### Pastor's Corner

November ... the month we remind ourselves to give thanks for all our blessings. You know as well as I do that "Thanksgiving" shouldn't just be a day. Some complain that having a special day for it gives the impression it's not needed as much at other times. We know better. I might say that without the holiday of Thanksgiving, that would be one less reminder to cultivate gratitude – and in my opinion we need more, not less. What could you do, on days other than Thanksgiving, in months other than November, that would cultivate a deeper (and more abiding) sense of gratitude? *[Seriously, think about it]* 

In the meantime, let me tell you the story of a little boy who wanted his mother to pay him for all the services he was rendering in the home. [You can easily extend it as a parable for how we think of our "work for the church" or our "work for God" and subconsciously expect something in return]. The child left his mother a note that read: "For washing the dishes, you owe me one dollar. For cleaning my room, you owe me a dollar. For hanging up my

clothes, you owe me a dollar. For mowing the lawn, you owe me a dollar. Mama, as you can see, this is what you fairly owe me." He printed a bill for her, totaling \$4 and give it to her. The mother – probably a bit differently than my own would have done – put the \$4 on the table with a note of her own. The note said: "For carrying you nine months and being sick as a dog, no charge ... for staying up all night with you, night after night when you were scared or sick, no charge. For working overtime so that I could get you those special tennis shoes, no charge. For entertaining your friends when you wanted to bring 'em over without notice (making a mess they didn't clean up), no charge. Signed your mother who loves you. Total, *zero*."

After reading the note, that young man realized that he had lost sight of the goodness of his mother. *[How have we lost sight of the goodness of our heavenly Father?]* The boy had turned a love relationship into a business deal, motivated by selfishness and self-promotion. He had said to his mother what a lot of God's children say to Him: "What's in it for me? Pay up." Maybe that's why stewardship messages come in November, because they're all about remembering the One who owns everything ... remembering how we have been blessed, and given responsibility (not ownership) to care for what has been entrusted to us. This is the proper posture of a Christian's heart – gratitude for the grace we don't deserve, and a sense of responsibility for the good we've been given. Happy Thanksgiving to you (every day and all the time).

### From the Hearts & Hands of Session

- Sanctuary Projector Update we want to thank everyone for your continued patience as our Worship + A/V Team works on getting a new projector for the front screen (special thanks to Jennifer McKay for the extra work and time she has put in with Music N' Stuff). To sum up the situation, the best option was to get a laser projector but with our set-up it means that the projected image will not be a perfect fit on the screen (which is designed for an older 4:3 picture ratio that is now obsolete). Rather than getting a new screen as well, we are going with a projector that will fill up the majority of the screen, with a small amount of empty space at top and/or bottom. But we believe the picture will be sharper and clearer to make up for that. The current estimate is to have the projector installed the week of November 20th (hopefully before Thanksgiving) so we can start using it either Nov. 26th or Dec. 3rd<sup>t</sup>.

#### Devotional for You - Read Matthew 5:1-16 & 2 Corinthians 1:3-6

Deep in the heart of November, there was a woman struggling - her husband was fighting a fierce battle to ALS (Lou Gehrig's Disease). In years past, this woman would have been planning Thanksgiving dinner and baking pies and creating a holiday to remember for her family and friends. This year, however, she casts a wary eye toward the day: "I'm trying to be grateful. I really am," with guilt crouching behind her words. Her family and friends would affirm that she is a deeply, dearly grateful person; and yet, in the season of Thanksgiving, she felt that she wasn't thankful enough. Here's a theory: We tend to expect gratitude to act as a sort of emotional acid, absorbing all sorrow on contact. But let's be clear: Sorrow is not sin, and gratitude does not cancel out grief. Adoring one's children does not eradicate the deep pain of losing one's husband. We all need permission to experience both joy and sorrow. When we stop viewing grief and gratitude as mutually exclusive emotions, we are well on our way not simply to a healthier holiday, but a life with a God-given strength and peace. Jesus told us this very thing in one little sentence – in one of the *Beatitudes* at the start of the Sermon on the Mount: "Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted."

(Matt. 5:4). *Bless. Mourn. Comfort.* Three action words that seem at odds with one another but form a strategy for relying on and resting in our Refuge in the season of heartache. Some may retort: "Happy are those who mourn? Ridiculous. That's like saying, 'Healthy are those who are sick,' or 'Pregnant are those who are barren.' It makes no sense." Perhaps, at least until we add the third word: *comfort.* Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted. Comfort is a beautiful Greek word – *parakaleo.* It's formed from two words: kaleo, which means "to call by name," and para, which means "near." This word pulls us right up into the lap of God and invites us to experience the beauty of His presence in a way we may never have experienced before. The comfort of God is a bigger, more powerful thing than we give it credit for. It's in this uniquely "called by name" place that we are supernaturally strengthened, guided, and loved.

There may very well be times when we don't feel God in our pain. But these times of deep morning will be pierced and filled to the brim with the *parakaleo* of God. Comfort, love, guidance—it is all there in the middle of our sorrow, because our God shows up when we suffer. He speaks our name, and reminds us it's okay to be broken before Him. We have His Spirit within us – the One Jesus promised – the One called our "Comforter" – our *Paraclete*. By His Spirit, our Father has drawn near to us. By His Spirit, He calls us by name.

By His Spirit, he holds our life, heals our brokenness, and restores our hope. And for this, we can lift up our thanksgiving, now and always. Try something ... make two columns on a sheet of paper, labeling one grief and one gratitude. List all the things in each column, being brutally honest with how you're really feeling. Now write blessed, mourn, and comfort over the list, and ask Jesus to show you the ways He is working in every area of your life. Prayer: For strength, we thank You; it blesses us. For weakness, we thank You; it builds us. When all is bright, we thank You. In deepest dark, we trust You. And our souls sing 'It Is Well.' Now, to You, the One who is able to do immeasurably more than we could ask or imagine ... our endless, eternal thanks. Amen.

May God grant you comfort, peace and gratitude,






What a SpooKtacular time We Had At our annual Youth Group HalloWeen party!!
