Safe Haven in South Amana has been feeling the love from the lowa Hawkeyes with more than 90 members of the Hawkeye football team combining for 975 hours of community service this summer at Safe Haven.

Safe Haven volunteer coordinator Courtney Ralph reached out via social media to invite a few players to promote the animal shelter asking them to "Come visit, meet some of our animals and take photos and share the experience with the community. . ."

According to defensive end, 6-year veteran Joe Evans puppy fever took hold and pretty soon there were groups of players coming out to Safe Haven regularly. "it ended up everyone going to Safe Haven and having a great time." He explained to journalist Jack Bacon, who wrote a piece for Hawkeyesports.com called "The Dog Days of Summer."

As the article reports, this became a popular and relaxing way for players to get away from the stress and pressure of training while assisting their team to earn points as part of the Hawkeye sports programs "Championship Teams." Championship Teams promotes community volunteer service by encouraging all U of I athletes to volunteer.

Players came multiple times in groups large and small. "I was out at Safe Haven 12 times this summer," said Kaleb Johnson. "I would go out for an hour or two each time. We would take the dogs out, feed them, play with them and show love to them."

They completed some big tasks too, like moving a huge pile of rock that had been left after fence and building construction. Some players made extra time for the cats and kittens, including kicker Drew Stevens and defensive back Jermari Harris. Harris ended up adopting a cat whom he calls his good friend, "It was love at first sight. . ."

Harris said that between the relaxing, rural drive to South Amana and spending time with the animals, Safe Haven became an aptly named getaway for the Hawkeyes. "It was fun, and I also love the drive," said Harris. "It is just 30 minutes west of here, so I can get my head away from things and go visit the animals. I met new friends and Courtney Ralph is an amazing person. She reached out to me and got me interested. Once I got into the building, it was fun from there on."

Did You Know?....

I don't know of a place that has more festivals than the Amana Colonies! And with the festivals come the various signage detailing the who, what and where. But I find many merchants are confused about what they can and cannot do regarding Temporary Special Event Signs. In the near future I will be creating a Summary Sheet detailing the parameters for these signs (including some go/no go examples). But here are some general rules:

• Special Event Signs can only be UP seven days before an event and taken DOWN within two days after an event.

• Yes there is an application form (and fee) associated with special event signs. This is the best way to determine (early on) that you are doing the right thing. See your friendly Administrator.

Ultimately this is all about growing commerce in the Amana Colonies (we all want that). So it is important that all the merchants understand the rules uniformly.


