# The Fountain of Living Water



"For my people have committed two evils; they have forsaken me the fountain of living waters, and hewed them out cisterns, broken cisterns, that can hold no water." Jer. 2:13.

Let us think of a natural spring or fountain of clear, pure, cool water. On several occasions in my life I have been permitted to drink from just such a spring and on a hot, dry day when the mouth is dry and the lips parched there is nothing that will satisfy the longing of the lips, mouth and body as a drink of cool, clear, pure, refreshing water. Beloved, so is the spiritual side of life; nothing will satisfy the longing of the soul like a good deep drink at the spiritual fountain of living water. That same living water that Jesus referred to when speaking to the woman of Samaria in the 4th chapter of St. John. Jesus had consulted her about a drink and she could not understand why He a Jew would ask of her a Samaritan even so much as a drink of water, as the Jews and Samaritans were very much at outs at this time and the conversation continued to where Jesus told her, "If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of Him, and He would have given thee LIVING WATER.' There they were by Jacob's well and it was deep and Jesus had nothing to draw with. How could He give her living water? She asked the question, "Art thou greater than our father Jacob, which gave us this well, and drank thereof himself, and his children and his cattle?" Jesus answered her with those wonderful life giving words that has thrilled many a hungry soul. "Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again: but whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life." The water from Jacob's well no doubt was good water and would quench the thirst and Jesus was trying to get the

woman of Samaria to see the wonderful plan of the Grace Dispensation and how the Spirit of God could dwell in our hearts and instead of drawing the water it would be a well springing up. Praise be to the Master for His wonderful gift of life to man through Faith in His name.

Many is the time I have pondered the question of what keeps springs and fountains continually springing up. Great men of learning have tried to explain the reason for springs and artisian water. Some of their reasoning has sounded plausable to me, but a few years ago I viewed a large spring in the western part of Texas. The country for several miles around was of desert looks; very few trees and very little grass, no streams other than large tributaries which traversed the country and had their source of water miles away. Yet amongst those rolling hills was a large spring. The opening in the ground was some six or seven feet across and rolling out of that opening was clear, cool, pure water. The sign told us that thousands of gallons flowed from the spring each hour. I do not remember the exact figures but it struck me at the time that surely



it would drain the ocean's level considerable in a month's time and yet they told us that it flowed water with only very little variation year in and year out. As I viewed that wonder of nature I thought how like the fountain of living water. People by the thousands have drawn from the store house of God and yet there are blessings abundantly for all and no way to bankrupt heaven. Springs and fountains are called living when they never cease. Then it is no mystery why the Prophet Jeremiah referred to God as the "Fountain of Living Water." "Fountain of Living Water." Where the water came from to supply that large spring in Texas I don't know and it is a mystery to me but I can readily understand that God who is above all, made all, can keep that hole in the ground spouting forth water. People will try to figure out how God supplies all the spiritual blessings to every one. This I don't understand either but they are there when we need them and that water just keeps coming out of the ground. No wonder Jesus said to the woman of Samaria, speaking of the spiritual living and overcoming life, "-shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life."

The Psalmist David left us a beautiful picture of a blessed character in the first chapter of Psalms. And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season: his leaf also shall not wither: and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper." Oh, that we that name the name of Jesus might all be like the tree planted by the rivers of water. God in His word does not tell us to be planted on the high ridge away from water neither does He tell us to be planted in a dry and thirsty land but wants us to be like a tree planted by the rivers of water and He furnishes the fountain of living water to keep us bringing forth the fruit in the proper season, also His unmerited grace will keep our leaf from withering and His divine Spirit will help us so that whatsoever we do in His name will prosper. Blessed is the man that endureth temptation, for when he is tried, he shall receive a crown of life which the Lord hath promised to them that love him. James 1:12.

If you endure the temptation you are confronted with this moment you are blessed and not only blessed but you will receive a reward from Jesus Christ the righteous one who will not forget to remember you. You may feel you have failed so often, and you may have failed, but let the past failures be stepping stones to a better day. Keep your eyes on Jesus, trust Him who has never failed. The battle is not yours but God's. He will help you to overcome all the trials and tricks of the devil.

have new desires, "They desire a better country, that is a heavenly wherefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for He hath prepared a city for them."

