



Be Careful What You Click: WannaCry Ransomware

WannaCry is the new ransomware that started hitting several computers last Friday (May 12, 2017). Those who were infected found their computers locked, with hackers demanding a \$300 ransom to unlock the device and its files.

WannaCry is the worst and most widespread pieces of malware that we've ever seen. This ransomware is going through the internet looking for vulnerable computers. That means you don't even have to click a phishing email to get infected.

Security updates from Microsoft are your best protection, so make sure that all your devices are up to date on all updates from MS and any antivirus protection you may have.

The scariest part of this ransomware is that it's still spreading, pay attention to emails with attachments or links; even if the message is coming from someone you know, double-check the email address it's coming from and be on the lookout for any odd wording or attachments. When in doubt, send a separate message to the person to ask them if they did indeed send you an email that requires you to download the attachment.
