

A SAVED PEOPLE-Matt. 1.21.

"There was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews: The same came to Jesus by night, and said unto Him, Rabbi, we know that thou art a teacher come from God: for no man can do these miracles that thou doest, except God be with Him." John 3;1-2.

No doubt, Nicodemus was a man that had the repuation of being an honest and upright citizen. He had authority in the work of the church, and performed his duties well; still Nicodemus was not so stupid but what he knew that there was more to the experience of knowing God than what he had obtained. He wished to know more about the things of God, but desired that the world know nothing of his eagerness to learn. He knew what had been said about Jesus and his disciples; knowing also that the same blasphemy would be given him if he be seen with Jesus.

After pondering the circumstances in his heart for some time, he conceived a plan. He had heard that Jesus was to be in Jerusalem so he would go to him by night and inquire of the things that

were religious problems to him. Religion presented many perplexing things to him; tho he be a ruler of the Jews and a Master of Israel.

Today throughout the world we have many people that are in the same situation as Nicodemus was. Numbers of religious people are honest and sincere in their work; yet like Nicodemus, know that there is more to Salvation than they have received. To these people we endeavor to write these words.

We too, one day was in this place. Not knowing many of the blessings of God, yet with a longing desire to know and understand more of God and His Word. We desired to learn about Jesus and his divine nature, not just to know about it but to experience the blessings that other people told about. Reproaches were to be borne if we endeavored to go very far with God and this we knew: but one day God looked down with compassion and mercy and saw the need that we had and sent His spirit to our rescue. The spirit of God convicted us of our negligence and sloth-fulness in the things of eternal value. We were

convinced that something must be done about it.

In order to progress in the things of God we must mean "business" with God. The work of the Lord must be taken care of in a business like manner. We must let the world and Satan know that we are on the Lord's side. It is no-doubt easier at times to keep quiet and not take our stand for the right but just a little way farther down the path we always find it would have been better to take our stand at the beginning. Nicodemus knew that Jesus was a teacher come from God and he desired to talk over a few things with him. He had seen the miracles that Jesus had cone and was convinced that it was the power of God. He longed to have the power of God manifest in his life but yet there was his church standing was at stake and this he knew. Many people of this day would accept the teaching of the word of God for many blessings if not for their church standing.

It is a cowardly act to be a hypocrite. Anyone that would try to hold to the name of Christ as insurance against hell and the nbe so low as to betray the sacred laws of God are cowardly in every respect. It takes an individual with 'backbone' and courage to stand for the things that are holy and right and any person of the 'Jellyfish' type are not going through. It is a wonderful thing to have a lot of friends in the world but if we have to sacrifice our experience with God in order to gain them we are far better off without them. Nicodemus was no doubt a very good church member of the Pharisees and would make an excellent member in many of the modern churches of today. He was an influential business man and the church could hardly get along without him ,so they thought). 'Nicodemus' meant 'a conqueror of the people' and this Nicodemus used to a great advantage for it seemd that the meaning of his name was given to him as his birthright and he was a ruler of the Jews.

The world needs inflential people in many walks of life but without God in their lives they are a failure. Paul said: "I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ for it is the power of God unto Salvation." He knew what it had done for him and he was willing to tell the world and sinners what it could do for them. He did not regard the face or words of men. When untold numbers of people of this day are turning to the beggarly elements of the world and sin, still comes the call from God asking for someone that he can trust; for someone

Friend, if you only know Jesus as a teacher come from God, there is more for you. If you have not experienced being born again by the spirit-you are living below your privileges. Do not try to come to Jesus and His word as Nicodemus did but turn your back to the world and your face toward God and hunger and thirst after righteousness and you shall be filled. No man, having put his hand to the (Gospel- plow and looking back is fit for the Kingdom of God.

People prefer to hunt motes, but when they do they are trespassing. Never hunt motes unless God so commands.

What is a beam? There are many beams but mote hunters fail to find them. Sometimes they break the hearts of those loved best and that love them best by suspecting them of evil.

It is the business of Satan to create strife between man and wife and if he succeeds it mars the work of both.

Then I think of another beam. Someone holds a grudge against his brother, won't fellowship him, sometimes won't even shake hands. Jesus said "For if you forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Heavenly Father for-

give you". But someone says "I've been forgiven." So had the man who owed 10,000 talents, but when he failed to forgive the man who owed him 100 pence, the debt was re-established.

In this life we are on probation. Yesterday doesn't count.

"Today is the day of salvation". But you say, 'This man didn't sin against me, how can I forgive him?" There is another scripture, "If thou bring thy gift to the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath ought against you, leave there thy gift before the altar and go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother and then come and offer thy gift."