These people of the 11th chapter of Hebrews were not all old folks, Oh! no! Moses who had just come to years, refused to be called the son of Pharoah's daughter.

Just a few years before, Pharoah's daughter claimed Moses (the babe she had rescued) for her own. He had now grown so beautiful that Josepheus tells us that passers by stood still to look at him and laborers left their work to steal a glance. The mother's heart must have suffered as she saw her boy go in at the palace gate. It seems like the cream of all wealth and all of the land of Egypt was poured into the cup of Moses. He was brought up in the palace, and treated as a grandson of Pharoah. Stephen said Moses was learned in all the wisdom of the Egyptians. Stephen also tells us that he was mighty in word and in deed. Acts 7:22. He also was a statesman and a soldier.

Thus year followed year already the foremost positions of states were upon him and it seemed that the rivers of his life would run in the same bed, undiverted and only waxing broader and deeper in its flow. But beneath it all his thoughts were always on his fellow man. His soul was pierced beyond comprehension. He could not forget that his parents were slaves that the bondmen who were groaning in the brickfield beneath the task of the taskmasters were his brethren. # Divine Healing

If nothing were found in the atonement of Christ and in His act of salvation for man's body, His work would not be complete. Then we would need another Saviour to accomplish that which was lacking in Christ's work, because sickness is a direct result of sin.

But there is nothing lacking in the remarkable work of Jesus Christ for the salvation of man. When he cried out on the cross, "It is finished." His work of atonement had been completed to the utmost, and man has in Him the necessary help for his entire being—spirit, soul and body.

When salvation has been com-

pleted and man has experienced it in its fullness, his body also has shared the benefit derived from salvation. The writer to the Hebrews says that the transformation and the glorification of the body belongs to salvation, because "Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall He appear the second time without sin unto salvation." (Heb. 9:28.)

It is, therefore, clear that man's body has a part in the wonderful salvation of Jesus Christ, and why then should it not here on earth, when man has experienced salvation for his soul and his spirit, experience the power which also is able to heal the sicknesses of the body? The prophet speaks at the same time of Christ's atonement and of healing. He says: "But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed." (Isa. 53: 5.)

Jesus also showed by His example, when He wandered here, that He was concerned about the bodies of men as well as their souls. His divine love did not see only mankind's spiritual distress but also his physical distress. His heart was moved with compassion when He saw the suffering of the sick, and He healed them everywhere He went.

To this should be added all of God's wonderful promises to answer prayer. He has promised to grant the requests of the Godfearing. He has given us promises, connected with certain conditions, of course, but if we fulfill these He will do what He has promised. And why should He not hear us when it means helping us bodily as well as when it concerns other things? Is not this need closer to us than most others? Why should we not be permitted to trust Him in this important matter?

Why is the whole world in such an ungodly, wicked, money-mad condition today? Merely because of the old devilish spirit of Anti-Christ that is prevailing even in the lives of our rulers.

Even politicians, sharing the spirit of Anti-Christ, identify their political ends with the spiritual goal of Christianity. They tell the people, "our goal is to bring in the reign of brotherly love." "We seek for more abundant life for all mankind."

Anti-Christ conceives Himself to be a saviour of the people, and multitudes accept him as such. His principal design is to counterfeit the kingdom of God, to deceive the people into exchanging the "blessed hope" of Christ's coming for the dream of what they call, Utopia, to be achieved by human scheming and political planning.

# The Way of The Cross

A fuller knowledge of the Cross of Christ is the deep need of the Christian Church. Not only the liberating, loosing power of the Cross, but the fellowship of the Cross in "power to be martyrs" which is the meaning in the original of "power to witness." How blinded we are in our human vision of the real meaning of Calvary. Christ saved the world, not by His mighty signs and wonders, but by His poured-out life at Golgotha, and God's way of saving the world is still through death, not by mighty signs. The seed grain must die if it is to bear fruit: the "seed grains" that spring from Christ: The Seed-grain must die for fruit. The Cross means the sacrifice of self-that is, wanting anything for self. It means being willing to lose all that others may gain all. Even the cry for "gifts" and "power" may divert advancing souls from the divine purpose of their being "conformed to the image of His Son.'

