

2nd Sunday of Lent (Year A) Sunday 5 March 2023

Just as we always hear the story of Jesus' testing in the Wilderness on the first Sunday of Lent, so we hear of His Transfiguration on the second. All three of the synoptic Gospels link the Transfiguration with the warning of Jesus to His disciples that He was destined to suffer in Jerusalem, and that those who would be His disciples must 'take up their cross and follow Him.'

In the wilderness Jesus came to terms with the limits of His humanity and committed His trust in the Loving presence of God to be with Him for all of His life's journey- whatever this might entail. This week a mountain is the setting for the continuing journey into discipleship. Through salvation history the mountains were places of sacred encounters with God.

Jesus brings Peter, James and John up a mountain to be alone in prayer. In that prayerful moment between Himself and His Father, He is transfigured. His appearance is dramatically altered as was Moses' appearance when he received the commandments from God. Elijah and Moses - key figures of salvation history representing the Law and the Prophets- appear and enter into dialogue with Jesus, the One sent to bring God's Promise to His people to fulfilment.

The disciples are embraced in that experience of relationship, love and peace. The voice of God reaffirms for them the identity of Jesus and calls for a response from them -to open their hearts and "Listen to Him!" as they continue their journey with Jesus. Peter, enraptured by the experience wanted to remain on the mountain of glory but that was not the point of the experience nor the way of discipleship. Jesus directs them down from the mountain because He knows that He, with them, still has His Father's work to complete: to bring the Good News to all people.

Like Jesus and His companions, we too need the occasional glimpses of glory. Perhaps for us this happens through perceiving the love of God shining through the kindness and trustful love of another; it might come in quiet times away in prayer, reflection and stillness when we experience Gods presence within us and in the beauty of creation around us. But we can't stay on the "mountain" in devotional solitude forever.

We can't love God unless we love our neighbour. Sooner or later we must come down from the mountain and continue the Way of Jesus: sharing the joys as well as the challenges of life and reflecting God's love for all in practical ways in families, neighbours and those who challenge us; those who are abandoned, suffering, poor and overlooked in our world.

If we were discouraged by the challenge of last Sunday's wilderness Gospel, then we might be reassured by the vision of Jesus' glory in today's.

And so we continue as disciples encouraged and mindful that, in reality, God also is not confined to mountains and shrines but travels with us and never leaves us.

"He has established Himself upon a mountain so he has no work to do. One should be in the market

place while still working with true Reality." (Sahl)

Praying the Ecological Examen

This <u>Ignation Ecological Examen</u> is a tool for prayer, reflection and action to deepen our call to care for creation and the most vulnerable. **1. I give thanks to God for creation and for being wonderfully made.** *Where did I feel God's presence in creation today?*

2. I ask for the grace to see creation as God does – in all its splendour and suffering.

Do I see the beauty of creation and hear the cries of the earth and the poor?

3. I ask for the grace to look closely to see how my life choices impact creation and the poor and vulnerable.

What challenges or joys do I experience as I recall my care for creation? How can I turn away from a throwaway culture and instead stand in solidarity with creation and the poor?

4. I ask for the grace of conversion towards ecological justice and reconciliation.

Where have I fallen short in caring for creation and my brothers and sisters? How do I ask for a conversion of heart?

5. I ask for the grace to reconcile my relationship with God, creation and humanity, and to stand in solidarity through my actions.

How can I repair my relationship with creation and make choices consistent with my desire for reconciliation with creation?

6. I offer a closing prayer for the earth and the vulnerable in our society.

Offer the prayer that's in your heart or perhaps pray Pope Francis' <u>Prayer for Our Earth</u>

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A Prayer for Our Earth All-powerful God, you are present in the whole universe and in the smallest of your creatures. You embrace with your tenderness all that

You embrace w exists.

Pour out upon us the power of your love, that we may protect life and beauty. Fill us with peace, that we may live as brothers and sisters, harming no one.

O God of the poor, help us to rescue the abandoned and forgotten of this earth, so precious in your eyes.

Bring healing to our lives, that we may protect the world and not prey on it, that we may sow beauty, not pollution and destruction.

Touch the hearts of those who look only for gain at the expense of the poor and the earth. Teach us to discover the worth of each thing, to be filled with awe and contemplation, to recognize that we are profoundly united with every creature as we journey towards your infinite light. We thank you for being with us each day. Encourage us, we pray, in our struggle for justice, love and peace. Pope Francis, Laudato Si'

Lenten Regulations

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and abstinence from meat.

On all other Fridays, except solemnities, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following:

- (a) **Prayer:** e.g., Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary; or in other ways.
- (b) Self Denial: e.g., not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country or elsewhere; or in other ways. Project compassion is a major means of expressing our self-denial in Australia.
- (c) **Helping Others:** e.g., special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or over-burdened; or in other ways.
- * All who have completed their 18th year and have not yet begun their 60th year are bound to fast. All who have completed their 14th year are bound to abstain. (Canon 1252)
- * The Season of Lent is a time of penance. During Lent the faithful are exhorted to devote themselves in a special manner to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, and to deny themselves.
- * Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled between Ash Wednesday, 22 February 2023 and Trinity Sunday 4 June 2023 unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time during the year.
- * The wonderful gift of the Lord's merciful love is offered in a special way in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Lent is a most appropriate time to receive this Sacrament. All faithful who have reached the age of discretion are bound faithfully to confess their grave sins at least once a year.
