Covid19 protocols will follow local and state guidelines and will be announced to competitors closer to the event.

Welfare of the Horse: Riders (and trainers) are responsible for ensuring that their horses are sound and fit enough for competition. It is at the discretion of the judges to excuse a horse if they feel the horse is not sound or is struggling.

Who May Compete:

Age (through age 25): The FEI age rule applies, which is the age the rider reaches in the calendar year. For example, if the rider becomes 25 years old in 2022, the rider is eligible, but if the rider becomes 26 years old in 2022, the rider is not. If the rider turns 12 anytime in the year 2022, the rider is considered to be 12 for the show.

Qualifying Score: Rider needs one score of 57% or higher from any USEF or FEI dressage test of the level or a higher level from June 1, 2021 to July 17, 2022. Note: Division AA riders need one score of 57% or higher at USDF Introductory Test C or any test at Training Level. Scores from equivalent USEF dressage tests for eventing are acceptable. Previous YDF competitors are automatically eligible at the same level or lower. Riders 14 and under who have previously competed in the LYDF First Level Division are automatically eligible to enter the FEI Children's Division. The score may be received from any occasion (including schooling shows, events, and Pony Club competitions) where the judge is a USDF 'L' graduate, USEF or FEI Dressage judge. Rider must submit a copy of the front page only of the test with Entry Form. A qualifying score is not needed for the Leadline Class.

If a rider is trying to achieve a qualifying score on the last weekend, July 16-17, rider must send their entry by the July 18th closing date and then fax the front page of the test showing the qualifying score to the Entry Secretary by July 18, 2022. If rider does not achieve a qualifying score, rider must contact the Entry Secretary by July 18, 2022 and entry fees will be returned minus a \$10 office fee. A rider who has not achieved a qualifying score and does not notify the Entry Secretary by July 18, 2022 will be removed from the show without a refund.

Rider may compete on a different horse from the one on which the qualifying score was received. A rider may either: 1) enter two consecutive Divisions with the same horse, or 2) enter two Divisions on two different horses at the same level or different levels. The qualifying score must be obtained at the higher level of the two Divisions chosen. A rider, with the exception to those entering the Walk/Trot or AA Introductory C Divisions, can enter a maximum of two Divisions (levels). A rider in the Walk/Trot or AA Introductory C Division can only enter one Division. A rider who has previously won a Division may not compete again on the same horse in that Division, with the exception of the Walk/Trot Division and the FEI Divisions.

Horse may be ridden by one rider in two consecutive Divisions, except where noted, or two riders in the same or different Divisions. A horse may compete in two Divisions only. **Horses entered at 2nd Level and above are permitted to be ridden in only 2 classes per day, including optional mounted classes not including leadline. Horses entered at 1st level or below are permitted to be ridden in 3 classes per day including mounted optional classes not including leadline.** The welfare of the horse is of utmost importance – please be mindful of your time warming up.

Divisions:

The Divisions are the heart of the Youth Dressage Festival. Each Division consists of three Sections: Written Test (Friday evening) and Dressage/Equitation Class (Saturday). Each Section is worth 100 points for a total of 300 points. Total points from the three sections determine placings. Ties are broken by using the Equitation score, then Dressage Test score and, if needed, the Written

For example, for Division #11, the rider will take a written test for their age group and ride in a dressage test class for their Division where they will receive a score for the Dressage Test from the judge at C and an equitation score from an equitation judge at another position. A rider entering one of the FEI Divisions rides the Team dressage test of that level with exception to the FEI U25 level which has only one test.

Reminder: A specific age will no longer be split across Divisions in order to make the Divisions similar in size. For this reason the numbers of riders in each Division may vary.

Dressage Test Section:

WT – Walk/Trot Division 2019 USDF Introductory Test B, to be ridden in the small arena, 20x40m. For riders ages 14 and under who have never competed in a recognized competition where cantering is required. Riders in this division may not ride in any other division or class except for a Walk/Trot class or TOC Class in the Friday Schooling Show and optional mounted classes where there is no canter involved such as Dressage Trail for Walk/Trot, and Quadrille Class (Introductory level).

AA – Walk/Trot/Canter Division 2019 USDF Introductory Test C, to be ridden in the small arena 20x40m. For riders who have never competed at First Level or above. Riders in this Division may not ride in any other Division but may compete in optional classes.

