Henry Donald Hewitt, 80, of Sunrise Drive, Caro, passed away on Monday, April 17, 2006, at St. Mary's of Michigan in Saginaw. He was born on April 1, 1926 in Bad Axe. Henry was a World War II veteran serving in the U.S. Navy from February 1945 through July 1946 in the Sea of Japan aboard the USS LAPORTE.
