Class Descriptions

- 1) OPEN ENGLISH SHOWMANSHIP: Open to youth and adult exhibitors, mares & geldings of all ages and breeds. Judge evaluates the grooming and fitting of the horse and expertise of exhibitor in presenting the horse. Exhibitors are required to perform a pattern posted the day of the show with emphasis on preciseness of pattern and degree of confidence exhibited by the showperson.
- 2) PONY HALTER: Open to ponies (under 14.2 hands) of any breed or discipline (NO PAPERS REQUIRED). This is an in-hand class to be judged on the pony's conformation, balance, overall appearance, and usefulness. Exhibitors must enter this class to be eligible for the year-end pony halter award.
- 3) LEADLINE WALK: Open to English and Western exhibitors 8 years of age and under who will be competing in Leadline only with mares and geldings of all ages and breeds. Handler and rider to be in appropriate attire. To be shown at a walk, may be asked to reverse direction. Judged on rider's position and ability to control their horse. Age as of January 1st.
- 4) LEADLINE WALK OFF LEAD: Open to English and Western exhibitors 8 years of age and under who will be competing in Leadline only with mares and geldings of all ages and breeds. Handler and rider to be in appropriate attire. To be shown at a walk only with horse and rider off lead and handler walking closely beside horse and rider for safety purposes. May be asked to reverse direction. Judged on rider's position and ability to control their horse. Age as of January 1st.
- 5) LEADLINE WALK TROT: Open to English and Western exhibitors 8 years of age and under who will be competing in Leadline only with mares and geldings of all ages and breeds. Handler and rider to be in appropriate attire. To be shown at a walk and trot. English riders expected to post but wrong diagonal will not be penalized. May be asked to reverse direction. Judged on rider's position and ability to control their horse. Age as of January 1st.
- 6) LEADLINE PATTERN: Open to all Leadline exhibitors regardless of age. Exhibitors will be asked to execute a very simple pattern to be posted at the start of the show. Riders will be judged on their position, ability to control their horse independently, and how precisely they execute the pattern.
- 7) JUNIOR ENGLISH WALK - TROT EQUITATION: To be shown at a walk and trot both ways of the ring and may be asked to back. To be judged on the rider. May not cross enter in W/T/C classes.
- 8) JUNIOR ENGLISH WALK-TROT PLEASURE: To be shown at a walk and trot both ways of the ring and may be asked to back. To be judged on manners, suitability, soundness, and performance. May not cross enter in W/T/C classes.
- 9) JUNIOR ENGLISH WALK-TROT PATTERN: Open to English exhibitors of any discipline. To perform a pre-posted pattern at the walk and trot (pattern may require changes in direction & gait as well as appropriate changes in diagonal), halting & backing. To be judged on correct execution, fluidity of transitions, equitation and horse's willing-ness to perform. Judge may ask for rail work. May not cross enter in W/T/C classes.
- 10) ADULT ENGLISH WALK-TROT EQUITATION: To be shown at a walk and trot both ways of the ring and may be asked to back. To be judged on the rider. May not cross enter in W/T/C classes.
- 11) ADULT ENGLISH WALK-TROT PLEASURE: To be shown at a walk and trot both ways of the ring and may be asked to back. To be judged on manners, suitability, soundness, and performance. May not cross enter in W/T/C classes.
- 12) ADULT ENGLISH WALK-TROT PATTERN: Open to English exhibitors of any discipline. To perform a pre-posted pattern at the walk and trot (pattern may require changes in direction & gait as well as appropriate changes in diagonal), halting & backing. To be judged on correct execution, fluidity of transitions, equitation and horse's willing-ness to perform. Judge may ask for rail work. May not cross enter in W/T/C classes.
- 13) JUNIOR ENGLISH WALK /TROT/CANTER EQUITATION: To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring and may be asked to back, hand gallop. To be judged on the rider.
- 14) JUNIOR ENGLISH WALK/TROT/CANTER PLEASURE: To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring and may be asked to back, hand gallop. To be judged on manners, suitability, soundness, and performance.

