ski resort that opened in 2005, featuring chairlift.

Entertainment options Saudi Arabia has long relied on religious tourism, attracting millions of the faithful for Haj and Umrah.

But with more than half of its population under the age of 25, the kingdom is also now pushing to provide more entertainment options for its residents, many of whom turn to neighbouring Bahrain or Dubai for leisure activities.


In April, the authorities launched an ambitious economic diversification plan to wean the kingdom off oil as the main revenue earner, with development of tourism and entertainment projects among other wide-ranging goals.

US company Six Flags Entertainment Corporation announced in June that it is holding talks with Saudi Arabia to build theme parks in the country.

On Snow City's Facebook page, many commentators have eagerly welcomed the new attraction.

"Turns out women are allowed in," one Facebook user noted.

And in a comment reflecting some of the attitudes currently prevalent in Saudi Arabia, a woman asks: "Is there a day for ladies only?"

Murdered Qandeel Baloch took care of family, including killer brother

Mohammad Azeem, the father of Qandeel Baloch, the Pakistani social media sensation who was strangled to death by her own brother, said on Monday he would pursue the case against his son Waseem.

"She was my son, not a daughter. I have lost my son. She supported all of us, including my son who killed her," he added. His sons were unhappy over "her achievements" and turned against her even though she supported them, he added.

Confessing to his crime, Pakistan's internet sensation and model Qandeel Baloch's brother who was arrested for drugging and strangling her said he is "not embarrassed" to have killed her as she brought disrepute to the family.

The 26-year-old Qandeel Baloch was killed at her home in central district of Multan. Her brother Muhammad Wasim had fled soon after the incident. He was arrested late on Saturday, Multan City police chief Azhar Akram said, and confessed to drugging then strangling her "for honour".

In an interview to Dawn.com the day before her death, Qandeel had said, "I married my sister off, I gave jahez (dowry) for her wedding, I tried to keep relations going with my family, I bought a house for them in Multan. My parents are settled in Multan, my house is there."

Baloch had also alleged that she had divorced her husband because he was abusive, and that a marriage had been forced upon her when she was 17 by her parents. She said that she has a child who she is not allowed to meet.

Responding to questions at a press conference arranged by police officials, brother Wasim said that "Yes of course, I strangled

"I am a drug addict but I was in my senses when I murdered her and I accept it with pride. Now everybody will remember me with honour that I have provided relief to

my parents and brothers who were suffering for the last two decades because of her," said Wasim recalling the 'disrepute' Qandeel brought to their family.

He further went on to say, "Girls are born only to stay at home and to bring honour to the

family by following family traditions but Qandeel had never done that."

"My friends used to send me videos and pictures on my mobile and everyone in the mobile market was sharing pictures and videos of her with me. Murdering her was better than committing suicide so I went with the former plan," added Wasim.

Qandeel was a media sensation, bold in her videos and considered quite controversial in the country. She shot to fame in Pakistan in 2014 after a video of her pout-

ing for the camera. She became famous through her tireless self-promotion and suggestive "selfies" posted on social media and had amassed tens of thousands of followers.

Qandeel had taken social media by storm with her statement promising to strip if Pakistan won the T20 cricket match against India in March.

Baloch's funeral was held early Sunday near her family home in southern Punjab.



Latino Muslims at country's only Spanish-speaking mosque: 'Islam changed my life'

Alfonso Flores looked relieved. Standing at the front of the prayer hall, the 29-year-old dental technician accepted hugs and handshakes from other members of the Centro Islámico, America's only mosque founded specifically to be a place for Spanish-language programming for Latinos. Flores had just taken the shahada, the Islamic profession of faith, at the mosque's first-ever Cinco de Mayo celebration on Saturday, where community members with roots in Colombia, Puerto Rico, Mexico, Cuba and other countries served halal variations of their traditional foods, while celebrating their shared identity as Muslims.

"We're like a family," said Ana Ortiz, a Puerto Rican Muslim originally from New Jersey, who was serving food at the festival's Puerto Rico tent.

Since it opened on 30 January 2016, 18 people like Flores have taken the shahada at the mosque in Houston. There are more than 55 million people of Hispanic origin in the United States, and more than 3 million Muslims. Estimates of the number of Latino Muslims in the US range from 30,000 to 300,000.

Latino Muslims have organized across the country for decades, but have had fe mosques specifically built around their communities. New York's Alianza Islámica opened a storefront mosque in mid-1990s, but it closed down by 2005. Houston's Centro Islámico is among the first to organize since then.

"We used to gather in different masjids," said Magidel Morris as she served halal tamales in the mosque's parking lot on Saturday. "But then we got together and decided we had to have a place for Hispanic people to get together and learn about Islam." With the Centro Islámico, America's Latino muslims now have a home of their own.

"[Latinos] want to learn about Islam," said Jalil Navarro, who donned a Mexican luchador mask while distributing Spanishlanguage Qur'ans in the masjid's parking lot. "but sometimes they step into a masjid and there is no people to serve them if they don't speak English."

Islam in Spanish, the organization that founded the mosque, was formed to fill that gap. Founded in 2001 by Colombian American convert Jaime Fletcher, the organization produces Spanish-language programming and Islamic educational materials that are distributed throughout the Americas. Today there are more than 1,000 Latino Muslims affiliated with the organization.

"They've been able to really define very significant and strong Latino and Muslim identities, and to merge the two together,"

said Ken Chitwood, a PhD student at the University of Florida who studies and writes about the growing Latino Muslim community. "And they are very intentional about that."

