Professional Development Teacher Support

This year Sunrise formed a Teacher Professional Development fund. Our goal is to offset the expenses for teachers who participate in workshops, classes, seminars, and training throughout the year. For example, the American Montessori Society (AMS) holds large scale teacher training events throughout the country and their biggest event typically is in March each year. For staff who participate, the fund would cover their entrance fees (this was \$385 per participant in 2023), travel expenses, and lodging. Classroom Student Communication Updates

On Visiting Day, all families received a folder that included information about Student Communication Updates and Parent Conferences. You will receive your first update the week of October 9th. Updates will provide you with information on how your child is doing within the classroom environment. Just a reminder, please send an email confirmation back to your child's teacher after you receive your report. The teachers want to make sure you have received the report and they are happy to answer any questions you may have. The updates are an excellent communication tool for parents and teachers to remain connected about your child throughout the school year.

Holidays in the Classroom – What to Expect

At Sunrise we recognize the importance of family traditions and honor various cultural celebrations throughout the year. During the fall season in the Montessori classroom, the students will be scrubbing pumpkins and gourds, cutting open a pumpkin to learn the parts of the pumpkin, making push-pin pumpkins or jack-o-lanterns, pumpkin pounding, reading fun seasonal stories and much more.

During the upcoming Halloween holiday, we discourage students from wearing any Halloween costumes or accessories during school hours for Halloween (even though this holiday is celebrated by many families); it is a great event for families to participate in together at home and/or out in their community. Outdoor Clothing

As the season changes, your child's outdoor clothing and footwear should as well. Please remember to send a jacket as appropriate for the season. The children should always wear appropriate closed shoes (no toes or heels exposed) for safety reasons.

Food Allergy Reminder

As a reminder, with current student allergies, please do not send in snack or lunch food items containing peanuts or tree nuts. However, if your child enjoys almonds, macadamia, and walnuts these are currently safe to have in our program.

Plan Ahead for Student Photo Day – Tuesday November 7 - with Vicario Studios

For the past several years, Sunrise schedules both individual and classroom group portraits with Vicario Studios. Paul Vicario's studio is located right next to our school in the Moseley Complex and the students often greet Mr. Vicario from the playground. You may choose to have your child participate in the individual and the classroom group photos, and an order form envelope from the studio will be sent home ahead of time for you to place your order.

On the morning of the photos (around 9am), the students walk over to the studio (one classroom at a time) with their teachers until their photos are completed. This takes about 30-40 minutes per classroom. If you have any questions or comments, please reach out to me.

Extended Day Program


Just a reminder – the extended day option (morning or afternoon) is available to all students. Join in on the fun either on a set schedule or on an occasional basis.



Classroom A Newsletter September 2023

Dear Classroom A families,

It has been a wonderful start to the school year and we are excited to jump into fall! The children have been so excited to get to know each other in the classroom and we certainly have an amazing group of students. Everyone is settling into the routines of the school day, working and playing together! At circle time each morning, we say "good morning", talk about the calendar, and learn the 7 days of the week and the months of the year. We also discuss the weather and temperature each day!



We began the school year by working together and learning the rules and expectations of the classroom. Our class continues to learn **Grace and Courtesy** lessons together and practice throughout the school day. The children who are returning Sunrise Montessori students have helped our new classmates learn and together we review practicing manners to show we care about one another.



An important part of the Montessori Curriculum is also the **Peace Curriculum**. We read the book *The Peace Rose* by Alicia Jewell together at circle and then talked about the different ways that we can find peace in our classroom, and home and in ourselves. Our Peace Rose is displayed on the Peace table of our classroom for children to access throughout the day. This tool introduces the skills of conflict resolution and guides children on how to use these skills at home, on the playground, and in the classroom.

We have also been busy this month learning about the changing seasons and we talked about the Autumnal Equinox on September 22nd! In **Science**, the children enjoyed sharing many of the different and exciting activities that happen during the fall. We explored the parts of the apple and at circle time we discovered what's inside an apple! We also learned about the botany cabinet and the various shapes of different leaves.









