Meet the newest member of OLSS, Cupcake!

Cupcake is a 3½ month old Yorkie Terrier who is

excited to be here and begin her job as a Pet Therapy Dog. She goes into the classrooms at scheduled reading times, and encourages students to read aloud, work on vocabulary, and develop confidence in reading. Cupcake also works in the office. When students come to visit with Mrs. Bartsch, they also get a chance to sit with Cupcake and explain their visit. Cupcake has helped a few students feel less anxious about their day and go back to class feeling better.

Cupcake is up to date on her vaccinations, and is in training for therapy sessions. The students and Cupcake interact on an academic level, and Cupcake even has her own uniform. She makes sure everyone wears the proper uniform, especially on Mass day.

Cupcake's job at OLSS is to help students, staff, and others feel relaxed and engaged in school. As she completes each training period, Cupcake will become more involved with the students. Why a dog?

Research has shown children who have difficulty relating to other children and adults have been observed to behave differently with pets. They demonstrate greater self-confidence, more consistent awareness of the pet's needs, and the ability to take initiative to satisfy the pet – they have made contact! Sometimes this improves their ability to transfer these behaviors to people. With encouragement and familiarity, many students have been calmed and some of the behaviors have been markedly modified.