In his research, Chitwood has found that most Latino Muslims are converts from Christianity. Central and South

American countries are heavily rooted in the Roman Catholic church.

"Typically, there is some sort of spiritual wandering that occurs," Chitwood said. "There is some type of spiritual dissatisfaction with their present religious outlook, be that Catholic or Protestant or whatever. And then they go looking."

"We have it in our roots," said Navarro, who has been a Muslim for three years, one month, and 10 days as of 10 May 2016 - he's counting. "Islam changed my life."

The interior of Houston's Centro Islámico is decorated with motifs that echo the striped arches of La Mezquita de Córdoba, a 10th-century mosque still standing in southern Spain.

"They are doing the work of identity construction," Chitwood said. "They are imagining a common homeland for themselves, that is shared across Latino Muslims and is rooted in more traditional Islamic history.



When you say 'the Islamic world', nobody thinks of Puerto Rico or Cuba."

Fletcher said: "You can practice Islam and remain a Latino ... We want Latinos to be proud of where they come from, to have a strong sense of identity for themselves."

Flores had talked about Islam with Muslim co-workers, and had visited other mosques while learning more about the faith. But it was when he found the Centro Islámico - the community of Latino Muslims, specifically – that he was moved to profess his faith. Saturday's Cinco de Mayo celebration was only the second time he had visited the mosque.

"You can relate," Flores said. "A lot of Muslims grow up in their lifestyle, and we're different."

"We change our religion, but we don't change our culture," said Magidel Morris, whose hijab was striped with the colors of Mexico's flag: red, white and green. "We're still Mexican."

Pune: A 48-year-old businessman from Pune, who shot into the limelight after buying a 'gold shirt' worth over Rs one crore some years back, was allegedly bludgeoned to death in front of his son, police said today.

Datta Phuge, the businessman from the industrial township of Pimpri-Chinchwad in the district, had become the talk of the town after he presented himself a 'gold shirt' weighing about 3.5 kg and worth Rs 1.27 crore in 2012. At least 12 persons attacked Phuge at an open ground in Dighi area here at around 11.30 PM last night with stones and a sharp weapon, killing him on the spot.

"As per preliminary information, Phuge and his son were invited by one of the suspects, who know each other, to celebrate a birthday. However, we are investigating how Phuge reached the open ground where he was murdered," Dighi police station inspector Navnath Ghogare said.

Phuge's 22-year-old son, who too had reached the spot following a similar 'birthday' invitation and witnessed his father's murder, was spared by the attackers, police said.

Datta Phuge, the husband of a former corporator from Pimpri-Chinchwad Municipal Corporation, was into money lending and chit fund business.

Police suspect that some dispute over a money transaction could be the reason behind the gory murder.

"We have detained four persons and suspect that dispute over a money transaction between them could be the motive behind his murder," said Ghogare.

Recent state assembly election in Tamil Nadu has explicitly showed that the two main Dravidian parties one led by J. Jayalalithaa, and other by M. Karunanidhi have come to stay as the sole political expressions of Tamilians and there seems to be no way any other party, either regional or national- can replace them as the dominant or ruling party of the state

DMK is one of the two dominant political parties in Tamil Nadu. The other dominant political party is its offshoot, All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (AIAD-MK). As of this writing (2015), either DMK or AIADMK has ruled the state since 1967.

Not only national parties, except Congress which congested as a major coalition partner of DMK, even important regional parties which took birth in Tamil state also failed to impress the masses that preferred on the ruing AIAD-MK and opposition DMK to be their representatives in the assembly and parliament.

The assembly outcomes have explicitly put a fact on national notice that no other party can form a government in the state for years to come, unless they themselves decide the spoil the mileage they have won so far in polls. Further, the Dravidian parties have also proven that no national or regional party can form government at the centre without aligning with either of these two wings.

Nowhere in India have two parties continued to dominate the regional politics as both the AIADMK and DMK have been in TN. AIADMK supermo Jayalalithaa led her party to a historic second consecutive win almost single handedly.

CN Annadurai floated DMK a political party to fight assembly and parliamentary polls and won the polls and formed the first non-Congress government Madras State and which he later renamed it as Tamil Nadu. Popular actor M. G. Ramachandran the then treasurer of the DMK formed his splinter party Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam in 1972 after a personal feud with the DMK chief M. Karunanidhi. His AIADMK, as another Dravidian party, would take charge of the government after winning state elections in 1977. Since then either AIADMK or DMK formed the governments in Tamil Nadu.

Brief Dravidian history

Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) and its political rival All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (AIADMK) have been the major players of the Dravidian parties

Dravidian parties include an array of regional political parties in the state of Tamil Nadu, India which trace their origins and ideologies either directly or indirectly to the Dravidian movement of Periyar E. V. Ramasamy. The Dravidian parties have traditionally associated themselves with the Dravidian community and thus their primary goal was to achieve social equality and end the domination of North India on politics and economy of Tamil Nadu (a south Indian state).

Although most Dravidian parties are offshoots of Dravidar Kazhagam (DK),] there are a few other parties in Tamil Nadu that did not arise from DK directly. Nevertheless, both the former and the latter are considered as Dravidian parties because of the similarities of their ideals and goals.