In **Geography**, our classroom has been exploring where we live. Heading into next month, our classroom will begin sharing "All About Me" to learn more about one another and where we are from and where we live. Stay tuned for more info!

During **Kindergarten Class** we will be working on extensions of the lessons from the morning work cycle and access, in more depth, the areas of the Montessori curriculum. This time is also an opportunity for Kindergarten students to work on and explore topics of their own interests.

This month in Kindergarten, we practiced reading with books from the Primary Phonics series Mac and Tab and Al. We wrote about what we want to learn in Kindergarten and completed a sight word challenge!





This month, the children were also excited to begin Pizza Fridays and storytelling with Gio the Giraffe.

We had a blast during Sensation Station and look forward to everything we will accomplish and learn as a community together this year!

Classroom B Newsletter September 2023

Hello Classroom B Parents,

Happy September, Happy Fall! The school year is off to a great start. As we welcome back our returning students and our new students, we wanted to share with you what we are learning this month. The month of September is filled with many transitions. Our mornings begin with greeting one another, then moving onto circle time. We are learning how to adapt to the environment as well as one another.

During circle time we learn about **Grace and Courtesy**. These lessons are given daily. Grace and Courtesy lessons are an essential part of our environment as they teach the children what it means to be polite and how to appropriately communicate one's feelings.

The teachers role model these lessons then invite the children to role model as well. A leader is chosen each day. Being a leader is a wonderful way to help the children gain confidence and model how to set a good example.

Group lessons are given each day in the morning and afternoon on how to properly use the materials. How to socially interact and how to move peacefully within our environment.

The month of September has been very busy as we focused our attention on body management along with social and emotional skills. The second and third year students are doing an amazing job helping the new students make a smooth transition in the classroom both socially and emotionally.

The Label Game

The label game helps the children to identify their name. This is also the process for how the children explore the classroom environment and select their work. It is not only a wonderful way to learn the spelling of their name and of their classmates, but it also allows them to learn to focus and be patient as they wait for their turn.



In **Cultural Studies** we learned about Rosh Hashanah, which is the Jewish New Year. The biblical name for this holiday is Yom Teruah. It is the first of the Jewish High Holy Days, as specified by Leviticus 23:23, that occurs in the late summer/early autumn of the Northern Hemisphere. A special thank you to Jacob's parents for sharing this special day by sending in a book, special honey and apples for all the children.





In the **Botany Area** the children are learning about the life cycle of an apple tree, the different types of apples, different colors and taste. The stages of the apple tree life cycle are - seed, seedling, tree, bud, flower and fruit.

The children enjoyed a botany lesson on the apple. We cut the apple in half and revealed the beautiful star pattern inside where the seeds are stored. The children were so excited by this discovery. Each child was able to explore, examine, smell and taste the fresh cut apples. We incorporated many new lessons into the environment to enhance their learning and knowledge of the apples and trees.







Lunchtime

The children are doing a great job in learning how to prepare for lunch independently. They are taking this time to eat, unwind and reflect on their day.

Ms. Emily and Ms. Jessica rotate reading stories before the lunch to help the children transition from playtime to lunchtime smoothly. After lunch the children clean up with help from the teachers then head over to their rest mats for a brief rest time to prepare for the afternoon work cycle. Please keep in mind when packing your child's lunch to include healthy foods like fresh fruits, veggies, protein, etc... that will provide them with energy to get through the busy day.

Kindergarten Class

In the Kindergarten program we are learning about the human body. Our focus this month is on learning about our Kindergarteners. We are making a booklet called "All about me". This booklet includes social, emotional and physical connections about ourselves. We are also learning to further develop the daily activities we work with in our environment. In the reading area we are working on phonetic words, reading, writing and comprehension. We are off to a great start in our Kindergarten program!