Para Equestrian (PE) Divisions:

PEA - Para Equestrian Division A – 2022 FEI PE Grade 1 Team Test (previously known as Team Test for Grade 1a) Open to riders with a permanent physical disability who have never competed in a FEI PE Championship Test for their classification grade, or at Training Level or above. *Riders in this Division may compete only in this Division.*

PEB – Para Equestrian Division B – Open to all riders with a permanent physical disability. Riders may choose to compete in the current FEI PE Team Test that is most appropriate for their skill level (Grades II thru V). Riders in this Division may also enter another Division which is considered the equivalent, or consecutive level, of the Para Team Test being ridden, if qualified. Additional information for Para Equestrian Divisions A and B:

1. Riders must either include a copy of their FEI, USEF or other national Dispensation Certificate, or other medical documentation which would be reviewed by the Show Committee to ensure the rider meets the minimum criteria for a physical disability. Riders with cognitive disabilities do not qualify to compete.
2. Compensating aids and special equipment used must follow the USEF/FEI rules and are subject to approval by the Show Committee.

Written Test Section:

Consists of multiple choice or fill-in-the blanks questions. [Please note on Entry Form if special test-taking needs](#) are required.

Equitation Section:

Riders will be scored on equitation during their dressage test ride. One judge at C will score the dressage test and a judge at another position will score the equitation. Riders will receive a separate score sheet for their equitation. The rider's position and seat will be judged along with the correct use and effect of the aids. The rider's position will be judged as it relates to the horse's balance for example, a rider with a classical hunt seat position would be acceptable at Training Level but not at Third Level. The [score sheet](#) for the equitation section is posted on the LYDF website and is on the last page of Prize List.

Optional Classes:

Entries will be limited – send your entries as early as possible. Entries for oversubscribed classes will be accepted in order of receipt. Please review "Horse" Section on Page 2 for the number of mounted classes permitted each day. If rider's entry includes more than the allowable number of mounted classes per day, the fees for the additional classes will be considered a donation to D4K. .

Kross Creek Farm Team Competition

Teams are made up of three or four riders of any levels [including](#) the Walk/Trot Division. Highest three Division scores count. This is not a separate ride. A rider may be on only one team. If the rider has entered 2 Divisions, the scores are used from the rider's higher Division. [Team members and team name must be declared on the Entry Form](#) or to the Show Secretary no later than 5 p.m. Friday, August 12th. Riders who would like to be on a team but do not have a team designated may check the "Wanna Be on a Team" box on the Entry Form. "Wanna Be on a Team" riders will be randomly combined to form team(s). "Wanna Be on a Team" riders can check the Team Roster posted outside of the Show Office and submit any changes no later than 5 p.m. on Friday. Para riders can be on a team if they have been graded and if they submit their card to the Show Office.

Schooling Show (Friday)

Only one test per rider/horse combination permitted and is included in the Division fee. If a rider enters a second Division, a second schooling show entry is permitted and included in the additional Division fee. Reminder: Tests will be scored by the Show Office and scores may be used towards the [USDF Schooling Show Awards Program](#). TOC Pony Class Results will determine the National Dressage Pony Cup Awards (see Awards Section for details).

Judging Sport Horse Conformation (Friday), Class JHC

No horse needed. Class will be score on how closely competitor's scores come to the scores of the appointed judge. For more information go to:

Handler Class (Friday), Class HDL

Presenting a horse or pony on a Triangle. Each entry will include a horse, a lead handler and a whip handler. All must wear helmets. This in-hand class on the triangle will be judged on the lead handler and the whip handler based on how they work together as a team. For more information go to:

Quadrille Class (Saturday 3-6 PM)

Team of 4 riders required. In a quadrille competition the main criteria is the team's performance as a cohesive group. Compulsory routines test the team's ability to perform required movements according to acceptable standards. Judges look for the teams to keep even spacing (from rider to rider), move and turn in synchrony and maintain alignment throughout the ride. Quadrilles from Introductory through First Level are offered at the Festival. A rider competing in a higher level Division may compete in a quadrille.

Each quadrille member should be able to perform the USDF/USEF dressage tests at the desired level. The quadrille tests and additional information about quadrilles in general are available through the USDF website at

<https://www.usdf.org/education/other-programs/quadrille/>. Quadrilles require much practice prior to the competition, please plan accordingly.

Leadline Class (Saturday)

Open to riders at least 4 years old but no older than 8. . Rider to be led through the test, saluting at the beginning and end. Rider may either walk or trot the 20-meter circle. No qualifying requirement. Tested posted at: <https://dressage4kids.org/d4k-festival/optional-classes/leadline.html>

Dressage Trail Class (Saturday & Sunday)

Riders guide their horses through a preset pattern that demonstrates the practical goals of dressage training. Potential trail horse patterns are available at:

Class 2DT1 Saturday - Walk/Trot Only.

Class 3DT1 Sunday - Walk/Trot Only.

Class 2DT2 Saturday - Includes canter, more difficult tests may include a bridge, backing a turn, small jump, etc.

Class 3DT2 Sunday- includes canter, more difficult tests may include a bridge, backing a turn, small jump, etc.

Prix Caprilli Class (Sunday)

Dressage test with jumps, ridden in a standard dressage arena. Tests posted at: <https://dressage4kids.org/d4k-festival/optional-classes/prix-caprilli.html>.

