September Program:

Franciscan Desert Rose presented by Connie Murphy



Desert Rose was first produced by Gladding, McBean & Company in 1941. Charles Gladding began his career in Chicago around 1874, moved to New York, and then joined Peter McBean in California creating Gladding, McBean & company. Desert Rose was considered Urbanware, a style of folk pottery with southern California influence. The bright pink and green pattern on a cream background gave it a rustic charm that became extremely popular. Overall, they produced over 200 individual pieces.



Then because of increasing cost to produce, it was sold in 1984 to an English company, Josiah Wedgwood and Sons Ltd., and production was moved to England. Its production was again moved in 2000 to China. Collectors can easily identify older pieces by their scalloped edge designs and most pieces made in California were marked made in USA.

Connie began her collection with a friend and eventually bought her collection. She also has pieces from Madeline Willoughby's collection.
