




November 18, 2018 ThirtyThird Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark 13:24-32

Dear St. Pius X and St. Anthony Church Family,

Our gospel raises the question, "Is it about over, or just beginning?" A favorite poet of mine, TS Eliot, says in the Four Quartets, "In my end is my beginning", (no.2-East Coker). Or if you are an Adele music fan, she sings, "This is the end, Hold your breath and count to ten...", but then she goes on to chant, "Skyfall is where we start...... Where worlds collide and days are dark." So what about today's gospel? Is the gospel preparing for the end, or just the beginning? The gospel speaks of skys falling, suns darkening, and heavenly powers shaking, as an end and a beginning. Too often late night televangelists whip up fear among people, referring to the 'end of days'. I have to ask, "WHY, and for what purpose do they create fear?" If it is to wake us up and keep us focused on living and doing today what we should be doing, then good. But often this fanning of fear only creates a culture of conspiracy, around a 'popularitypersonality cult' for someone predicting grand events, not much different from Mrs Cleo, the psychic fortune-teller! Maybe its political of them to sell an agenda or a product, or it may be simply pride for them to draw a following and dominate the social discussion. I still remember my youthful thrill in being taught by a late night evangelist that Ronald Reagan was the antichrist (because the beast's number was 666-Revelation 13:8). The evangelist justified that in his mind, because Ronald (6 letters) Wilson (6 letters) Reagan (& 6 letters), was president, then that meant he was the antichrist. Of course, not being familiar enough with the Bible, I fell for the con. Reader Beware: some prophets intentionally mislead or are themselves mistaken in their messages. Today, we see so much of this negative crowd frenzy and the whipping up of fanaticism. There is a lot of political or commercial fiction thought up and passed around facebook, twitter and every other media new platform that pops up every day. But, None of this is new. As Christians, we hear Jesus reminding us to live humbly and keep faith. He says, "Many false prophets will arise and deceive many; and because of evildoing, the love of many will grow cold. But the one who perseveres to the end will be saved "(Matthew 24:11-13). Jesus is clear, "As for that day or hour, no one knows" (Mark 13:32). So keep the faith you know and stay close to Jesus!

But, how do we tell a false from a true prophet? Jesus, who always brings the Good News, delivers a reliable guide to measure the authenticity of a prophet, when he says in Matthew 7:20, "By their fruits you will know them," That is why I love the image he delivers today's gospel even with the gloom and pessimism. Jesus offers the lesson of the fig tree. What is that? He says, 'When its branch becomes tender and sprouts leaves, you know that summer is near." (Mark 13:28) I love that he is using an <u>image of new life</u>. Jesus is hope! He uses an example of new life. From a tender shoot grows out new stems and leaves (that will eventually flower and fruit) from the cold, harsh, and dark of winter. He could have just as easily, used an image of dying branches and shriveling leaves to indicate a true end, but he refers to *fresh green new shoots*. Jesus anticipates redemption, and the progress of a new beginning, even from a barren branch.

How do we react to signs of decline, disruption and decomposition around us? Do we quit and give up? Or do we replant, waiting and watching for new life? Or, most faithfully and nobly of all, do we even factor in the inevitable decay (like a fertilizer) and continue planning and planting until our end. For example, we can stage our planting in a series of gardens over the season, starting with early spring greens, onions and asparagus, and then later plant a garden of peppers, tomatoes, beans etc... and as the season cycles even prepare a winter box for hardy vegetables to manage the unfriendly growing environment of winter. So, do we work through adversities, protecting what is salvageable and preparing for harsher times if they come? We do live in a messed up world of cruelty and death. How do we respond? Do we just chameleon into the background, or do we stand differently as lights in the darkness and as green shoots on dry barren branches? Jesus says, "When these things begin to happen, stand up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."(Luke 21:28) Also, the Jewish Talmud tells the story, "If you have a sapling in your hand and people tell you that the Messiah has come, plant the sapling and then go and greet him" (Version B, R.Natan-chapter 31).