Class PCT Training Level Training Level movements with jumps no higher than 2'. Open to all riders except Walk/Trot Division.

Class PCF First Level First Level movements with jumps no higher than 2'6". Open to all riders competing First Level and above.

Musical Freestyle Class (Sunday)

Class will be limited to 25 riders on a first come, first serve basis. Riders may ride any USDF, USEF or FEI Freestyle . [Indicate level on entry form](#). Riders must have received one freestyle score of 62% at the level to be eligible. Rider must submit front page only of the qualifying test. Please check USDF/FEI rules for requirements.

Other Competitions and Activities (No Entry Fee):

Cover Art Contest (Deadline July 5, 2022)

A drawing or photo by anyone 25 and under will be chosen for the cover of the electronic Show Program and possibly on show t-shirts. The artist does not have to be entered in the show. Other artwork submitted but not chosen for the cover will also be included inside the program and possibly also the WEP program in February. Drawings may be mailed or sent electronically. All drawings should be no larger than 8" x 11", must be vertical (like the front of a book) and can be in color or black/white. Photos must be vertical and sent electronically at 300 dpi at 100% of the size; if it is a smaller photo, the resolution needs to be higher. Do not include words or numbers in drawings (except logical dressage show word/numbers, such a bridle number or arena letters), but do sign them at the bottom. Tack Room Competition - Teams or groups of riders who are stabled together may enter this competition. Stall Areas/Tack Rooms will be judged on set-up, cleanliness, and originality. Emphasis will be placed on originality. No flammable materials or lights. [To request stabling together, use the Entry Form and the same stable name](#). Judging will take place on Saturday from 12- to 2PM.

Turn Out Inspection - On Friday, riders may present themselves before their first ride for an inspection of horse, rider, and tack at the specified area. A sign-up sheet will be available located at the Volunteer Table.

Ice Cream Social: Saturday at 3PM in the VIP Pavilion during the Quadrille Class. For competitors only.

Ride On The Side: Friday - Exact time and location will be announced at the Festival. Margaret Freeman (S) will discuss rides from the judge's point of view allowing questions and discussion.

Trainers Forum: Friday during the Written Test.

Stable Management Challenge (Sunday 9-11 am) – The two top scorers in the Written Test in each of the age groups 11 through 25 will be invited to participate in a practical Stable Management test which may include a check of their stall care, putting on bandages, recognizing good quality feed, fitting a saddle and other management skills. A list of riders qualifying for this competition will be posted outside of the Show Office on Saturday by 2PM.

Awards:

- Grand Champion and Reserve Ribbons for overall highest score. **New for 2022** – Overall Festival Champion will receive a \$1,000 training grant and the Overall Festival Reserve Champion will receive a \$750 training grant. Grants must be used for specific educational expenses that may include, but are not limited to: clinics, lessons, seminars, workshops and training programs. Grant recipients will be required to write a report detailing what they have learned during these training activities.
- Division winners 1-6 to be presented ribbons and prizes. Ribbons for winners placing 7-10 will be available for pick up at the Awards Table.
- Six ribbons in each Class.
- Six ribbons in each Section (Written Test, Equitation and Dressage Test) within each Division. Ribbons may be picked up at the Awards Table after results are posted.
- Awards for top scorers in the Stall Area/Tack Room Competition.
- Kross Creek Farm Team Competition ribbons.
- Special Awards - see Page 8.

Management makes every effort to give appropriate prizes/awards to placeholders. Once given, it becomes the responsibility of the recipient. Management will not replace lost or stolen prizes including gift certificates. Awards and ribbons must be picked up in person and will not be mailed.

National Dressage Pony Cup Awards - Using the scores from the Pony Test of Choice Class during Friday's Schooling Show, ribbons for first through sixth places in each of the 3 groups will be awarded (groups TBD). USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program - Dressage test scores earned on Friday and Saturday may count towards the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. In addition to other requirements, rider must be a member of a Group Member Organization (GMO). For more information please go to <https://www.usdf.org/awards/performance/regional-schooling.asp>.

Entries:

Entries may be limited at management's discretion. Riders are encouraged to submit their entry on Entry Open Date or soon thereafter. Rider's complete entry MUST be received by the closing date. If a rider is trying to achieve a qualifying score on the last weekend, July 16-17, rider must send their entry by the closing date and then fax the front page of the test showing the qualifying score to the Entry Secretary by July 18, 2022. If rider does not achieve a qualifying score, contact the Entry Secretary by July 18, 2022 and entry fees will be returned minus a \$10 office fee. A rider who has not achieved a qualifying score and does not notify the Entry Secretary by July 18, 2022 will be removed from the show without a refund.

Riders MUST specify their [birth date](#) on the entry form. A [negative Coggins Test](#) dated within 12 months [and proof of Equine Influenza, EH1 and EH4 within 6 months](#) of the Festival must accompany entry.

