



MADISON COUNTY AARP TAX SITE TO OPEN FEBRUARY 1, 2017

The Free Tax Assistance Program co-sponsored by the AARP and the Internal Revenue Service will open on Wednesday, February 1st. Located at the Emergency Management Agency, 271 Elm Street. (Rt. 38) adjacent to the Sheriff's office and Fairgrounds, the site will operate on Mondays and Wednesdays, 9 am to 4 pm.

Appointments may be made through the Madison County Senior Center <u>beginning Monday</u>, <u>January 9th</u> by calling (740)852-3001 or in person. For assistance with tax related questions stop by the site during hours of operation. Membership in AARP is not required to take advantage of this free service and there are no age restrictions.

Participants in the program are requested to comply with the following guidelines:

- 1. Please arrive 15 minutes prior to your appointment.
- 2. Have a social security card for everyone listed on the return.
- 3. Have a photo I.D. (Driver's license)
- 4. Bring a copy of your 2015 tax return. (important!)
- 5. Show proof of medical insurance.
- 6. Organize income statements (social security, 1099's, w-2s, etc.)
- 7. Summarize medical expenses for 2015 including insurance, co-pays and premiums, doctor, dentist, hospital bills, prescriptions, mileage traveled to obtain services, etc.
- 8. Itemize deductions such as charitable contributions, etc.

ALL RETURNS (FEDERAL, STATE AND SCHOOL) WILL BE E-FILED UNLESS OTHERWISE REQUIRED BY THE IRS.

SENIOR CENTER TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT NEWS

The Transportation Department has 2 part time drivers-Brenda Castle and Carolyn Wilson, and 1 substitute driver-Wayne Bricker.

Rides are available Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. We pick up and take home several of our Adult Day Center clients. We also transport seniors from all over Madison County to medical appointments, pharmacies, grocery stores, banks and other miscellaneous places. We do receive some funding from COAAA, Title III. These funds help us to provide for seniors who are unable to pay for the service. There is an application process and payment is based on income and current poverty level guidelines.

We transport seniors for Delightful Dining on the first Monday of the month, Mystery Lunch once a month and various other day trips.

The pool players and our chair volleyball players are taken to other senior centers to play other teams. The Charming Chimers and our Senior Choir are sometimes driven to various places in Madison County to perform.

This is all done on a first come, first served basis. We try very hard to accommodate as many seniors as possible.

For 2016, as of October, we have driven 3,134 trips.

In The Kitchen with Joanna

Happy New Year to everyone. Last year I did diet recipes, this year I will do soup recipes each month. Since we have Chinese New Year (The year of the Rooster) at the end of the month, I thought I would include a recipe for Wonton Soup.

Wonton Soup

The Wontons:

 $\frac{1}{2}$ pound of ready made wonton's wrapper (They are located in the refrigerated section of Produce Dept.) cut into 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch squares

3/4 lb. lean ground pork

4 teaspoons of soy sauce

3/4 teaspoon of finely chopped, peeled fresh ginger root

3/4 teaspoon salt

1(10oz) package frozen chopped spinach, defrosted and squeezed dry, chop again. (should be about 6 tablespoons after chopping)

The Soup:

6 cups of chicken stock, fresh or canned

1 cup of fresh spinach leaves, torn in small pieces.

Prepare ahead:

To make the filling: In a large bowl, combine the pork, soy sauce, ginger, and salt, using your hands to mix them thoroughly. Then mix in the finely chopped, squeezed dry spinach.

To assemble the Wontons:

Place 1 teaspoon of the filling just below the center of each wrapper. Fold one side over the filling and tuck its edge under the filling. Then, with a finger dipped in water, moisten the exposed sides of the wrapper and roll up the filled cylinder, leaving ½ inch of wrapper unrolled at the top.

Now take the two ends of the cylinder in the fingers of both hands and pull them down beneath the roll until the ends over lap slightly. Pinch the ends firmly together. As each wonton is finished, place it on a plate and cover with a dry towel.

To Cook:

In a 4 to 5 quart saucepan, bring 2 quarts of water to boil and drop in wontons. Return to boil; reduce heat to moderate and cook uncovered, for 5 minutes, or until tender but still a little resistant to the bite. Drain the wontons through a colander. Pour the stock into the pan and bring to a boil. Add fresh spinach and the wontons, and return again to a boil. Serve immediately.



COAAA Advisory Council Meetings Open to Public

Advisory Council meetings are scheduled from 10:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. All meetings except for December are held at the COAAA office, 174 East Long St., Columbus, Ohio.

The council is comprised of volunteers from eight Central Ohio counties who represent the views of older adults in their specific communities and advise the Area Agency in its operations.
