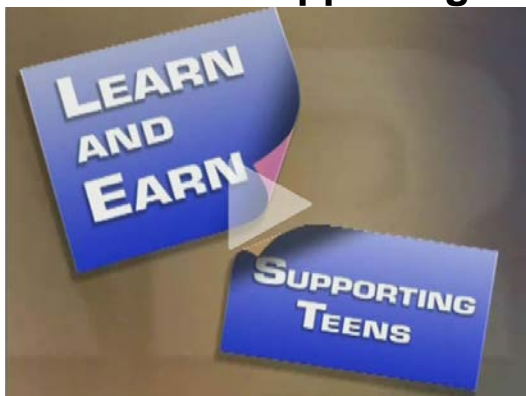

Learn and Earn: Supporting Teens



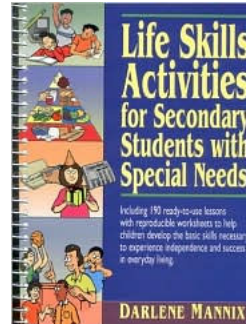