What can we give God that He can't take whether we will or not? He can take health, friends, property, etc. Just one thing He can't take without our consent. Loving obedience. "If you love me keep my commandments." Then if you work around the altar, pray, tithe, and fail in this one commandment your very service is disobedience. Leave it before the altar until you are reconciled to your brother. Remember, before the altar, not on it. If you are holding a grudge against someone, don't try to hunt up some passage of scripture to excuse yourself. There is no excuse for disobedience. It is inexcusable. To sum the whole matter up, you can have your grudge or you can have salvation; you can't have both. In other words, you can't take your grudge to heaven, but it can take you to hell.

The Coming of a Savior

Genesis 18:18. 'Seeing Abraham shall become a great and mighty nation and all the nations of the earth shall be blessed in him."

As we consider this verse of holy writ it seems entirely incomprehensible that so many who are living in this enlightened age when we boast of great attainments and knowledge should be so much in darkness concerning the fundamentals of the gospel of Jesus Christ and its workings in the lives of humanity. There can only be one or two reasons for such a failure to understand and accept the gospel; willing ignorance of the truths of the Bible or a love of the things of the world in sin.

Abraham, the leader of a new spiritual race and in the garden of whose heart religious seed were sown from which were to spring results in the church of the future, was the leader of a great spiritual host, was a man of great renown, and through him all the nations of the earth are blessed with the plan of salvation. All because Abraham listened to the command of God.

Jesus as the Savior of the world did not come to just a few people but to the entire world so that we might all know and be blessed by Him and His gospel. "It was not done in a corner."

To Come from the World's Most

Prominent People

Deut. 18:15. "The Lord thy God will raise up unto thee a prophet, from the midst of thee, of thy brethren like unto me, unto him shall ye hearken."

Isaiah 11:10. "In that day there shall

be a root of Jesse which shall stand as an ensign of the people—49:6, to raise up the tribes of Judah, I will also give thee for a light to the Gentiles, that thou mayest be my salvation to the end; of the earth."

From these verses we begin to see the truth of the statement "This thing was not done in a corner," for out of the midst of Israel the world's most prominent people of that time was there to come the prophet Jesus, who the world must hear in all things he was to say. Then again by the prophet Isaiah that out of Jesse there was to come the Saviour to Judah, a light to the Gentiles, bringing salvation to the ends of the earth.

The emphasis of this message is the prominence of Jesus and his gospel and the need of accepting that gospel in its fullness.

He Was To Be Born in Judea

Matthew 2:1. "Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king,—"

We have only to pause for a moment to consider the fact that the birth of Jesus was in the very hub of the then-known world, thus His coming was to the very center of the world's civilization. Why then do we seek to push Jesus, his doctrines, his commandments, and his blessings to humanity into the place of obscurity which so many and even many professors are trying to do.

Baptized in Jordan

Mark 1:9. "And it came to pass in those days, that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee, and was baptized of John in Jordan."

Our next step in the study of this subject reveals to us the fact that Jesus did not slip away to some unknown or unheard of location for the beginning of his public ministry. We find him coming to the place where multitudes

gathered and there openly beginning the duties of His ministry with the resultant manifestation of the approval of His heavenly Father.

Preached in the Temple

Matthew 21:12-15. "And Jesus went into the temple of God, and cast out all them that sold and bought in the temple, and overthrew the tables of the money-changers and the seats of them that sold doves, and said unto them, it is written, my house shall be called a house of prayer but ye have made it a den of thieves. And the blind and the lame came unto Him in the temple and He healed them."

True to the former statements concerning the prominence of Jesus and His ministry we now find Him in the world's most famous building preaching and teaching with authority; driving out the hyprocritical religious professors of that day who were doing as many professors are doing today, commercializing in the church and religion. He immediately began to manifest his mission to the world, relieving the suffering of humanity by opening the eyes of the blind and healing the cripples. These things were not being done in a remote corner of civilization but in the world's most famous building, the temple in Jerusalem. "This thing was not done in a corner."

The Plan of Salvation Not Hidden Mark 16:15. "And He said unto them, go ye into the world and preach the gospel to every creature."

Acts 10:34, 35. "Then Peter opened his mouth and said of a truth I perceive that God is no respector of persons; but in every nation he that feareth him and worketh righteous is acceptable with Him."

The plan of salvation is then given to all the world in its fullness but men have devalued and taken away from until many religious professors of today know nothing of the realities of salvation.

Sanctification Not a Fad I Thes. 4:3, 4. "For this is the will of God—that every one of you should

KNOW HOW TO POSSESS HIS VESSEL IN SANCTIFICATION AND HONOR."