Immediately after Indian independence, the Congress party was popular and thus was electorally very successful forming governments in most of the states including the Madras State.[8] But the popularity of the Congress government in Madras started to decline with its head Rajagopalachari proposing Hereditary Education Policy, which the opposition parties saw as an attempt to per-

petuate the social hierarchy of the caste system. Congress gained back some ground when K. Kamaraj who was seen as a "man of the soil" took over. But his resignation to assume presidency of the All-India Congress Committee was detrimental to the state Congress since Kamaraj was much respected by the people, and even by political opponents of Congress including Periyar E. V. Ramasamy. Resignation of Kamaraj itself was a cause of deeply declining popularity of Congress all over India and especially in Madras State. Kamaraj sensed that DMK was rapidly gaining popularity in the state and coupled with his fear of fall of Congress-governments in several other states of India as well as the center instigated many other Congress leaders to relinquish cabinet positions.

Complacency ruined Congress party, more than corruption, less production and weak supply networkings and price rises. New rulers made money as new ruler, though not the proportion of today's level. There were food shortage in several parts of the country and especially the state of Bihar was close to a famine. After Kamaraj's resignation, the next Chief Minister of Madras State, Bhakthavatchalam, wasn't able to inherit the charm of his predecessor. Persistent charges of ministerial corruption tarnished the image of the Congress. The food scarcity in the state was seen as an artificial scarcity, the mixed product of administrative bungling and private hoarding. The then scenario in Madras State, as observed by political analysts, was "frustration without coherence or direction, a revolutionary situation without revolutionists" At one point even India's first PM Jawaharlal Nehru would volunteer to resign as per Kamaraj Plan to strengthen the party, but soon to be advised not to, given the sensitivity of the issue. After Nehru's death the Indian National Congress had weakened nationally. More than half of the population by then were less than the age of 35 and represented the post-Gandhian era. Nevertheless, the reasons for the resentment found within the Indian mass were more to do to the everyday life rather than just the political turmoil.

DMK made use of the negative effects of anti-Hindi mood of Tamils, caste system, food shortage, corruption to build up the cadres. The differences between North and South India, both as in languages as well as in social structure were compounded in Tamil Nadu through the feeling that the nation was dominated by the North and that the South had been both neglected and exploited. The antipathy towards the north developed as the animosity against Sanskrit as well as Brahmin as a proponent of Sanskrit; Brahminism was seen as the instrument of this "tyranny". Ritually and socially superior to the non-Brahmin masses, a Brahmin commanded a dominant political and economic position in Tamil Nadu. With the rise of Dravidar Kazhagam and birth of DMK, along with the ascent of Kamaraj in the Congress, the Brahmin dominance was already on the process of being displaced in the Madras State. the politicians of the North looking at English as a foreign language that has usurped the rightful place of indigenous languages, whereas the South feared that English to be replaced by Hindi which is equally foreign

Anti-Hindi agitation

The major driving force of the Anti-Hindi agitation was the of future of Tamils in extra Hindi dominated North, seeking to impose Hindi on non0-Hindi states. An Official Language Commission appointed under the terms of the Constitution in 1955 to review the situation supported Hindi as the sole official language, although members from Bengal and Madras dissented in favour of English. Number of people with knowledge on English language was fairly evenly spread and also that imposition of Hindi would give a major advantage in terms of job and educational possibilities to those who have Hindi as their mother tongue. In effect a Tamil who would desire to

pursue into union civil service would have to learn three languages, Tamil, Hindi and English, which are members of three different language families and each written in a different script. Therefore, a three-language formula proposed was seen as a great educational burden imposed on non-Hindi-speaking states.

Unlike South and East, where people wanted to learn English as international language north outrightly opposed three language formula as they wanted only one language formula everywhere with Hindi dominating every domain of administration. Nehru promised to India that Hindu won't come in the way of other regions where it is not spoken. And in 1959he said that the interests of the non-Hindi speakers will be safeguarded and so did next PM Lal Bahadur Shastri later, but those promises didn't put the fears of non-Hindi speakers to rest.

In the early 1960s DMK became a champion of the anti-Hindi cause that became popular among masses, controlled corporations of all the major towns in the Madras State. As the time clocked down to 26



January 1965, the threshold for the end of use of English as official language, neither Nehru's promise nor the constitutional amendments of 1963 could calm the Tamil population, as it was obvious for them that moves to publicize Hindi as a language for Civil service examinations were underway by the central government. With the surging fears haunting the people of Madras, Congress party of the state would do nothing bigger than a small demonstration and insist the people that there was no ground for alarm. In contrast, DMK held an Anti-Hindi Conference in Tiruchirappalli on 17 January 1965. The conference was supported by all major opposition parties and funded by major wealthy industrialists - the industrialists who themselves feared of losing into influence of the North if Hindi be made the official language. The conference decided to hold the 26 January (the fifteen anniversary of India's republic day) as a Day of Mourning.

The Anti Hindi agitation and the popularity gained through it aided DMK to a great extent to win the 1967 general elections under a broad coalition of several likeminded parties, including Communist party and Muslim League.

Growth of DMK

It can be noted that the DMK was one of the two parties (the other being the Muslim League) to win all the seats it contested in the national elections, winning 25 of 25 (the Muslim League won 3 of 3) and emerged as the third major opposition party in the Indian Parliament. Kamaraj, who was the President of the Congress party then, himself lost to a little known "student leader" in his home constituency. The DMK had garnered more than 6 million votes in the state assembly winning 138 out of 173 seats it contested. The electoral victory in 1967 is also attributed to an electoral fusion among the non-Congress parties to avoid a split in the Opposition votes. Rajagopalachari, a former senior leader of the Congress party, had by then left the Congress and launched the right-wing Swatantra Party. He played a vital role in bringing about the electoral fusion among the opposition parties to align themselves against the Congress.

