The Mission/Outreach team along with those attending CPC provide items for families such as diapers and help those who are ready to go out on their own, yet need things like bedding, kitchen items, etc. It takes a village to care for others.

What else? We have a group made of members from CPC and from Faith Lutheran who practice and play "Bells" together. CPC offers Blood Drives, Animal Blessings, and provides a worship service for a "Blue Christmas" for those

who are struggling with having lost a loved one. One of our favorites in September is the "West Fest" that is sponsored by West Fargo. The CPC Parking Lot becomes the place to have hotdogs and goodies. CPC asks for donations that will go towards community needs.

The point of all of this is that Community Presbyterian Church is more than just Worship on Sunday morning. It takes active people who are willing to care for the people around us. Many times, it means caring for people who do not look like us or have different backgrounds than we do.

Sunday, July 23, a crowd celebration of ioined in the time shared between Pastor Cathie and Community Presbyterian Church. The day began with a special congregational meet-




ing to dissolve the pastoral relationship between Pastor Cathie and CPC. This was followed immediately by an outdoor service on the church front lawn.
