MATTER OF BALANCE

Have you turned down a chance to go out with family or friends because you were concerned about falling? Have you cut down on a favorite activity because you might fall?

People who experience a fear of falling often limit their physical activities, which can result in loss of strength, reduced muscle tone and balance problems, making the risk of falling greater.

By attending A Matter of Balance: Managing Concerns About Falls you will:

- Set realistic goals for staying active
- Learn how to stay safe at home
- Complete exercises to increase strength and balance
- Learn how to identify and control your fear of falling

The class is conducted over eight sessions by trained coaches and will meet each Tuesday until the course is complete for one and one half hours per session. The program's goals are to reduce fear of falling, stop the fear of falling cycle, and increase activity levels and confidence among older adults. We will begin on Tuesday, September 2nd at 10:00 am and end at approximately 11:30 am, just in time for lunch. All those signing up and beginning the new class with us will receive their lunch *FREE* here at the center after that first session. Call and sign up before August 22nd (419-946-4191).

ALL SESSIONS ARE FREE PLUS A FREE LUNCH AFTER THE FIRST SESSION. You have nothing to lose and a lot to gain. We will need at least 6 participants to start the new class.