Annadurai, who by now was trying hard to erase his party's secessionist image, proclaimed that the official slogan of the agitation will be "Down with Hindi; Long live the Republic" – in Tamil – "Hindi Ozhiga; Kudiyarasu Vāzhga". With the tensions tightening in the South, some Northern states, such as Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh organized anti-English riots South

involving, violence and lawlessness against government properties. Thus as the North-South divide further deepened, the stage was set for conflict between the Congressled government and the opposition parties, but the scale and development of the conflict were expected by none

Dravidian parties rose to power and prominence in the political stage of Tamil Nadu, a state in India, in the 1960s. The rise in power and political support was gradual until Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK), a Dravidian party, formed the government in the state in 1967. Although after the 1970s the Dravidian parties met with many break-aways and have taken rival stances against each other, the seat of power in Tamil Nadu has been with one or other Dravidian party. The increase in popularity of the Dravidian parties in the 1960s is attributed to several factors including the fall of popularity of the Congress Government in the centre and the North-South disparity as claimed by the Dravidian politics. The series of events climaxed with an anti Hindi agitation which led to the downfall of popularity of the then Indian National Congress government in the state and eventual rise of Dravidian parties to power.

DMK championed the cause of independent Tamil Nadu (or, if possible, independent Dravida Nadu comprising the four southern states of India) starting from its inception in 1949. But this politics has changed over years as it defeated the Congress party and began ruling the state. Its parent party Dravidar Kazhagam (DK) from its inception



in 1944. The first call for Tamil Nadu independence seems to have been made by the Tamil Nation Liberation Association (Tamil Desa Viduthalai Sangam) in August 1938. The DMK Central Committee (Maththiya Seyarkuzu) voted to drop the independence demand on November 3,

1963, after the Indian Parliament passed the Sixteenth Amendment to the Indian Constitution; the amendment prohibited those who advocate separatism from running for public offices (such as Indian parliament and state legislative assembly). It would seem that the abandonment of the independence platform was not from the heart but a tactical move, at least on the part of Karunanidhi who was a senior DMK leader at that time.

Until now, for us, the people of Tamil Nadu, elections have only meant two political outfits and their respective symbols, the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (rising sun) and All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (two leaves). To be more precise, they have meant two parties and three personalities – say M Karunanidhi, MG Ramachandran and J Jayalalithaa. These three have trapped and controlled the political imagination of the people. For an electorate that led the way in social reform, we have lost almost all our social awareness and reduced politics to hero-worship and sycophancy.

The direct connection between cinema and Tamil Nadu's socio-politics continued right up to the 1980s. Even though it has moved away in the last few decades, in the psyche of the Tamilian this bond has not been broken. When a cinemagoer watches a film, he/she is unconsciously connecting the political and cultural, film personalities with the power of change.

Economic gains

DMK and AIADMK promoted the freebie culture in the state to woo the voters. Are people so naïve that they vote based on the gifts they receive from the establishment? This is, the system establishes a giver-taker power syndrome and the gift confirms benevolence as a virtue. On the other side of the scale, the receiver is thankful for the kindness shown by the rulers. The politicians distribute the gifts to voters as the frenzy surrounds the events.

One comprehends how political outfits cultivate an environment of competition among those who are benefi-

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ciaries, always keeping them in check and consciously positioning themselves as kings and queens. This is only an extension of the landowner-laborer syndrome in official terms.

The pre-election money distribution is unfortunately seen only as another gift. The AIADMK and the DMK are masters at this craft. But I am not going to straight-jacket citizens that easily. Existing within this bamboozled environment, voters also figure a way to exercise some pressure and pit one gift against another. Yet, they remain within the established condition.

Tamil Nadu has been a dictatorial democracy for far too long. Is Tamil Nadu safe under these Dravidian giants? Recent killing of a girl Swathi at a railway station in Chennai raises the question of safety for women, children and even others in the state. Whether it is the DMK or the AIADMK in power, in matters of freedom and citizens rights, they are not very different. Both cannot control corruption.

Many citizens are mortally afraid of taking them on, scared that "licensed gondaas will physically harm us. The cadres of both these parties abuse their strength with great regularity and no police force will come to common man's aid.

One gets the impression that mafias decide the course of the society in the state.

Will these elections change anything?

Poll message

The recent poll was an unusual as for the first time Tamil Nadu had multi-cornered fight with a new alliance emerging under Vaiko in the shape of the Front created by the Left, Vaiko's party, a couple of major Dalit formations, Vasan's TMC, and one led by a cine star Vijayakanth -banding together. This alliance was expected, technically, to spoil AIADMK's and DMK's calculations and significantly democratize political power in the state. But that did not happen as people preferred AIADMK and DMK to fill the assembly seats.

Tamil Nadu's hero-worship, especially the display of unabashed mother-worship that Jayalalithaa receives from her followers, has made the country look at the state with surprise. Analysts related Tamil Nadu's electoral behavior to caste-based politics, "freebie culture" and pre-election bribery that has become the norm in the state. They also implied that the Tamil people in general are gullible illiterates who have been taken for a ride by the Dravidian parties for a very long time. But the Tamil people gave a measured response in support of Dravidian leadership.

