<u>Damp walls or floors</u>: Water removal or restoration is the property owner's responsibility.

Tree and Debris Removal

Fallen Tree On Your Home:

- Call 9-1-1 and stay out of your home until assessed by public safety to return.
- Call your insurance company

Fallen Tree on a Road or Other Land:

- Adjacent to Public Roads: Contact Virginia Department of Transportation at 1-800-FOR-ROAD (TTY 711).
- On County Parkland: Contact Fairfax County Park Authority at 703-324-8594 (TTY 703-324-3988).
- **Posing Hazard to Public Areas**: Contact Fairfax County Urban Forestry at 703-324-1770 (TTY 703-324-1877).
- On Private Property: Removal is the property owner's responsibility.

Fallen Tree Puts Downed Power Lines on Your Car:

- Call 9-1-1 and stay in the car until help arrives.
- However, **if staying in the car puts you in physical danger**, for instance the car is on fire, follow these steps:
 - o Open the door and **avoid touching the framework**.
 - o **Jump** out of the car as far as you can.
 - o Use **short shuffling footsteps** until you are clear of the area.

Wildlife

Wildlife in the Rain: Don't Touch

With the moderate to heavy rainfall some flooding in low-lying areas is natural and many wildlife species are adapted to respond, often by simply moving to higher ground. Wildlife may move into adjacent residential areas where they are not commonly seen; however, this should not be a cause for alarm if it occurs. Residents should avoid interactions and encounters (touching/moving) with wildlife and should not feed displaced animals. Minimizing interactions encourages animals to return to their natural habitats once conditions improve.

<u>Injured or killed deer:</u> immediately report the collision to the police department non-emergency number at **703-691-2131**, **TTY 711**.

It's free!

You may or may not be aware of free events or services available to you as a Fairfax County resident. The following is a list you may want to save for future reference:

- 1) **Tick ID Service**: The Fairfax County Health Department's Disease Carrying Insects program will identify a tick that you find on your body, **free of charge**. The following is information from their Website on how to do this:
 - o After you <u>remove the attached tick</u>, place the tick inside a plastic bag. The Health Department does not remove ticks.
 - o Bring the tick to the Health Department's administration building, 10777 Main Street (Kelly Square), Fairfax, VA 22030.
 - o Bring the tick to the permit counter located in Suite 111. Hours: Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.
 - o If a DCIP staff member is available when the tick is brought in, the tick can be identified within a few minutes while you wait. Or you will receive a call at a later time.

- 2) **Document Shredding**: Secure document shredding events are available free to Fairfax County residents. Documents from businesses are not accepted. Leaf Collection

Leaf Area 9 will receive the first round of vacuum leaf collection on *November 14th*. To ensure that you receive this pickup, please make sure your leaves are raked/blown within 4 feet from the edge of the street prior to this date.

The vacuum leaf program is for leaves only. Leaves mixed with brush, rocks, tree trimmings, sticks or trash, etc. cannot be vacuumed. Please remove all debris from leaves prior to set out. Do not block streets or pile leaves in storm drains or drainage ditches. Do not block leaf piles with cars or any type of equipment that could limit our accessibility to the leaves or create hazardous conditions. Do not park vehicles on piles of leaves - this is a fire hazard.







Neighborhood Parking: Be aware



In light of a recent accident in our neighborhood and various complaints received, please note the following Fairfax County ordinances when parking your vehicle.

- Parking is not allowed in or within 20 feet of intersections—82-5-1(a)(3)
- Parking is not allowed within 30 feet of a stop sign—82-5-1(a)(7)
- Parking is not allowed within 15 feet of a hydrant—82-5-1(a)(4)

When parking a vehicle, think about whether you are blocking the line of site for other drivers who may be backing or pulling out.