Let us see what the Apostle Peter set before the believers of his day. "Christ suffered," he writes, "leaving you an example that ye should follow His steps." (I Pet. 2:21.) Bishop Moule says that in the Greek the word rendered "example" is unique. It does not suggest a person who can be watched, but a record that is to be studied! "Follow His steps," writes Peter. To do this the record of "His steps" as He walked the earth as Man must be carefully studied, so that He may be followed. "His steps" led Him to Calvary, and thence to Resurrection, and Ascension glory. Resurrection and Ascension we would like-but not the steps that led thereto.

"Christ suffered." How did He suffer? He suffered innocently. So the Apostle puts before the Christian the example: "This is grace, if for conscience toward God a man endureth griefs, suffering wrongfully." If, when ye do well and suffer for it, ye shall take it patiently, this is grace with God. For hereunto were ye called . . . . (RV margin.)

"Called!" Called to do well and suffer for it! Not called to do well and thus escape the suffering which is generally supposed (and generally does) follow wrong-doing. The calling of the Christian in this world is to follow the steps of the Saviour. Who did well, and "suffered for it." "He did no sin," yet "He suffered!" There was "no guile in His mouth;" He said no word which could draw upon Him a sharp answer, an unkind retort or a rebuke-yet He suffered. "When He was reviled He reviled not again," yea, when He suffered "He threatened not." gave no cause in word or manner, thought or look for the suffering of others, yet He suffered. He "did well, and suffered for it." And this is the Christian's calling-this is the path of following His steps. This is "the high calling of God in Christ Jesus," for this is grace real grace, real proof of Divine



How is this possible in actual practice? Only as it was possible to Christ Himself. He "emptied Himself" and became Man, so that He suffered as a Man, and is "touched with the feeling of our weaknesses." He suffered as we do when "reviled," when reproached, when buffeted. But He had grace, because in the suffering "He kept handing Himself over to Him that judgeth righteously." (I Pet. 2:23 Lit.)

However keen the taunt, however untrue and unjust the accusation, He had grace, and "threatened not," but "kept handing Himself over" to God! He spoke not of the certain judgment when

He knew all lay before the people who cried, "Crucify Him." He answered not the false witnesses who twisted His words and charged Him with evil purposes. He said nothing to the scoffing, spitting soldiers of the "twelve legions of angels" which one word to His Father could bring to His He threatened not! opened not His mouth," but "kept handing Himself over" to the Righteous Judge; and it was that we might thus have "grace" that "His own self bare our sins in His body on the tree, that we, having died (in Him and with Him) unto sins, might live unto righteousness."

Because, then, Christ "suffered in the flesh," the call comes to us: "Arm yourselves with the same thought" (ch. 4:1 R. V. m.). Christ suffered in my stead, suffered innocently to redeem me; then I must follow in His steps and accept the calling to "do well and suffer for it." If I thus "suffer in the flesh" I shall "cease unto sins"—cease from threatening, resenting, answering again.

Will you study the record? Will you cease desiring to escape the Cross, and choose rather "to suffer affliction with the people of God" than to have the pleasure of sin for a season? How changed Peter was by his being an eye-witness of the sufferings of Christ! Once he sprang with his sword to defend His Lord. Once he cried to the Lord, in view of the path of the Cross, "Pity Thyself, this shall not be unto Thee." But now he had followed the Lamb, and drunk of His Spirit, so that he can tell the believers that to do well and suffer for it is the heavenly calling. "Christ suffered" is now his one answer to all their suffering: "It is enough that the servant be as his Lord.'

"Wherefore," again he says, "let them also that suffer according to the will of God keep handing over their souls in well-doing unto a faithful Creator" (4:19, Lit.) "Keep handing over"—then will God also keep "handing over grace" for every time of need. He is a faithful Creator, re-creating the believer in the image of His Son by giving grace to "follow His steps."