The teaching of sanctification which has become so obscure in the church world of today is not hidden or something done in a corner but from the above text we note the commandment concerning the will of God that everyone should know of the experience of sanctification.

The Baptism of the Holy Ghost Not a Fanatical Theory

The devil's excuse which has blinded the eyes of so many professors, "These things are not for us today" has no foundation and for one to make such excuse or claim is only to express their willing ignorance concerning the gospel. THE MARCH OF WORLD EMPIRES

An Outlined Study of the Book of Daniel by Evangelist Ralph A. Durham

SERIES NO. 7

After once again kneeling beside our desk to seek God's guidance and help we resume our study of Daniel's writings, realizing how very important are the things which God hath made known unto us through His servants, the Prophets and men of inspiration, who desired to walk with God.

We have reached the tenth chapter of the book of Daniel and will make only a brief study of this chapter since this chapter is in reality a preparation or introduction for the things of importance revealed in chapter eleven.

WHAT IS IMPORTANT IN VERSE ONE, CHAPTER TEN?

"A thing was revealed unto Daniel—the thing was true but the time appointed was long."

Something of importance was made known unto Daniel and let us remember that Daniel in the beginning of his supplications had believed that the Messiah would come and the Kingdom of Righteousness would be established at the end of the Babylonish Captivity, however he was mistaken in this matter and the vision now being revealed unto him was to cause him to understand that the time until the coming of the Messiah and the setting up of His kingdom 'would be long.'

WHY WAS THE ANSWER TO DANIEL'S PRAYER DELAYED?

The angels of Satan were able to interfere with the answering of Daniel's prayer. If that were possible then is it not probable that many times even yet when the answer to prayer does not come at once that Satan's angels are hindering? Let us, however, take a

lesson from Daniel in this matter; he continued to pray even for three full weeks, or until God sent the answer. If God would send one of His chief angels to deliver the answer to Daniel He will surely see that the answer comes to us if we will earnestly pray.

WHO WAS THIS 'CERTAIN MAN' SPOKEN OF HERE?

From the very detailed description given here of this Man I am constrained to believe that this was none other than Jesus Himself who was sent to prepare Daniel for the vision which would cause him to understand the things concerning the rise of the Roman Empire which in it's first and last estate was to be the last manruled World Empire.

With the words of the last verse of the chapter, "I will shew thee that which is noted in the scripture of truth:" we leave the tenth and enter the eleventh chapter to make a very detailed study of the same.

CHAPTER XI

The first thing to which we would call our attention concerning the eleventh chapter is this: The chapter is divided into two main parts or divisions, as follows:

Verses one to twenty-six or thereabout and verses twenty-seven to forty-five.

The first part of this chapter covers a period of some two to three hundred years following the time of the giving of this revelation and shows the continued conflict between the two major divisions of Alexanders' kingdom, Syria (king of the North) and Egypt, (king of the South) and how

these events were to affect the Jews and their land.

The latter part (future yet) shows the condition under the WILLFUL KING, OR ANTI-CHRIST in the last week of Israel's time and the striking similiarity of the little horn of Alexander's divided kingdom (see Dan. 8:) to the little horn of the close of the Gentile age.

With these thoughts in mind let us begin the study of our test verse by verse:

In Dan. 11:1 the angel said, "Also I, in the first year of Darius the Mede, even I, stood to confirm and strengthen him." By these words the angel showed Daniel that he had been active in the past and had been an influence upon past history. He was therefore in a position, having been sent from God, to reveal to Daniel the things of the past, present and future.

THE REMAINING KINGS OF PERSIA

In verse two he said, "And now will I shew you the truth. Behold, there shall stand up yet three kings in Persia; and the fourth shall be far richer than they all: and by his strength through his riches he shall stir up all against the realm of Greecia."

A study of secular history reveals these kings mentioned in the foregoing passage.

GREECE AND ALEXANDER THE GREAT

The invasion of Greece spoken of here took place in 480 B. C. which brings us to the thing referred to in verse 3, we quote: "And a mighty king shall stand up, that shall rule with great dominion, and do according to his will."

The interpretation of this verse is not at all difficult since it is so clearly speaking of the rise to power of Alexander the Great, who was the king of the Greecian Empire, as represented by the notable horn seen by Daniel on the he-goat in chapter 8.

THIS KINGDOM TO BE DIVIDED

"And when he shall stand up, his

kingdom shall be broken, and shall be divided toward the four winds of heaven; and not to his posterity, nor according to his dominion which he ruled: for his kingdom shall be plucked up, even for others beside those."