At the base of popular choices lies an essential cultural fact: linguistically and racially, Tamils, maybe South Indians, see themselves as different from the rest of the country. Tamil one of the oldest languages of India, is so different from most Indian languages that the people of Tamil Nadu do feel different, special – and isolated. Tamils don't look like most people of India and the texture of their habits, rituals and celebrations are entirely Tamil.

How much ever historians and anthropologists may argue the validity of the Aryan-Dravidian divide, under the skin and in the mind of every Tamilian the division exists and attitude of Norte toward South and Tamils make division marked.

It is this socio-cultural reality that brought to the fore the Dravidian movement, and this is one of the reasons the Dravidian parties have taken over politics in Tamil Nadu. In spite of the emergence of so many other Dravidian parties, DMK and AIADMK even today own the Tamil card. Tamils trust them. May be it is their political lineage that gives them this strangle hold! But that is a fact The AIADMK government needs to ensure that factions and divisive groups at police stations do not obstruct the dealings with cases and investigations in police stations, at all levels, thereby harming the very nature of police job. Dravidian parties. Vaiko originally a Dravidian leader floated his own party and made a electoral coalition with other 5parties to float front but none of candidates of the coalition won a seat to the assembly.

PMK, of Dr. Ramadoss lost its representatives in the new assembly as not even his son Anbumani could win his "safe" seat from his home constituency with his caste dominating politics.

The worst predicament was that of Hindutva forces with a big agenda to saffronize the nation and crate tensions across the nation. Worst sufferer in the poll is the Hindutva BJP which for years carved out a strong vote bank in the state by very cleverly using unconstitutional hatred for Muslims as the key campaign strategy. Later as the party was gaining acceptance in some towns, it bargained seats with DMK or AIADMK for seat agreements and it had and own seats in the Assembly and parliament. However, this time around BJP could not maneuver either with DMK or AIADMK-both outrightly rejected the BJP for electoral alliance. BJP always claimed it made the DMK and AIADMK win elections and without it both will fail miserably. BJP was defeated as it could not win even one seat in the assembly- the first time in years.

Now BJP has a parliamentary seat from Nagercoil (Kanyakumari) which it had won through an electoral alliance with the AIADMK and the MP is now a central minister in Modi cabinet. The problem is the party has lost all 6 assembly segments in the assembly polls and it is likely to lose the parliamentary seat as well when the national poll takes place. The party is now facing an existential threat in the state and so the Modi led BJP government wants to save the Nagercoil seat and has announced a sea port to be built in Colachal and concerned minister is to enthusiastic about the port project in some way. But Kerala government has objected to it as its own sea port in Vizhinjam near capital Thiruvanathapuram, about 40 KM from Colachal has already been sanctioned by the previous Congress-UPA government led by Manamohan Singh the Colachal port can cause losses to Vizhinjam port. Now Kerala is ruled by Left parties while the port project was of the then Congress led UDF government.

In spite of the rampant corruption, the state has moved forward albeit slowly. While the DMK forged an alliance with Congress party, the ruling AIADMK did not try to make any alliance with any party (a couple minor parties she gave seats to contest) and won the assembly for the second consecutive time. Selvi Jaya proved that she was unnecessarily over confident about her party coming back to power. But she is right: people love her.

Tamils love the major Dravidian parties but more AIADMK than DMK.

Turkey's foreign policy reorientation!

Today, Turkey is facing three major problems and though it employs diplomatic skills to cater for the redressal of those problems, it has not been able to overcome the obstacles. The three issues the former Ottoman Empire is facing are: one, its EU membership efforts against which many European countries raise opposition, making Istanbul's entry into the European parliament as a legitimate European state difficult, though the present Brexit move gives hopes for its speedy entry; two, the Kurdish problem, fueled by outside sources which has given a constant headache for the ruling AKP and its leader Erdogan; and three, its effort to lead Islamic world that are spoiled by war in Syria. Turkey's chances of becoming a veto power depend on the successful handling by the government of these issues.

Turkey is doing a faster burn on the Kurds. Having waged a fierce war against Kurdish separatists in southern Turkey, the Turkish government has taken military action against the Kurds of Iraq and Syria to prevent Kurdish forces from connecting two enclaves — one in Iraq and one in Syria — that could form the geographic beginning of an independent Kurdistan.

The head of the Agriculturalists Association of Turkey (TZOB) earlier noted that his sector's losses had reached \$290 million over the year due to the political problems with Russia. "Russia's share in our fresh fruit and vegetable exports was 39 percent on an amount basis and 42 percent on a value basis. The sector's exports have been negatively affected since sanctions were imposed by Russia on Jan. 1. While Turkey made around \$368.2 million in revenue in exchange for around 530,000 tons of fresh fruit and vegetable exports to Russia in the first five months of 2015, this figure plunged to around \$78.2 million of revenue for some 113,000 tons of exports".

A downturn in relations occasioned by Turkey's downing of a Russian jet last November especially impacted economic and trade ties. When Turkey developed tension with Russia over the latter's violation of Turkey's air space, Israel moved swiftly to win over Russia and Netanyahu became a regular visit to President Putin's office in Moscow as part of their joint strategy in Syria and West Asia in general. Turkey felt the pinch which was unbearable. Hence Turkey decided to move



Turkey and Israel

Turkey and Israel had enjoyed a privileged relationship for more than 60 years. Before the flotilla raid, there was truly far-reaching military cooperation between Israel and Turkey that dated back to the 1960s and peaked in the 1990s. With the 1994 Defense Cooperation Agreement and 1996 Military Training Cooperation Agreement, military-security relations between the two became the most intimate in the Middle East. This cooperation was particularly prominent in intelligence sharing, military training and the defense industry. But relations between the two countries went into a deep freeze in 2010, when Israeli commandos attacked a Turkish ship in the Gaza Freedom Flotilla.

