

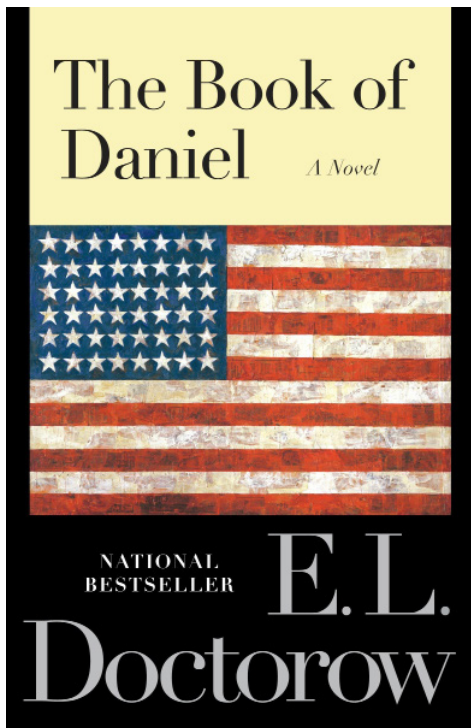
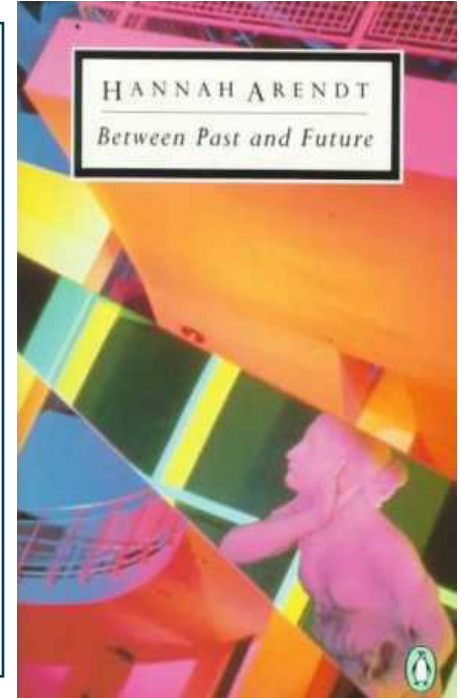
# Read. Discuss. Connect.

The chosen topic is: *American Politics and Community Today*

- What does a model American do?
- What responsibilities do Americans have to their communities and each other?

This theme engages with these questions and others regarding politics and the current state of civic thought, feeling, and participation.