We have learned in previous studies that when A'exander had made his kingdom great, he died at a very early age because of a life of gross immorality and sin. Following his death his kingdom was divided into four parts and was given to his four leading generals, thus: Syria, Egypt, Macedonia and Asia-Minor. This conforms that spoken of in the text which said the kingdom would be divided but would not be given to his posterity.

THE KINGS OF THE NORTH AND SOUTH:

Verse 5, "And the king of the South shall be strong; and one of his princes; and he shall be strong above him, and have dominion; his dominion shall be a great dominion."

After Alexander's death the kingdom had been divided into four divisions, only two of these divisions became prominent in history, Egypt and Syria. Thus setting the stage for the march of events prophecied of here and pertaining to the kings of the North and South.

Ptolemy I, Soter, became ruler of Egypt and Seleucas became the ruler of Syria. Thus we have the first king of the South and the North, designated in these rulers of Egypt and Syria. This Biblical title was retained by each successive king as the conflict between these two divisions of the Empire continues as is described in this chapter.

The expression "king of the South" and 'king of the North" were so given to the rulers of these kingdoms because of their location from Palestine. The land of Palestine is the Spiritual center of the world, and may easily be regarded as the center of the world geographically, this is especially true so far as the events of Bible prophecy are concerned.

AN UNSUCCESSFUL AGREEMENT

The words of verse 6 reveal a very important and interesting event which was so very exactly described in this prophecy that history could not be more clearly written than was the prophecy. "And in the end of years they shall join themselves together; for the king's daughter of the south shall come to the king of the north to make an agreement: but she shall not retain the power of the arm; neither shall he stand, nor his arm: but she shall be given up, and they that brought her, and he that begot her, and he that strengthened her in these times."

This verse takes us forward in history to about 250 B. C. It shows an effort which was made between the ruler of Egypt, Ptolemy II ,Philadelphus and the ruler of Syria, Seleucas II. or the king of the south and the king of the north to make a treaty of peace between the two kingdoms.

This alliance between them was affected by the marriage of the daughter of the king of the south or Egypt to the king of the north or Syria. In order to bring this about the king of the north agreed to divorce his wife and marry the Egyptian Princess agreeing further that any child born to the Egyptian Princess would be heir to his kingdom. This was a deceitful plot and was not carried out; when the king of the south died the king of the north called back his former wife, and the Egyptian Princess was poisoned. Then, contrary to his promise of placing the child of the Egyptian Princess on the throne he placed the son of his first wife on the throne thus fulfilling the prophecy of verse 6. (See page 1452 Columbia Ency.).

THIS DEED REVENGED

Verses 7 and 8, "But out of a branch of her roots shall one stand up in his estate, which shall come with an army, and shall enter into the fortress of the king of the north and shall deal against them and shall prevail: And shall also carry captive into Egypt their

gods, with their princes, and with their precious vessels of silver and gold; and he shall continue more years than the king of the north."

These verses reveal the retaliation of the king of the south upon the king of the north, for the deceit and evil he had done by breaking the treaty and slaying the Egyptian Princess.

When the brother of the Egyptian Princess who was slain by the king of the north ascended the throne Egypt he immediately sought revenge for the death of his sister. History once again shows how exactly the prophecy of verses 7 and 8 was fulfilled by the king or Egypt, he did avenge his sister's death in the very manner described in this text, conquered Syria, carried many captives into Egypt, and brought again the Egyptian gods of silver and gold which Cambyses had taken out of Egypt many years before thus fulfilling the entire prophecies of these verses. This Egyptian king who did the things spoken of in these verses was, Ptolemy, III Euergetes. (See page 1452 and 1601, Columbia Ency.).

THE CONFLICT CONTINUES

Verses nine and ten give us a detailed description of the continuation of the conflict between the king of the north and south. Verses eleven and twelve show another victory won by the king of the south and the resultant condition which has so often manifested itself in the life of great conquerors, his heart was lifted up, he destroyed many thousands yet he was not made strong by this. How much we have seen the like things presented by some of the great Dictators of recent years.

In verse 13 we find the king of the north with a greater army than before attacking the king of the south, this time as is foretold in verse 14 we find some of the wicked Jews, (Robbers of thy people) aligning themselves with the king of the north hoping to secure certain selfish advantaegs.

Verse 15, tells of the conflict and of

the resulting victory of the king of the north and his invasion of the land of Palestine as is described in verse 13.

Verse 17, "He shall also set his face to enter with the strength of his whole kingdom, and upright ones with him; thus shall he do: and he shall give him the daughter of women, corrupting her: but she shall not stand on his side neither be for him."

