

# Retired Elkton Dentist, Harry Fox, Dies At 88

Dr. Harry J. Fox, 88, retired Elkton dentist and prominent civic leader, historian and outdoorsman, died Tuesday evening at Ingham Medical Hospital in Lansing.

He was born November 8, 1883 in Michigan.

Dr. Fox graduated from the University of Michigan dental school in 1908.

He and the former Vera Quinn were married in June, 1909. She preceded him in death in 1959.

Dr. Fox was a popular speaker at service club meetings and civic events. He had a keen recollection of local history and maintained a valuable collection of antique weapons. As a younger man he was an avid hunter.

He was among the founders of the original Elkton United Methodist Church and charter member of the Elkton Rotary Club.

Surviving are one son, Donald Fox, Okemos, Mich., and one daughter, Mrs. Margaret McLean, Mason, Mich., seven grandchildren and six great grandchildren.

Remains are at the Huron Memorial Chapel, Elkton.

Funeral services will be Saturday at 2 p.m. at the Elkton United Methodist Church. Rev. O. William Cooper will officiate with burial in the Colfax cemetery, Bad Axe.