Class Descriptions

- 15) JUNIOR ENGLISH WALK/TROT/CANTER PATTERN: Open to English exhibitors of any discipline. To perform a pre-determined pattern at the walk, trot & canter (pattern may require changes in direction & gait as well as appropriate changes in diagonal & lead), halting & backing. To be judged on correct execution, fluidity of transitions, equitation and horse's willingness to perform. Judge may ask for rail work.
- 16) ADULT ENGLISH WALK/TROT/CANTER EQUITATION: To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring and may be asked to back, hand gallop. To be judged on the rider.
- 17) ADULT ENGLISH WALK/TROT/CANTER PLEASURE: To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring and may be asked to back, hand gallop. To be judged on manners, suitability, soundness, and performance.
- 18) ADULT ENGLISH WALK/TROT/CANTER PATTERN: Open to English exhibitors of any discipline. To perform a pre-determined pattern at the walk, trot & canter (pattern may require changes in direction & gait as well as appropriate changes in diagonal & lead), halting & backing. To be judged on correct execution, fluidity of transitions, equitation and horse's willingness to perform. Judge may ask for rail work.
- 19) WALK/TROT GROUNDRAILS: Open to English or Western exhibitors of any age. Will consist of at least 4, no more than 8 cavaletti poles to be trotted in a specific pattern to be posted before the show. Riders should complete the pattern at a trot and will be judged accordingly (correct diagonal) Judged on equitation, fluidity, and horse's willingness. Riders may not cross enter into W/T/C classes.
- 20) HUNT SEAT EQUITATION OVER CROSSRAILS 18": Open to English exhibitors. Will consist of at least 4, no more than 8 cross rails to be jumped in a specific pattern to be posted before the show. Riders may complete the pattern at a trot or canter and will be judged accordingly (correct diagonal & lead but not penalized for simple lead changes) Judged on equitation, fluidity, and horse's willingness.
- 21) HUNT SEAT EQUITATION OVER FENCES 2': Riders will be required to complete a course of 4-8 jumps at 2' (course to be posted the day of the show). Judging of this class will be based on the rider's equitation. Riders will not be penalized for simple lead changes.
- 22) HUNTER OVER FENCES 2': Riders will complete a course of 4-8 jumps at 2' (course to be posted the day of the show). To be judged on performance and soundness with manners emphasized. Riders will not be penalized for simple lead changes.
- 23) OPEN WESTERN SHOWMANSHIP: Open to youth and adult exhibitors, mares & geldings of all ages and breeds. Judge evaluates the grooming and fitting of the horse and expertise of exhibitor in presenting the horse. Exhibitors are required to perform a pattern posted the day of the show with emphasis on preciseness of pattern and degree of confidence exhibited by the showperson.
- 24) OPEN WESTERN WALK/JOG EQUITATION: To be shown at a walk and jog both ways of the ring and may be asked to back. To be judged on the rider. Open to riders of any age. May not cross-enter in W/J/L classes.
- 25) OPEN WESTERN WALK/JOG PLEASURE: To be shown at a walk and jog both ways of the ring and may be asked to back. To be judged on manners, suitability, soundness, and performance. Open to riders of any age. May not cross-enter in W/J/L classes.
- 26) OPEN WESTERN WALK/JOG PATTERN: To perform a pre-posted pattern at the walk and jog, and may require change in direction, halting & backing. To be judged on correct execution, fluidity of transitions, equitation and horse's willingness to perform. Judge may ask for rail work. May not cross-enter in W/J/L classes.
- 27) OPEN WESTERN EQUITATION: To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring and may be asked to hand gallop. To be judged on the rider. Open to riders of any age.
- 28) OPEN WESTERN PLEASURE: To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring and may be asked to hand gallop. To be judged on manners, suitability, soundness, and performance. Open to riders of all ages.
- 29) OPEN WESTERN PATTERN: Open to Western exhibitors of all ages. Exhibitors to perform a pre-determined pattern at the walk, jog & lope (pattern may require changes in direction & gait as well as appropriate changes in lead), halting & backing. To be judged on correct execution, fluidity of transitions, as well as equitation and horse's willingness to perform. Judge may ask for rail work.

