A ceremony was held at the Food and Agricultural Organization of the United Nations Representation office in Islamabad to mark the conclusion of the project "Assistance to the Recovery and Development of Agricultural Economy in FATA". The project was funded by the Government of Japan. The closing ceremony was attended by the Ambassador of Japan, H.E. Mr. Takashi Kurai, Chief Representative of JICA Pakistan, Mr. Yasuhiro Tojo, top officials from development agencies and representatives of the government of Pakistan.Farmer households in Khyber and Kurram agencies of FATA have received assistance from the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) with the help of Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) to rebuild their lives as they continue to return to their homes after years of displacement.

77,200 households (33,143 in Khyber and 44,057 in Kurram agency) of FATA received this assistance which helped the returning small holder farmers to produce food and earn income for their families. Speaking on the occasion, Mr. Takashi Kurai, Ambassador of Japan to Pakistan said "We had supported recovery of FATA including rehabilitation of community infrastructure. In addition to these assistant to provide these basic services, the recovery of livelihood of returnees is very important for

stable lives of returnees and stable return of TDPs and this project is a part of these assistance. Japan will continue assisting people of Pakistan including returnees in FATA and TDPs to keep peace in this country."

FRANCE PROVIDES 165 MILLION EUROS (19.6 BILLION PKR) SOFT LOAN FOR THE POWER TRANSMISSION ENHANCEMENT INVESTMENT PROGRAM AND FOR THE MANGLA POWER PLANT REHABILITATION PROJECT

On July 20th, 2017, in the presence of Honorable Senator Ishaq DAR, Minister for Finance, Mr. Shahid MAHMOOD, Secretary of Economic Affairs Division (EAD), H.E. Mrs Martine DORANCE, Ambassador of France, and Mr. Jacky AMPROU, Country Director of the French Agency for Development (AFD), signed two Credit Facility Agreements for a total amount of 165 million euros.

75 million euros have been allocated to the Power Transmission Enhancement Investment Program implemented by the National Transmission & Despatch Company (NTDC) to improve energy supply and security by reducing bottlenecks and losses of the transmission system.

90 million euros have been allocated to the Mangla Power Plant Rehabilitation Project implemented by WAPDA to upgrade the plant and increase its capacity from 1,000MW to 1,310MW. These programs will contribute to the Government of Pakistan's strategy to provide a more reliable and secure energy sector.

For the last ten years, France through the French Agency for Development has provided more than 600 million euros to Pakistan to solve the energy crisis and to fight climate change through investments in low-carbon-emission energy generation in line with COP21 Paris agreement approved by the Parliament of Pakistan in November 2016.

The event later showcased a Danish documentary "There Will Be Water" produced by Copenhagen Film Company. It gave the audience inspirational ideas to tackle the world's chronic shortage of fresh water without the use of fossil fuels.

13th October: International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction!

13th October, the International Day for Disaster Reduction, promotes global risk-awareness and disaster reduction. This year, the focus is on the Sendai Framework's Target B, which aims at reducing the number of people affected by disasters by the year 2030.

Some of the biggest challenges of this century are rapid population growth, high levels of rural-urban migration and diminishing natural resources.

Every year, millions of people are displaced by disasters. To reduce such risks, disaster displacement planning needs to be integrated into national and regional strategies. We also need to address the protection needs of people displaced by disaster and promote durable solutions to displacement, such as migration and relocation with dignity.

Currently, Germany chairs the Platform on Disaster Displacement. In Pakistan, the German government supports initiatives which help in reducing the risks to natural disasters. For example; within the scope of the German-Pakistani Project 'Geohazard Assessment in Northern Pakistan (GANP)' (2009-2015), a Risk Exposure Assessment (REA) has been carried out for the Districts of Mansehra and Torghar, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province. The objective of this study was to quantify the endangered population and selected infrastructural elements at risk from landslide hazards, and draft recommendations. On behalf of the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), this work is being carried out under the project "Promoting Resilience of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Against Natural Disaster Impacts", jointly implemented by the Federal Institute for Geosciences and Natural Resources (BGR) and the Provincial Disaster Management Authority of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (PDMA KP).

Germany will continue to support its partner countries through bi- and multi-lateral development projects in strengthening capacities for disaster risk reduction at all levels.