In the early 2000s, in return for Israel's technical and intelligence support to Turkey in combating the Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK), Turkey shared with Israel the intelligence on Iran it had collected in Iraq and Turkey. Israel's combat pilots participated in the annual Anatolian Eagle exercises held at an airfield in Turkey's central Anatolian province of Konya, where they conducted training over mountainous topography unavailable in Israel. They also conducted regular joint exercises in the eastern Mediterranean until 2010. In return, Turkish pilots received training on surface-to-air missiles in Israel. In the defense industry, the most recent joint projects were the modernization of M60 tanks at a cost of \$650 million and F-4E planes for about \$1 billion, procurement and operation of armed Heron UAVs for \$200 million, electronic reconnaissance and surveillance systems at \$200 million, and procurement of missiles and smart ammunition for \$150 million.

Although Turkey has successfully resolved to sort out its issues with Russia and Israel so that it could put at rest the challenges from both these powerfully dictatorial states controlling the wars in Mideast by coordinating their destabilizing operations along with USA.

When it found its assertive diplomacy is not yielding the desired fruits, Turkey has revised its strategy and renewed its ties with both Russia and Israel.

Turkey and Russia

A NATO member Turkey and an anti-NATO Russia do not have close ties and in fact ideally they cannot cooperate in international politics, either. In fact, Turkey joined the NATO very early when it felt the Soviet threat and the NATO used Istanbul in order to assert its 'traditional' control over Islamic world, including Arab world and Iran. USA and UK and other big powers skillfully divided Turkey, Saudi Arabia, Iran and Egypt to deny them a place on the important UNSC veto system and made them fight for just non-veto position on the UNSC for usual two years by rotation. In fact, these top Islamic nations bitterly opposed each other on the UNSC with veto, unlike Russia which fought for China, its communist ally then, on the veto regime. Bilateral trade was normal.

In the first four months of the year, Turkey's exports to Russia dropped to \$484.6 million, a 61.5 percent de-

cautiously and make over with both Russia and Israel, maybe on US advice. Thus Istanbul's effort to neutralize the badly tensed situation harming its interests has made it a favourite of both countries.

Relations between Russia and Turkey have taken a nosedive over the Syrian civil war, particularly after Turkey shot down a Russian plane. But even before that, Turkey's support of Sunni jihadist organizations was a thorn in the side of Russia, which still fears Sunni jihad inside southern Russia. Russia has goals in Syria and Israel also has requirements.

After roughly nine months of disagreement, Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan and Russian President Vladimir Putin agreed to revive their stalled bilateral relationship in their first direct contact on June 29, fueling hopes about restoring economic and trade ties. According to experts, recent moves to normalize ties between Turkey and Russia will benefit both sides' economy as well as the region's economy, particularly in the energy, tourism and trade sectors.

Russian Economic Development Minister Alexey Ulyukayev said the trade and investment relations between Turkey and Russia would be rebuilt, according to a TASS report on July 1. An expert from the Energy Markets and Policies Institute (EPPEN) said the improving relations would make the most positive contributions in the energy sector. Russia has heavily



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Action taken against crew of Jet flight when Sonu Nigam sang



New Delhi: Action has been initiated against the cockpit crew and six cabin crew of a private airline by taking them off flying duties pending investigation, after a singer was allowed to sing in the flight on January 4, Civil Aviation Minister Ashok Gajapathi Raju said today.

The cabin crew in-charge was suspended for 15 days and all the crew members issued warning letters, he said in Rajya Sabha while assuring members that no compromise will be allowed on passenger safety.

"It is not as if no action is being taken and, definitely, frivolous activities will not be encouraged," he said in reply to supplementaries during Question Hour.

"The public address system in aircraft is basically meant to reach out information of all kinds to the passengers. Safety and security will never be compromised and if there are aberrations, they will be attended to as per the rules and regulations," he said.

He said all airlines have their methods about how they govern such things, but in case of a violation, the aviation regulator DGCA takes note and suspend the erring staff from their services for a particular period of time, which causes a pecuniary loss to the people who work in those airlines.

"These things do happen and they take action, but comprising the safety and security of the passengers will never be allowed," he said.

The incident occured when Sonu Nigam had an impromptu performance on a Jet Airways flight following requests by some passengers using the public address system. Later, the airline issued a statement saying it had suspended all cabin crew of the Jodhpur-Mumbai flight and was enforcing corrective measures and taking disciplinary action.

To another supplementary on public facing harrassment in the absence of use of public address system at some airports, Raju said "in congested airports, there is a problem as they have to be silent airports. Otherwise, it will become a cacophony, and the world over, such practices are there in congested airports. So we are following the same system.

Bollywood actor Rajpal Yadav to go to jail - Find out why!



New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Friday rejected Bollywood actor Rajpal Yadav's petition and directed him to surrender for not paying money to a businessman despite giving repeated undertakings.

Yadav was sent to 10 day-judicial custody by the Delhi High Court for filing a false affidavit. The actor, who had earlier spent four days in judicial custody, will now have to serve the remaining six-day term.

The apex court had earlier this week pulled Yadav for not paying money to a businessman despite giving repeated undertakings before the court, saying his conduct in the case was "inexplicable".

