REMINDER ******THE SNOW IS COMING******

If you're new to Colonial Acres or have lived here through our winters you know when the snow is coming, be aware! Listen to the weather, if we'll be having more than 2 inches of snow the trucks will be plowing. Set your alarms to be up & ready to clean off your cars & move them after the plows have cleared your street. **DON'T** depend on hearing the horn from the truck, be up, bundled up, & ready to move your car.

Plowing begins early morning on Heritage Dr. & then all other streets. By 8:00 am the plows will be plowing parking & courtyard areas. Once your street is cleared move your cars to the cleared streets. Your cars can be moved back when parking spaces have been cleared. **DO NOT MOVE CARS BEFORE YOUR AREA GETS PLOWED**

Cars that are not moved will receive a warning ticket for violation of rules & towed if you still do not move your car by the 2nd pass of the truck. Wixom towing is contracted to tow if they get a phone call from us, you will be responsible for all towing & storage fees.

IF you cannot move your car, please ask a neighbor or make arrangements to park your car off Colonial Acres streets ahead of time.

There are several issues that continue to come up at Board Meetings that everyone needs to be aware of. We are all adults & should be able to follow some common-sense courtesies to make Colonial Acres a pleasant place for all to live.

- First, dog poop <u>again</u>. It has gotten better since we have two waste deposit stations.
 It seems though, when dog walkers get to open common areas, they think it's okay
 to leave their dog waste behind. The members who live next to these areas are left
 with all that waste to smell & step in. PLEASE, bend over & pick up your dog waste!
- Second, speeding continues to be a problem as we get more traffic passing thru our area. We're always discussing how to deal with this, come to a meeting & express your opinions. BUT, it isn't always the extra traffic who speed. Many of us ignore the limit, we've all seen our neighbors & friends speed past us. Let's start with all of us & all look down at our speedometer, make sure you're only going 15 mph. It's too dangerous for all the walkers, especially now that the icy wet weather has arrived.

Thank you all in advance for driving careful & keeping our streets safe for walkers

There have been many complaints about putting trash out on Sunday before 5pm. Your neighbors do not want to look at trash all day, especially on Sunday when many have visitors that day. Put your trash out in a container after 5pm on Sunday. Keep Colonial Acres looking nice!

WHAT IS THE FUTURE OF DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME?

Year-round change depends on a Federal vote.

Clocks in the United States **might** "fall back" for the final time this month if legislators vote to make daylight saving time permanent.

Several states have enacted legislation in support of never again switching the clocks an hour backward, according to the National Conference of State Legislatures.

Daylight saving time starts annually in the U.S. on the second Sunday in March, when clocks move ahead – or "spring forward" by an hour, and the period ends on November's first Sunday each year. Here's what to know about what could be in store for daylight saving time:

The idea was to conserve power and fuel by making daylight last longer. The U.S. adopted daylight saving time in 1918 but abolished it nationwide after the war, though it was allowed on a state-by-state basis.

When the Department of Transportation was founded in 1966, it was granted regulatory power over daylight saving time and time zones. Only Arizona, Hawaii and U.S. territories including Puerto Rico permanently observe <u>standard time</u>.


If the <u>Sunshine Protection Act of 2021</u> becomes law, the bill would make daylight saving time the new, permanent standard time as of Nov. 5, 2023. That means once clocks spring forward next March, they would not change in November of next year. The Senate <u>voted unanimously</u> to pass the bill on March 15. The bill now awaits a House vote.
