4th Sunday Ordinary Time

Year C Luke 2:22-40



When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord. Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted -and you yourself a sword will pierce- so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem. When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him."

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

4th Sunday Ordinary Time

Year C Luke 2:22-4

"Now I have seen it all!" But not really! It's wise not to say that (I'm told), because the minute you do, then surprise! Who would ever have thought we'd see some of the things we have seen in modern times? We're tempted to say this whenever we're discouraged over some public scandal, or maybe when some 'karmic' come-uppance visits an enemy. But ever-faithful Simeon is announcing with joy a similar expression to this, in our gospel today, when he proclaims that he has seen it all, ('My eyes have seen the glory' Luke 2:30). He has seen the coming of the Lord (An Infant Messiah, but messiah all the same). What Simeon and Anna have been waiting, and waiting for, has now come to pass. Simeon knew through the Holy Spirit, that his life's call was to wait and watch in the Temple for the Lord to come. Day in and day out, he continued to show up and perform the simple, ordinary duties of religious observances/prayers. And then one day, it happens! St Joseph and the Blessed Mother enter the Temple to offer their customary purifications and thanksgiving sacrifices, and Simeon personally greets his Messiah! The prophetess Anna is also aware of God's presence in the person of Jesus, and she expresses grateful relief to have witnessed God's fulfillment of saving promises, just as Simeon does. What a day! Imagine the sense of completion-Mission Accomplished! Simeon certainly expresses such a self-congratulatory sentiment in his sung canticle: "Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word...." Like the joyful satisfaction felt when you get to see a plan all come together in the end, Simeon is blessed to know his life's purpose has been achieved!

I imagine we have all had the little joys of completing a project and relishing the sense of the resolution at looking over the job finally done. Maybe like when the baker delivers the wedding cake successfully to the reception serving table, or when we finish reading the final paragraph of a great book and close the cover, that feeling of fulfillment brings such a sense of peace to our souls. Simeon and Anna receive such a consoling grace from God when all of their many prior 'uninteresting' days at the Temple pay off for them (how many times they trudged into the Temple to complete their tasks and show up for their prayers, and then on THAT particular day.....). Every Advent overwhelms me with a sense of gratitude that I live on this side of the history after Jesus' coming, but it deepens my appreciation for the millions of people who lived in anticipation of a Messiah. From Adam until Jesus' birth, the people lived on trust and the promise of God that the Christ would come. The prophets throughout the Old Testament kept that expectant fire of faith alive in the people's hearts and kept their eyes looking for signs of the Messiah's arrival. But not until Jesus' coming is that hope realized!

I recall that Jesus commends more greatly, the faith of those who have not seen, or do not have to see the Messiah, to believe and trust God. Jesus reminded Thomas of this when saying, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed" (John 20:29) And Peter commends such 'living hope', in 1 Peter 1:8 when he says, "even though you do not see him now, yet believe in him, you rejoice with an indescribable joy..." What deep trust they had!

In such a 'results-oriented' and 'same-day delivery' society such as what we live in, it may be hard to understand the long-suffering faith of all those people who knew of a prophecy, yet never saw any glimpse of signs indicating its fulfillment. That is faith ("We walk by faith, not by sight" 2 Cor 5:7) Many a saint in our Catholic tradition (notably the friends St John of the Cross & St Teresa Avila) have counselled us against seeking demonstrative signs or fulfilling proofs (another word for fulfillment could be 'gratification'--Oh!) They are reminding us to live uprightly and according to God's direction, without needing spectacular or convincing visions.

Simeon and Anna share lives of prayerful attention and dutiful service with us. They are aware of God acting in the world every day, and they conduct their duties with engaged hearts and devotion to living 'intentionally', alert to God's presence in the simplest of jobs/tasks. I like how Advent doesn't 'end' our year, it only marks its beginning. After four weeks of special preparation, Christ is born. But then what do we do with the other 48 weeks of the year? We do the same thing that we did before, except after Christ' birth we do it in a 'transfigured' way, with an even greater focus and intention. By our Church Calendar, showing us the endgame at the beginning, it strengthens us wisely, to accept/embrace especially the most ordinary and simple things of our lives as expressions of our 'living out' our hope and trust in God. We can take up what others call insignificant or unimportant and eagerly apply ourselves to it, for we work for what is unseen and only hinted at in our day to day occupations. Jesus, our expectation of Him and our trust in His presence, then, now and to come, transfigure everything for us. May we daily attend to the Temple sanctuary of our hearts and eagerly work at our business, whatever it may be, with the same hope and joy as Simeon and Anna! Peace, Fr Brian
