FRIENDLY REMINDERS FOR ALL PARENTS:



* LUNCH BOXES/ NUT FREE ENVIRONMENT

Please let us know about your child's allergies and help us protect the children with allergies by making our environment PEANUT & NUT FREE. We ask you to carefully read the list of ingredients while packing a healthy snack for your child. Thank you!

If your son or daughter has any sort of allergy or needs us to administer medication of any kind, we need you to fill out a specific form that we can keep on file.

Restrictions:

- Absolutely no peanut butter, peanuts, nuts and chocolate:
- No seeds, candy, especially gum and hard candies, toffee and caramels
- Grapes should be sliced lengthwise
- Hard fruits and vegetables- shred or crop into pieces: and
- Fruits with pit e.g. cherries, peaches, etc. –remove stone

* INDOOR SHOES

Please make sure that your child brings a pair of indoor shoes provided exclusively for indoors. For safety, NONE OF THE FOLLOWING: Flip flops; open toed shoes/sandals; princess play shoes; black leather soled shoe.

*TOYS & OTHER ITEMS FROM HOME

Please do not allow your child to bring toys and other items from home into school. Children enjoy packing their school bags of items but these items are *very* distracting and lead to other children feeling left out. Therefore, it is appreciated if children can be asked to leave their favorites at home or in the car with the exception of show and tell days that will be informed by the teacher.

*DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP AT THE SCHOOLS

Holy Family Preschool & Educational Centre has established drop-off and pick-up sites at the schools. If, after school, a situation arises where a child does not show up at the pre-arranged pick-up spot within 10 minutes from the school dismissal time, staff are responsible for returning the other children to Holy Family Preschool & Educational Centre. If a child was expected to be picked up at the school and did not show, a phone call will be made to the school and to parents to determine the whereabouts of the child.



Parents should stress to their child's school that children enrolled in Holy Family Preschool & Educational Centre Out-of-school Care program can NOT stay at school or be kept after school for any reason.