# Whither Are We Drifting?

One of the most outstanding "end time" signs of today is the world-wide prevalence of FORM of godliness, but DENY-ING THE POWER thereof." This universal tendency is a sinking down to age-old levels of man's dogmas displacing God's commands in wholesale fashion. Pastors and deacons are no longer concerned whether new 'converts' have truly repented and been born again; rather, how much they can pledge in time and money to the church machinery (mainly social). Small wonder a great number are only "ascenting sinners," thinking themselves "eternally secure." A Methodist minister recently testified that upon embracing the Roman Catholic faith, "an inutterable peace flooded his soul," for which he had long sought. What certain proof that this "blind leader of the blind" had never known real repentance, and in his groping succumbed to Satan's beguiling substitute.

Protestant ministers now openly advocate ritualistic services in their already dead churches, the final step to completing their spirit-denying "form of godliness" with all its mausoleum trappings. The Roman church is watching this retrogression with interest. Perhaps they see the preliminary transition of reverting back en masse to their age old, man-made, impressive embalmed forms, choosing to "work out their own salvation" (destruction instead).

During Jesus' earthly ministry, Judaism temple ritual moved its congregation to tears; but it was the kind of religion that killed Christ. With a damning denunciation He declared, "your house is left unto you DESOLATE. Luke 13:35. In this Laodicean age churchanity is "increased with GOODS and have need of nothing," materially for this life; but so shameful do they appear spiritually that Jesus sees them "wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked." Rev. 3:17. WHY? Because they have rejected and denied the Holy Spirit, God's executor, in

sin-convicting, life-transforming power.

A spiritual vacuum cannot exist any more than an unnatural physical vacuum can, as the Holy Spirit withdraws from the world, satan's forces rush in. There is no neutral ground. The "devil that deceiveth the whole world" is gaining ground steadily. "Wherein . . ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that NOW WORKETH in the children of disobedience." Eph. 2:2. When the sifting time comes, which is surely coming, these false, man-made "gates of heaven" organizations which deceived their willing millions will crumble completely upon their foundations of shifting sand; and man's edifice of Christ-rejecting folly will collapse into its own cesspool of corruption and diabolical deceit. What complete and final proof of God's word found in I Cor. 3:11. FOR OTHER FOUNDATION CAN NO MAN LAY THAN THAT IS LAID. WHICH IS JESUS CHRIST.

How readily man is willing to immediately accept a man-made lie, and just as readily reject and ridicule the repeated warnings of God's infallible Word, the "sword of the Spirit." A good example of this was the nation-wide radio broadcast in the late '30's of a dramatic and very fantastic "inva-sion from Mars," which caused considerable consternation across the country. But the preaching of Christ's soon coming and God's impending judgment upon a Christ-rejecting world from His word brings derisive sneers or frivolous unconcern.

Let us look at some startling things now going on under our very noses. One organization which calls itself the "Federal Council of Churches of Christian America," a vicious counterfeit of its title, claims to represent about 25 million Christians in 25 leading denominations. The fact that the followers are kept in ignorance of its real aims speaks for itself. It is more anti-Christ than Chris-

tian, as it denies every foundational doctrine of God's word, endeavoring to undermine every proof of the supernatural. The 'big men' in the ranks of this arrogant council are the leading modernists of the country, Harry Emerson Fosdick being their chief radio mouthpiece! But let's see what they have to say. (quote) I. The Virgin Birth.

"Do not . . . tie this great affirmation up with MIRACU-LOUS accompaniments, such as the virgin birth . . . as you know, I cannot believe it."—H. E. Fosdick. "We find no mention of the doctrine of the virgin birth in any Gospel written before A. D. 80, or within 50 years of the Crucifixion . . . Throughout the gospel . . . Jesus is referred to as 'the son of Joseph' and there is NO HINT of anything unusual in his birth." Sherwood Eddy.

II. Deity of Christ.

"Some students can hardly explain their resentments of the tendency to defy Jesus . . . Is not this tendency more HEATHEN than Christian? Are we not more truly Christian when we cut loose from a heathen propensity and take Jesus simply for the character that He was and the ideal that He is? Bishop McConnel. (See Acts 4: 25).