Class Descriptions

30) WALK/TROT SIMON SAYS: Open to exhibitors of any age/discipline. This is a basic Simon Says game, exhibitors to show at a walk and trot or jog in both directions of the ring. Riders to be eliminated gradually until there is one winner. May not cross-enter into W/T/C Break Your Gait.

31) WALK/TROT/CANTER BREAK YOUR GAIT: Open to exhibitors of any age/discipline. This is a basic Break Your Gait game, exhibitors to show at a walk, trot/jog, canter/lope in both directions of the ring. Riders to be eliminated gradually until there is one winner. May not cross-enter into Walk/Trot Simon Says.

32) WALK/TROT BAREBACK EQUITATION: Open to exhibitors of any age/discipline. Riders to show bareback at a walk and trot/jog. Format will follow that of a typical equitation class and riders will be judged on their position, control, and correct/accuracy of execution of commands. Proper attire required. May not cross-enter into W/T/C Bareback Equitation.

33) WALK/TROT/CANTER BAREBACK EQUITATION: Open to exhibitors of any age/discipline. Riders to show bareback at a walk, trot/jog, and canter/lope. Format will follow that of a typical equitation class and riders will be judged on their position, control, and correct/accuracy of execution of commands. Proper attire required. May not cross-enter into Walk-Trot Bareback Equitation.

34) WALK/TROT BARREL DASH: Open to riders of any age/discipline. Basic barrel dash class, to be timed and placed accordingly. Exhibitors in this class to complete the class at a walk and trot only. Riders who canter more than 3 consecutive strides will be given a 5 second penalty. May not cross enter into Walk/Trot/Canter Barrel dash.

35) WALK/TROT/CANTER BARREL DASH: Open to riders of any age/discipline. Basic barrel dash class, to be timed and placed accordingly. May not cross-enter into Walk/Trot Barrel Dash.

36) WATER RACE: Open to riders of any age/discipline/level. Riders to be given a full glass of water at the start of the class, to be held at a specified mark at the bottom of the stem. Riders to complete the class following the commands of the judge. At the end of the class, water will be measured in each glass and the exhibitor with the most remaining water will be the winner. Subsequent riders will be placed accordingly.

Entry Information

How to submit online entries:

Due to a decrease in volunteer help we will be relying almost solely on online entries. We do not have sufficient trained volunteer help to accommodate everyone entering the day of the show. Please enter online via the methods below by 10pm Friday night before the show.

How it works:

- Visit the **SHOW INFO** page to print the class listing (or you can use the listing in this prize list).
- From the menu, click **ONLINE ENTRY FORM**.
- Fill out the form and click SUBMIT.

On show day:

Upon arrival, visit the Registration table to show your Coggins, pay for your entries, and sign your waiver (or print and sign your waiver at home).

Upon completion of **ALL** of the above steps, you will receive your exhibitor number.

Additional Information:

Entries for 2022 will be as follows: \$10 per class, show all day for \$50.

Online entries **MUST** be received by 10pm on Friday night prior to the show.

You MUST submit one form for EACH HORSE/RIDER combination.

Exhibitors who utilize the online entries may add or scratch classes on show day without penalty.

Trainer name **MUST** be present on entry form in order for points to count toward the Year-End High Point Trainer award and horses age **MUST** be present for the Old Timer award.

Due to COVID-19, online registration is HIGHLY ENCOURAGED. We will be implementing a \$10 office fee in 2022 for all on-site registrations AND/OR registrations that need to be re-done due to registering multiple horses/riders or combinations on one form.

Show Rules

2022 NWJHS Show Rules

**Schooling rules must be followed for the safety of all exhibitors.

Schooling Times:

Immediately prior to start of show only for exhibitors entered in classes prior to lunch.

Between walk/trot and walk/trot/canter/lope divisions for a quick 5-10 minute warm-up.

