God In Time Of Trouble

...."When thou passeth through the waters, I will be with thee; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow thee: when thou walkest through the fire, thou shalt not be burned; neither shall the flame kindle upon thee." Isa. 43:2.

We understand that this passage of scripture was addressed primarily to God's ancient people Israel. Nevertheless, these words have been a source of comfort to numberless saints of all ages in the hour of sorrow. The course of the church on earth has become especially characterized by trouble one way and another. Often the choicest saints are caused to pass through the furnace of affliction. Abraham in his dream beheld a smoking furnace, type of Israel's suffering in Egypt, but with it also appeared a lamp-the lamp of God's delivererance. We know that under certain circumstances, the Lord permits distress to come into the lives of His people, but He has promised to be with us and watch over us, that no harm will leave us defiled. Even though we pass through the waters, they shall not entirely overwhelm us; or through the burning fires of trial and testing-with His presence, we may come forth, as did the three Hebrew children without the touch of fire upon our garments.

The Lord declares: "I am the Lord thy God, the Holy One of Israel, thy Saviour." Isa. 43:3. These Divine titles, when understood, convey a meaning that should be sufficient to sustain us in any hour or need, and to make us realize that He is infinitely greater than any opposing force that can come against us. Praise His most wonderful name. Many of the most comforting and intimate words of Scripture are those addressed to the saints of God in the hour of adversity. This is a day of trouble in many lives, and we need to listen and hear the Lord's word of comfort, "Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I

will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness." Isa. 41:10.

Trouble constitutes one of the many mysteries of life and often is the occasion for either doubt or rebellion on the part of professing Christians. It is by no means an indication that God does not love us. He allows trials to come, but through them we shall be refined: that we shall not become weakened through fear or unbelief on the one hand, nor hardened by our resistance on the other. It is far better for the soul to pass through sorrow with God's presence, than to be free from distress witout Him. Trouble may be permitted sometimes in order to correct faults in our lives, or to manifest the Christ life before an unbelieving world as a testimony of the power of His grace. Unless we recognize the Lord's presence with us at such times, and commit ourselves to Him. -there is ever the danger that the soul will be swallowed up with a flood, or burned hard as by fire.

"They that sow in tears shall reap in joy. He that goeth forth and weapeth, bearing precious seed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing bringing his sheaves with him." Psa. 126:5,6. Every Christian hopes to receive a reward when the harvest is gathered and the sheaves are brought to the Master. Too many people, however, are spiritual sluggards, willing to reap and receive, but unwilling to plow and sow. God help us that more and more we shall sow in tears. Help us to see that many of our sorrows are from His hand, as He seeks to bring us to Bethel, where we will put away our strange gods, and where our eyes may be turned from the things of the world and fixed on things eternal. Then-in time of trouble, we can rely on the promises of God and words of comfort found in the many passages of scripture as Psalm 138:7 and many others.

Sowing in tears on bended knee, When harvest comes at last, shall we,

Bring in our sheaves, at the setting sun,

Hear from the Master's voice, "Well done".

"If I could get a piece of her white soap, maybe it would wash my skin white and I could be good too," she thought.



CHRIST'S COMMAND

A great responsibility is placed upon ones life the minute he or she accepts the position of a Sunday School teacher or Youth Director. Christ said in Matthew 4:19, "And he saith unto them, Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men".

"FISHERS OF MEN"

All teachers MUST be followers of Christ in order to teach His Word. If we are following Christ—then—we are to be "Fishers of Men". Many teachers have taught a class for years and have not lead one pupil to Christ. Every unsaved person in the class should be won to Christ. The Gospel, if not accepted, hardens the heart.

Way of Salvation Should Be Taught

At the beginning of each new quarter, a good teacher will look over her material for the 3 months, outlining the aims to be stressed each Sunday. The way of Salvation should be made so plain that even a small child would know the way. Much time spent in prayer each week is necessary (1) asking God to give out His Word annointed by the Holy Spirit, (2) asking the Holy Spirit to convict, and (3) asking for the salvation of each unsaved member, (calling their names individually.)