While hearing an appeal filed by Yadav against the Delhi High Court's June 3 order which directed him to surrender before the Tihar Jail by July 15 to serve the remainder six days of the total 10-day imprisonment awarded to him in 2013 for filing a false affidavit in the court.

Yadav had spent four days in jail from December 3, 2013 till December 6, 2013 after which a division bench of the High Court had suspended the sentence on his appeal.

The single judge bench, which was hearing the recovery suit, had taken exception to the affidavit filed by Yadav in December, 2013, which was allegedly falsely prepared and contained forged signatures of his wife.

The court had ordered that Yadav be sent to jail for 10 days for contempt.

Delhi-based businessman M G Agarwal, the owner of Murli Projects, had filed a recovery suit against the actor and his wife for failing to repay a loan of Rs five crore which Yadav had taken in 2010 to make his directorial debut film Ata Pata Laapata in 2012.



True to their nature of being anti-heroes though, they nonetheless are rebels with a cause, all motivated by a sliver of goodness that still shines deep inside despite dark past histories. They are a motley crew, but when all else fails, it is only the Squad that can get the job - whatever it may be - done.

Only America Can Keep a China-India **War from Erupting**

India and China are on a collision course. They boast the world's two largest populations, two of the fastest growing economies on the globe and aspirations to lead the way into a new Asian century. The two nations' fates will be intertwined for decades to come. Troublingly, China's move last week to block Indian membership in the Nuclear Suppliers Group (NSG) is merely the latest sign of tension to emerge between the two Asian giants. Further competition and even confrontation await.

Competition between rising powers is hardly new or surprising. This particular case, however, shows China's intent to remain the sole Asian power stretching from Siberia to the Arabian Sea. This was most recently demonstrated last week when China led the push to exclude India from the NSG. Membership in the prestigious group, which controls the trade of nuclear material and related technologies, would facilitate India's nuclear power production. While legitimate concerns remain about India's status as a nuclear state, Prime Minister Modi's bid was backed by the United States, Britain, France and many others. These advocates could not overcome resistance spearheaded by the Chinese delegation, in a move that many Indians saw as purely political.

China's NSG position could been seen as warranted given India's failure to ratify the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, but Beijing routinely blocks Delhi's efforts to play a larger role on the international stage. India's push for a permanent seat on the UN Security Council and China's opposition to that move highlight this fact. Of the five current permanent members, only China has yet to offer even token support for the second-largest country in the world joining the exclusive

China and India have historically maintained relatively positive relations for such large, neighboring countries. The height of the Himalayas, and the long sea route between the two, have buffered most competition. Beijing's foreign policy concerns have chiefly resided east and southeast of the country, while India has contented itself in dealing with immediate neighbors and holding fast to the nonalignment policy of the Cold War. The border war of 1962 notwithstanding, relations between the two countries have been relatively sanguine.

An increasingly powerful and adventurous China and a more engaged India now appear to be clashing on multiple fronts. Border issues linger still, and reports of Chinese troops crossing the Line of Actual Control surface regularly in Indian and Western media. While conflict is unlikely to break out, China has been updating and reinforcing its forces stationed in Tibet, and the disagreement serves as a foundation for other worries.

China's steadfast support of Indian archrival Pakistan troubles leaders in Delhi. China is a major supplier of military equipment and expertise to India's northwestern neighbor. Furthermore, cooperation with Islamabad figures prominently in Xi Jinping's One Belt, One Road initiative, and the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor that will connect southwest China to the Pakistani port city of Gwadar is expected to pour tens of billions of dollars into Pakistan's economy and boost economic output by as much as 2.5 percent. Pakistani relations with China are the most severe cause of India's vexation with Chinese influence in the South Asia region; investment projects in Sri Lanka, Nepal and elsewhere have all drawn a watchful eye from India.

For China's part, leaders in Beijing have closely watched as Prime Minister Narendra Modi has fought political inertia to create a more open and engaged India. Of particular concern to China are burgeoning friendships and even partnerships with Western powers and their Asian friends. The mid-June Malabar naval exercise with India, Japan and the United States demonstrates this new approach. In April, the U.S. Department of Defense and Indian Ministry of Defence announced the planned completion of the Logistics Exchange Memorandum of Agreement,

which will allow for mutual logistical support and represents India's largest departure from nonalignment. These efforts, combined with India's engagement with ASEAN nations and Australia, further exacerbate Beijing's feelings of encirclement and could further ramp up Sino-Indian tensions.

What has thus far been mostly diplomatic jockeying could soon become a more dynamic and dangerous competition in the Indian Ocean. The Chinese People's Liberation Army Navy boasts increasingly capable systems and ambitious missions. Indian officials spot Chinese submarines near India's Andaman and Nicobar Islands, and further into the Indian Ocean, roughly four times per quarter. These will likely increase, and be joined by surface patrols, as China seeks to build its "Maritime Silk Route" that will allow it to exert influence and protect a supply chain running from Africa and the Middle East through the Indian Ocean, into the South China Sea and up to its eastern ports. In response, the MoD has stepped up investment in maritime awareness and antisubmarine capabilities, leaning heavily on U.S. expertise and support. In the coming years, Indian surveillance flights might be intercepted by Chinese fighters scrambled from a PLAN aircraft carrier not a reassuring development, based on U.S. experience.