Immediately prior to start of the jumping classes. This schooling is open to all exhibitors entered in the jumping classes and will be run in the following groups; ground rails only, crossrails, and straight rails at the discretion of the show committee. If the groups are too large, they may be split.

During the lunch break.

2. Show management reserves the right to regulate schooling by either splitting schooling into groups or mandating that all riders school in the same direction at once if safety looks compromised.

3. All exhibitors should be mindful of others during all schooling times and pass correctly if riding in the opposite direction of others (left to left) and call inside rail when passing in the same direction.

4. **Helmets are required at all times for all riders under 18 years of age, even western riders.**

5. Trainers are permitted in the ring during schooling times only.

6. No riding or additional schooling will be permitted in the arena after the show has ended for safety/ liability reasons.

7. ** Stallions are not permitted.

8. Management reserves the right to combine classes with less than 3 entries.

9. If Adult classes have less than 3 entries, they may be combined with Juniors at the discretion of the show committee but will be judged separately.

10. All discrepancies must be discussed with the show management prior to leaving the show grounds.

11. A rider must be under 18 years of age as of January 1 to be considered a Junior.

12. All riders 18 years of age or older as of January 1 will be considered an Adult.

13. Leadline age is as of January 1.

14. A negative coggins dated within **ONE CALENDAR YEAR** of the show date **MUST** be presented for all horses at time of registration. Valid health certificate also required upon request.

15. Proper tack and attire is required for all classes. Exhibitors without appropriate tack may not cross enter disciplines (English exhibitors may use any type of English saddle, but may not enter Western classes, and visa versa). Exhibitors without full attire (helmets required) may choose to enter but will be judged accordingly at the judges discretion.

16. Riders entering in Walk/Trot/Jog divisions may not cross-enter in Walk/Trot/Jog/Canter/Lope divisions.

17. Exhibitors must show at a minimum of 2 shows throughout the season to be eligible for Series-End Awards.

18. In the case of a tie for day-end championship points the points earned in the equitation class will be used as the tie-breaker.

19. For the Fun & Games division riders may cross-enter between walk/trot/jog classes and walk/trot/canter/lope classes but may only enter one class of each type. (You may not enter both the walk/trot and walk/trot/canter version of one particular class but may choose to enter the walk/trot version of one class and the walk/trot/canter version of the next).

Additional Information

2022 Year-End Awards

To be eligible for year end awards the only requirement is to participate in 2 or more regular season shows. No fees, no form.

See page 2 for year-end division awards. **High point pony awards are open to all ponies regardless of breed or discipline. Points accumulated from all performance classes entered count toward Performance award, points from the Halter class count toward Halter award. Same eligibility criteria applies.*

From Ross' Corner in Augusta: Rt. 565 north 7.3 miles, Left onto Rt. 628 (by old gas station) for 2.8 miles, Right onto Rt. 519 (by Plumbsock Farm) for .3 miles, Left (just past By-Acres Farm) onto Neilson Road for .8 miles.

From Route 23 (Vernon, Sparta, Franklin) Route 23 North to the town of Sussex, Left at Sussex Inn, Right at light to continue Rt. 23 North. Go .9 miles., make Left onto Route 650/Libertyville Rd. (by Green Olive Restaurant), go 3.8 Miles., make Left onto Colesville Lusscroft Rd/ Rt. 519, go .4 miles, make Right onto Neilson Rd, go .8 miles.

From Route 23 (Port Jervis): South on Rt. 23, right onto Rt. 519 (by vacant gas station). Make right onto Neilson Road.

From Milford, PA.: Cross Milford Bridge. 3 way intersection, go right on Route 206. Continue on 206 to left onto Ridge Road. Ridge Road to end (T intersection). left on Mattison Rd., then take first right onto Mattison Reservoir Ave. Reservoir Avenue turns into Neilson Road at Crigger Road intersection. Neilson Road to #50 – Lusscroft Farm. Manor House will be on the left side, the barns on the right.