III. A miracle-working God.

To suppose that a man in order to be a loyal and devout disciple of our Lord in the 20th century, A. D., must think that God in the 9th century B. C. MIRACULOUSLY sent bears to eat up unruly children or make an axehead swim seems to me dangerously RIDICULOUS . . . Joshua making the sun stand still may be poetry and the story of Jonah and the great fish may be a parable; the MIRACULOUS aspects of the plagues of Egypt and the magic fall of Jericho's walls may be legendary heightenings of historical events; the amazing TALES of Elijah and Elisha may be largely folk-lore; and in the new testament finding a coin in a fish's mouth to pay the temple tax, or walking on water, or blasting a tree with a curse may be just such STORIES as always have been associated with an era of outstanding personalities . . . I find some of the miracle-narratives of scripture historically incredible!' Six days in a week we live in an ordered world. On the seventh, we open the church door on a land of topsy-turvy, where axes float, dry sticks change to serpents, cities are let down out of the sky, angels stir the water of wells, bedeviled swine run violently into the sea. We say prayers for rain an hour after we have consulted government bulletins . . . we solemnly repeat 'maker of heaven and earth' . . . yet all the while we know perfectly well that . . . this universe WAS NEVER MADE BY ANY-BODY . . . We moderns have lost faith in miracles, and if by 'miracles' we mean occurrences involving the 'breaking of nature's laws, WE ARE RIGHT, for nature's laws are God's laws AND ARE NEVER BROKEN . . . (Modern use of the Bible by H. E. Fosdick.) IV. Atonement of Christ.



Greetings!

We feel it is the prayers of God's people that gave us a safe trip to Alaska and has directed us thus far.

We found the weather very nice here in the Matanuska Valley. Most all the snow was gone when we arrived. We are almost completely surrounded by snow-capped mountains.

The days are getting rather long now, the sun comes up at 4:00 and it will soon rise at 2:00 and set at 9:00 in the evening.

We have visited several different churches and found the people to be friendly and they are doing their best to help us get settled.

Brother Palmer and myself accepted the invitation to preach at a Youth Rally in Anchorage. We plan to start soon in jail services, street services or what ever channel may open up.

The cost of living is so high here we are going to plant a garden and grow everything we can. Raspberries, currants and cranberries grow wild. We plan to can all that we can get. We also plan to can a good supply of Salmon when they start to run. We hope by these ways to cut down the cost of living which is extremely high.

In the cafes a hamburger is 60 cents; glass of milk 20 cents, in the stores lettuce is 60 cents a pound, cabbage 35 cents, bananas 50 cents a pound. We are still amazed at Alaska prices.

We are anxious to get something started but must move in the way that will best please the Master. We desire your prayers.

As soon as some radio time is available we plan on a program. The station at Anchorage is a 1000 watt station, and is to be increased to 5000 watts in July. It reaches the Matanuska Valley very well. - 8. When it is more afraid of innovation than of stagnation.
- 9. When its Missionary vision has grown wane.
- 10. When its members are unwilling to study to "show themselves approved unto God" and when many of them "can't afford to pay a few cents per month for a church paper" while cheerfully paying twelve to twenty cents per week for a secular newspaper.

When Paul said, "I am a debtor to both the Greeks and to the barbarians both to the wise and to the unwise," he did not mean that he had received anything from them for which he was bound to pay them. Neither did he owe to Greek or barbarian any gratitude for favors which he had received at their hands, for in almost every city in which he labored he had encountered persecution and suffered wrong.

Not, therefore, on the ground of anything which he had obtained from them, but solely on the ground of that which he had received from another for them, does he acknowledge himself the debtor. The glorious Gospel of the blessed God" had been "committed" to his "trust;" he had been 'allowed of God to be put in trust with the Gospel" for their benefit, and therefore, that he might be a faithful steward of the mysteries of God, he was exceedingly desirous of preaching the truth, as it is in Jesus, to men of every nation and of every degree. He could not honestly hold it back. It had not been given to him for himself alone; and if he had attempted to keep it from his fellowmen, he would have been guilty of the greatest defalcation, and could not have vindicated himself either at the bar of conscience, or at the bar of God.

This explains the earnestness, the perseverance, and the self-sacrifice of his missionary life.