Each one should understand that Salvation is a "gift of God given by grace" and that we can do nothing to earn it, (Eph. 2:8-10; Rom. 6:23) We are to teach how God gave His Son in payment for our sins and when we accept Christ in repenting of our sins, God will save us.

Teacher's Notebook

Holy Spirit Convicts

Our task as teachers is to convince people that they are sinners; then the Holy Spirit's work is to convict and reprove of sin. Show them through God's Word that everyone sins—perhaps not just by murdering or stealing but unbelief. Do not try to scare or work on emotions but plainly show them they are lost if they haven't accepted God's gift. Give the truth of God's love and expect the Holy Spirit to do His work.

Make Time for Decision

No sinner will be saved by merely believing that the gospel is true or that Jesus is the Son of God; he MUST ACCEPT or receive Christ. Some, especially children, may not be aware of this. Therefore, Satan does all he can to prevent a person from acting upon his belief and accepting Christ. In view of this as teachers we should stress the fact that they MUST ACT upon their belief of Christ and accept Him . . . NOW.

It is not enough to show people that they need to accept Christ, but we MUST bring their thoughts to action with "Now is the Time." Delay is dangerous and the teacher

is much more to blame than the student if there is delay. It is much more important to give your students a chance to accept the Lord at the close of your lesson than to return to the auditorium on time and perhaps a soul Be Lost ETERNALLY.

Know each pupil and when you see the Holy Spirit convicting of sin, be sure to give time for them to accept Christ then in class because if they wait, Satan may cause them to wait forever and they would be lost.

One of the best methods of helping those who are too timid to lead in class activities, is the plan of double leadership. Couple together the timid with the more agressive.

The agressive one will take the most difficult part of the leadship and after several easier experiences, the timid one may gradually be willing to assume more leadership responsibilities. If not, at least by this method, he is taking part.

"Blessed is that man that walked not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful". As we walk forth in Christ, are others helped or hindered? Are they saying, I call that a real experience in God, or would they feel more bondage than freedom by our interpertations of spirituality?

Have you ever taken into deep considerations the things we seek. In John 6:27 we have these words, "Labor not for the meat which perisheth, but for that meat which endureth unto everlasting life, which the Son of man shall give unto you: for him hath God the Father sealed".

I do not think that a lazy person is spiritual, in fact how could they

Titus 1:12 as slow bellies or idlers or lazy fellows. Never the less every Christian in his pursuit of a livihood must take care that he is honest, fair, and careful and takes times to be holy. The missing of regular scheduled services is not a good witness sign. So deep in the cares of life that the word is choked out. It is possible to be left with only the shell of worship while the real kernel of spiritual power has been forfited.

To tabulate spiritual blockades and pilferers is almost impossible, because what could up set and be set one, would not hinder another. Part of our flinching comes not from a close study of the Word, but rather a lack of it and as products of teaching, it is easy to drift into, "What I think is wrong" and there by be ensnared to a loss of fellowship with God and with one another. Be careful to put God first. The chute and the clutch are ever ready to entice and lead on that downward road. I cannot play religion, it must be real-real in worship, in my home, in business and in pleasure. Above all, keep this scripture in mind. Rom. 14:22-"Happy is he that condemneth not himself in that thing which he alloweth."

Why not make a close study of Rom. 8: 1-16. Think of its burning warning, calling message that demands of every man a close walk with God if he is to be and remain spiritual. No condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the spirit-The law of sin and death. —who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit. Carnally minded, what a sin, but to be spiritually minded is life and peace. All this and more He gives us, even so much that the Spirit of God dwells in us. That one who has this assurance is spiritual.

We know there are spiritual gifts. Led of His spirit. Paul said, "Be ye followers of me, even as I also am of Christ." I Cor. 11:1. And in I Cor. 12:1 we read, "Now concerning spiritual gifts, brethren, I would not have you ignorant. But covet be? These sort are mentioned in earnestly the best gifts: and yet

shew I unto you a more excellent way" I Cor 12:31. If you would be spiritual, don't forget I Cor. 13th chapter. It takes us a long ways on that road to be like Him.