The struggle is prolonged and another wicked plot is foretold in this verse; again a woman and her virtue is used in seeking to accomplish the desired treaty. The king of the north is determined to gain complete control of Egypt or the king of the south and in order to accomplish this he, Antiochus, king of Syria, gave his beautiful daughter Cleopatra, (the daughter of wcmen, so-called because of her great beauty- to be the wife of Ptolemy, V, king of Egypt. She was so given to be a spy for him in the Egyptian courts and to cause Egypt to fall into his hands

Let us note how fully the prophecy contained in the latter part of verse 17 was fulfilled; the text says, "She shall not stand on his side, neither be for him." This was what happened, when she was married to Ptolemy in Egypt she turned against the purposes of her father. History reveals that Antiochus, her father was at war with Rome and Ptolemy and Cleopatra sided with Rome against her own father thus bringing about the defeat of Antiochus.

Verse 18, "After this he shall turn his face unto the isles, and shall take many." This is speaking yet of Antiochus who had been defeated by a Roman General, (Lucius Scipio). In verse 19, "Then shall he turn his face toward the port of his own land; but he shall stumble and fall and not be found." Here history again tells us, in his effort to raise the indemnity required by the Romans at his defeat Antiochus plundered a heathen temple to secure its treasures and was killed by it's enraged worshippers thus ful-

filling the prophecy of the latter part of verse 19, "he shall stumble and fall, and not be found."

As we study verse 20 we notice, 'Then shall stand up in his estate a raiser of taxes in the glory of the kingdom: but within few days he shall be destroyed, neither in anger, nor in battle."

This was fulfilled in Selecus Philopater, (187,-176 B. C.) he had an evil reputation because of the severe taxes exacted especially of the Jews who were under his dominion. He was poisoned by Heliodorus, his tax collector. Thus he was slain neither in anger nor in battle.

Beginning with verse 21 and through the following several verses we again study the prophetic statements concerning Antiochus, IV, Epiphanes who we have already spoken of in detail in the study of the ighth chapter.

For the benefit of those who did not receive the copy of the 'Gospel Voice' which gave the detailed lesson concerning this "vile person" of Dan. 11:21-26, we briefly review the events connected with these prophetic verses: History again proves itself of value in a study of the Bible and we find Antiochus IV, Epiphanes as the successor of the person spoken of in verse 20, "the raiser of taxes." We note from the historical facts the things this "vile person" did; (please read Dan. 8:8-13) and now we quote from the August issue of 'Gospel Voice' page nine, "Antiochus IV, Epiphanes, Epimanes, "The madman" eighth king of the Sleucuid dynasty on the Syrian throne was a tyrant oppressor of the Jews, his wicked deeds are described by the following: "the book of the Macabees, various Bible history writers, by secular history and last but not least by prophetic vision to Daniel.

His deeds were prominent; wickedness, blasphemy and sacrilege were the ambitions of his life and rule.

Now let us note, he ascended the Syrian throne, thus fulfilling the prophetic phrase, out of one of the four divisions of the Greecian kingdom would come this little horn, so, then we have him positively located as to his rise. Now we shall study some of the things he was to do, he was to wax great toward the pleasant land (Palestine). Thus we find once again, the place of importance Palestine holds in the fulfillment of Bible prophecy; magnify himself to the prince of the host; by him the daily sacrifice would be taken away, cast some of the host to the ground; cast down the truth, his power was to be mighty.

These things were all fulfilled by Antiochus IV, Epiphanes. The first thing we call attention to is this, his waxing great toward the pleasant land; he conquered Jerusalem, took away the Jews daily sacrifice, took complete posession of the Temple and magnified himself as the prince of the host, offered a sow on the altar instead of the Jewish offering, sprinkled the broth over the Temple instead of sprinkling blood, thus corrupting it, changed the Feast of the Tabernacle to the feast of Bacchue, auctioned off the Priesthood, stopped all true worship and instituted idol worship, devastated the whole land and city, massacred one hundred thousand Jews and came suddenly to an end as was prophecied."

Some one has asked, 'where these things that, which Jesus spoke about in Matt. 24: when he spoke of the 'Daily sacrifice being taken away and and the abomination of desolation set up?' No, the deeds of Antiochus IV, Epiphanes were the deeds of the type of the Anti-Christ, while the things Jesus referred to will be accomplished by the Anti-Christ himself.

Until a later lesson when we shall give special thought and discussion to those events we say, may we ever have a new and greater vision of the Bible truths concerning the closing days of this glorious Gospel dispensation, Redemption of the body and the coming of Jesus our Savior, King of Kings and Lord of Lords.