Islam in the U.S. has a long, rich history, but fears of terrorism complicate the future. Here's everything you need to know:

How many Americans are Muslims? The Pew Research Center estimates that 3.3 million Muslims live in the U.S., which makes Islam the nation's third-largest faith, behind Christianity and Judaism. It's a diverse population primarily divided among African-Americans, South Asians, and Arabs, and a well-educated one: About 40 percent of U.S. Muslims hold college degrees, as opposed to 29 percent of Americans overall. Though Muslims represent 1 percent of the population, they account for 10 percent of the nation's physicians, and have included such distinguished figures as boxer Muhammad Ali, urban architect Fazlur Khan, and cardiothoracic surgeon and TV personality Mehmet Oz. But since the Sept. 11 attacks, American Muslims have been widely viewed with suspicion, which has intensified with the rise of ISIS and terrorist attacks in San Bernardino, Orlando, and Europe. American Muslims resent being blamed for the horrific acts of a few extremists. "Muslims are not the Other," says Purdue University professor Su'ad Abdul Khabeer. "We're Americans whose history begins with the history of the country."

When did Islam first come to America? The earliest known Muslim to appear on the continent was a Moroccan slave, Estevanico, who was shipwrecked with Spaniards off present-day Galveston, Texas, in 1528 and helped explore the American Southwest. As many as 30 percent of Africans enslaved in the U.S. were Muslim. In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, Muslim immigrants arrived from Turkey,

Syria, and Lebanon, largely settling in the Midwest; later waves came from Bosnia, Albania, and other parts of Europe. In the 1960s, the Muslim population began to swell as the government lifted immigration quotas and many African-Americans began converting to Islam. Muslim immigration surged at century's end — 45 percent of today's Muslim-Americans arrived after 1990; between 1994 and 2011 the number of U.S. mosques more than doubled, from 962 to 2,106.

How well have Muslims fit in? A 2011 Pew survey found them "highly assimilated into American society and largely content with their lives." More than 80 percent of U.S. Muslims expressed satisfaction with life in America, and 63 percent said they felt no conflict "between being a devout Muslim and living in a modern society." About 70 percent of Muslim immigrants go on to become U.S. citizens, compared with 50 percent of other groups, and almost 6,000 Muslims serve in the U.S. armed forces. Most of the tips about radicalized Muslims in the U.S. come from the Muslim community itself, the FBI says. On the whole, says Pew researcher Besheer Mohamed, Muslims have made "a pretty significant embrace of American culture."

Still, isn't radicalization a concern? Yes, especially in the internet age. ISIS and other terrorist groups have become skilled at using social media and videos to lure young men who are "kind of living on the edge," says Andy Arena, former director of the FBI's Detroit office. Particularly ripe for recruitment are children of immigrants, such as Boston Marathon bombers Tamerlan and Dzhokhar Tsarnaev; San

Bernardino killer Syed Rizwan Farook; and Orlando shooter Omar Mateen. These second-generation Americans are sometimes confused about their cultural identity — "anchored neither in the old or in the new," says former CIA Director Michael Hayden. They may find resolution of that conflict in intense religious devotion — which today can be drawn from extremist sources online.

How extensive is the problem? Law enforcement sources estimate that 250 Americans have tried to join ISIS. That's far fewer than the thousands who flocked to Syria and Iraq from European nations with large, poorly assimilated Muslim communities, which make for prime recruiting targets. One major difference is that American Muslims are relatively prosperous. But there is one poor community of Muslims in the U.S. the Minneapolis neighborhood dubbed "Little Mogadishu," home to the nation's largest Somali community. One-quarter of American ISIS recruits have come from this community. Terror recruiters tell potential members, "We have for you money, wife, and power," says Mohamed Mohamud, director of Minnesota's Somali American Parents Association. "A young kid who doesn't have enough mind to think, when he hears that, he goes."

Will Muslims be accepted? That remains to be seen. Due to high birth rates, the number of American Muslims is expected to grow to about 8 million by 2050 — eclipsing Jews as the second-largest religious group in the U.S. But this age of terrorism, and calls by Donald Trump and other politicians to ban Muslim immigrants or monitor Muslim communities,

have Muslims worried and in a defensive crouch. Many young Muslims say they encounter frequent anti-Muslim sentiment in schools and neighborhoods — and it's becoming more overt, not less. For 16-year-old Hebh Jamal of New York City, being called "a terrorist" has been a way of life. Sometimes, she adds, "you feel like the whole world is against you. It's exhausting."

A Muslim majority in Michigan The Detroit suburb of Hamtramck, Michigan, used to be 90 percent Polish-American and overwhelmingly Catholic. But most of the Poles moved out after the struggles of the U.S. auto industry, and immigration from Yemen, Bangladesh, and Bosnia has transformed the bluecollar town of 22,000 residents into the nation's first majority Muslim community. It's also the first to elect a majority Muslim council. The transition was sometimes tense — beginning in 2004, the town gave a local mosque permission to broadcast the 6 a.m. call to prayer from loudspeakers. Some residents — and anti-Muslim voices on the internet — accused the council of planning to usher in sharia law. But city councilor Saad Almasmari says he represents all Hamtramck residents in accordance with local laws and the Constitution: "It was a political election, not a religious one." His goal, he says, isn't to make the city more Muslim but to "bring more financial resources to the city." Polish-American Mayor Karen Majewski says that Hamtramck is a place where diverse people "live next to each other, but not in some idealized Kumbaya, Epcot Center kind of way. It sometimes gets contentious, but we deal with it."







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


