

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

Parish Council: Meets on the Monday evening after the third Sunday of the month.

Holy Name Society: Meets on the Monday evening after the second Sunday of the month. President, Joseph Chimenti

THE LORD IS ALWAYS WITH US

The promises God made are fulfilled in Christ Jesus. God promised David, "I will raise up your heir after you...I will be a father



to him, and he shall be a son to me" (2 Samuel 7:12-14). That promise is fulfilled when the Blessed Virgin Mary betrothed to Joseph of the house of David, accepts her role as a woman who will bear the Son of God. In turn, Jesus fulfills the promise that Paul calls "the

mystery kept secret for long ages" (Romans 16:25), the salvation of the whole world. Jesus is the full revelation of God's promise of redemption.

Quite reasonably, Mary questioned the angel Gabriel ("How can this be?" [Luke 1:34]) when he first told her the incredible news. But once she learned of her cousin's unlikely pregnancy, she agreed to bear the Son of God. The angel had assured her—and demonstrated to her-that "nothing will be impossible for God" (1:37). Let these six words reassure us when we face those times in our lives when despair and hopelessness seem unavoidable. For the God whose Son was born into this world, who raised Him up from the dead, who offers salvation to the whole of humanity, truly nothing is impossible.

Twice in today's reading we hear the familiar phrase, "The Lord is with you." Nathan says it to David, then Gabriel says it to Mary. Quite clearly, the Lord was with both of them. But not for nothing are we addressed frequently during Mass, "The Lord be with you." The presence of the Lord is within and among

and commit ourselves to living it out, the Lord is with us as well.


