Social Security cards or ITIN documentation for all.

Income documents – Forms W2, SSA 1099, 1099R, 1099G, 1099INT, 1099DIV and any other 1099 forms, self-employment income along with any other income documents you may have.

Brokerage statements – sale of stocks or bonds.

Healthcare – Form 1095 A, B, or C

Bank check for direct deposit/debit refund/balance due.

Receipts for all deductions to itemize.

Records of federal and state taxes paid.

Educational expenses – Form 1098-T and expense receipts.

The U.S. Census Bureau is already looking for job applicants to work the 2020 Census. We are currently hiring through May of 2020 for temporary assignments, most lasting 8-10 weeks

A Census Population and Housing is taken in the United States every 10 years. A Decennial Census is required by the U. S. Constitution to determine the number of seats each state will have in the House of Representatives for each state.

Census positions provide the perfect opportunity to earn extra income while helping your community. The results of the 2020 Census will help determine your state's representation in Congress, as well as how certain funds are spent for schools, hospitals, roads, and more. This is your chance to play a part in history and help ensure everyone in your community is counted!

In addition to supporting your community, census jobs offer great pay every week, flexible hours, and paid training. Applying is easy. Go to <https://2020census.gov/jobs> to learn more, then click on Apply Now. Potential applicants can also call 1-855-JOB-2020 (562-2020) or use the Federal Relay Service at 800-877-8339 for TTY/ASCII to learn more or for assistance.

People can apply for 2020 Census work if they are at least 18 years old, a U. S. Citizen, and if they have a valid Social Security number and email address. Males born after December 31, 1959, must also be registered with the Selective Service System or have a qualifying exemption. As part of the application process, applicants will be asked questions related to their education, work, and other experiences.

Potential employees must pass a criminal background check and review of criminal records (including fingerprinting). Once these steps are completed, potential employees will receive information about paid training.

Employees should have access to a vehicle and a valid driver's license, unless public transportation is readily available. Employees should also have access to an Internet-connected computer (to complete the training process).

Work schedules depend on individual positions. Generally, hours for field positions are flexible. Some positions require work during the day and other positions require evening and weekend work interviewing the public. In addition, supervisory positions require employees to be available for certain day, evening, and/or weekend shifts. The Census Bureau is committed to hiring Census Workers to work in their own communities.



Employees are paid weekly and can expect to receive their first paycheck approximately 10-14 days after their first day of work. Field employees will be reimbursed for authorized work expenses, mileage while conducting the 2020 Census work.

Morrow County pay rate is \$16-\$17.50 per hour.

Emergency Food Pantry

Never leave your cupboards bare. Keep a variety of nutritious foods on hand for quick, easy, economical meals when weather, natural disaster or illness keeps you at home. Purchase several foods from each group. Use or replace items every 6 months.

Meat and Meat Substitutes

Tuna fish, canned chicken, beef stew, macaroni & cheese, spaghetti and meatballs, baked beans, hearty or chunky soups, condensed soups (split pea or minestrone), peanut butter.

Cereals, Breads, Pasta

Hot cereal, cold cereal, rice, noodles, spaghetti, corn muffin mix, whole wheat crackers, sesame bread sticks, oatmeal cookies.

Fruit and Vegetables

Canned vegetables (green beans, spinach, corn, peas, beets, carrots, mixed vegetables): Canned fruit (apricots, peaches, pears, applesauce, plums, raisins, grapefruit): fruit, tomato, and vegetable juice, bean salad, beets.

Milk and Milk Products

Non-fat dried or evaporated milk. Pasteurized process cheese spread.

Other Foods

Instant soups, coffee or tea, hot chocolate mix, Jam or jelly, vegetable oil, bottled salad dressing, jello, instant pudding mix.
