"Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." Our greeting is considered a

Pauline greeting, and I share it with you as we journey through the season of Lent through the month of March.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. The liturgy from the Book of Common Worship invites Christians, "To observe a Holy Lent by self-examination and penitence, by prayer and fasting, by works of love and by reading and meditating on the Word of God." Whether you were able to attend our Ash Wednesday service, or not, you are invited to observe a holy Lent.

The invitation gives us some clues as to what it means to observe a Holy Lent. Before we get too far into this journey, we need to be willing to look

at ourselves. Yes, we need to look at ourselves at least every year, if not daily. What do we mean by looking at ourselves, or self-examination? For Christians, it means that we need to take time to sincerely reflect on our own faith regularly. Lent provides an opportunity for us to find time to be honest with ourselves, to look at the past year and be able to ask ourselves, "How have we grown as Christians this past year?" or "What seemed to get in our way of growing as a Chris- 规 tian?"

Sometimes the answer is, we did not grow, we may have slid backwards. We are humans, and we are not perfect, although we have been known to act like we are perfect, and place expectations for perfection onto others. We are not always as humble as Jesus reminds us to be. We get frustrated and irritated for many reasons, and we can open our mouths and say words that are hurtful and harmful to others. We can let the sense of power and privilege get in the way of caring for others. We don't necessarily plan to be that way, but it certainly can and does happen.

God has given us a gift to be able to examine ourselves on a regular basis, particularly during the season of Lent. One of the ways we can examine ourselves is to find a place where the distractions are few, and we are able to be by ourselves in solitude. It seems to work best if we have a place where we can listen to God, as well as talk with God. Take some time to think about where you can find a peaceful place. Jesus was known for seeking out places where he could be alone in solitude. He used that time to spend time listening and talking with God. Go to God in prayer and reach out your hands to others. A Holy Lent includes hearing God and following Jesus by serving others.

A Holy Lent includes prayer, and it also includes continuing to read and meditate

on the Word of God, the scriptures in the Bible. An easy way to decide what scripture to read is to find the list of scripture readings for each Sunday and worship service during the month of March. Look in this newsletter, and you will find a listing of the scripture for each worship service <on page 4>. You will also find a listing for each of our worship services <also on page 4>.

Lent provides that time during the church year when we are reminded of all that Jesus taught the disciples, and all who read scripture, the Word of God. Each day we get to start our day anew. It is also a time to repent, to continue to grow as a Christian. Look for God in the face of each person you meet. Make a gratitude list, starting with thanking God for each new day, for the beauty of God's world, and for growth as a Christian so you can share the good news!

ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES

The annual meeting of Community Presbyterian Church was held on January 21, 2018



at 11:00 a.m. in the church sanctuary. The meeting was opened with prayer by Moderator Rev. Cathie Bishop. The clerk verified there was a quorum present with 50 people in attendance.

The minutes of the Annual meeting of the Congregation and Corporation of Community Presbyterian Church from January 22, 2017 were presented and approved.

Becky DeJong presented the membership report. 2017 had 10 membership gains and 12 membership losses resulting in 181 members of CPC.

Carolyn Meester presented the Financial Report with the aid of a power point presentation. Members can see the detailed financial report found in the annual report.

The congregation was asked to look over all 2017 committee reports. No questions were asked or comments made.

Andrew Thostenson reviewed the budget with the aid of a power point presentation. The budget is based on actual spending. The detailed budget can be found in the annual report.

Discussion was held regarding the separation of salary and housing. It was stated that the pastor may divide these amounts as deemed necessary for tax purposes. Corrections were made to the printed terms of call: 2017 Total Compensation should be \$65,996.10, proposed increase to the business expense should be \$0.00 making the total proposed compensation \$2,825.70.