Post entries may be accepted to fill scratches at management's discretion with a \$25 office fee. Do not expect to be able to change entries after the closing date. No refunds after closing date. A \$10 office fee will be charged for refunds made before closing date. Management reserves the right to combine, divide, or cancel classes.

Payment Methods: Check, Money Order or Credit Cards. Checks payable to Dressage4Kids, Inc. With the exception of sponsored teams, a separate check must be enclosed with each entry unless previous arrangements have been made with the Entry Secretary. Credit card payments will be accepted through Dressage4Kids website: <https://dressage4kids.org/d4k-festival/entry-info/pay-online.html> or www.HorseShowOffice.com for online entries. Entries may be sent by mail, fax or email. Email confirmations will be sent. Contact the Entry Show Secretary if you do not receive a confirmation. **Entries will not be processed unless payment has been received.**

Refunds:

If classes are scratched and/or entire entry is withdrawn by the closing date, July 18, 2022, in writing to the Entry Secretary (email is acceptable), a full refund less \$10 office fee will be sent after the show. If the withdrawal is made by July 27, 2022 in writing to the entry secretary (email is acceptable), the refund will be for the cost of the stabling, golf carts, and shavings. All refunds will be sent after the show. After July 27, 2022, there are no refunds. If a new entry is submitted to replace a withdrawn entry all funds may be transferred, less the \$10 office fee.

Golf Carts \$110 per day for a 4-seater (one with a back seat) for Friday-Sunday. Rentals are available Thursday between 1-6 p.m. at the rate of \$55 for 4-seater. Carts may be picked up an hour before close the day before at no extra charge. Daily rentals for Friday/Saturday/Sunday must be returned by 5:00 p.m. that day. [Reserve carts on Entry Form and be sure to check the days that you will be renting the cart.](#) Depending on availability, carts may be rented from D4K at the show grounds. There will be a limited supply of golf carts and they will be assigned on a first come, first served basis. Refunds will be processed for requests unable to be filled.

Stabling:

No horses are to arrive before 11 AM on Thursday. Stabling in permanent 12x12 stalls. [Riders requesting adjoining stalls must use the same stable name \(not team name\) on all Entry Forms.](#) You may not change stalls after you arrive. Paddock rentals are not in lieu of stalls. Every horse staying on the showgrounds for the duration must have a stall – no exceptions.

In the interest of safety, aisles must be kept clear (NO bikes in the aisles or anywhere near where horses go) and there must be plenty of room for two horses to pass one another. It is at the discretion of Dressage4Kids and its volunteers to mandate that you move something for safety reasons.

Please note: [In the Stabling section of the Entry Form](#) - The Stable Name is the name that all riders who want to stable together will give.

[Shavings can be pre-ordered on the Entry Form.](#) Shavings are \$10 per bag. Each stall requires approximately 4 or 5 bags to bed it. There will be no hay available at the show. There will be limited availability for shavings at the show.

Stalls do NOT need to be stripped before leaving the show grounds.

Paddocks are for turnout only. Horses in paddocks must not be left unattended. NO horses permitted in paddocks overnight. All paddocks must be empty by 6PM each night and not reopened until 7AM each morning.

Proof of Equine Vaccination (VERY IMPORTANT)

The HITS Show Grounds requires that every horse be vaccinated against the Equine Influenza, EH1 and EH4 within 6 months of the Festival. If a vaccination will expire during the Festival, the horse must receive the vaccination 14 days prior to the start of the Festival. [Submit proof of vaccination, along with negative Coggins, at time of entry.](#)

Rules:

Competitor's Volunteer Requirement: All competitors MUST volunteer for at least 1 hour during the show. Once you have arrived and have your horse stabled, get your packet from the Show Secretary, check your ride times, and then go to the Volunteer Booth for your assignment(s). Competitors need to know their ride times and warm up requirements before coming to the volunteer booth to sign up for their volunteer hour. Parents may accompany the competitor but may not sign up for them.

Attire: Riders may wear traditional show attire. Informal attire (short or long-sleeved polo shirts; no tee-shirts) also is acceptable in the performance arena in place of traditional show attire. Teams may want to have matching shirts. All riders must wear proper attire when mounted. ASTM/SEI-approved helmets are required for ALL riders when mounted, including FEI levels. Helmets will also be required for all Handler Class entries and those handling the demo horses for the Sport Horse Conformation Class. The wearing of an improper helmet is grounds for disqualification. Whips and blunt spurs are allowed. Judges may deduct up to two points for messy attire in the performance arena. Award recipients must be in neat competition attire (unmounted) to receive their Division awards.

Bridle Numbers: Horses must wear a bridle number at all times when out of the stall.

Tack and Bits must follow USEF dressage rules. Bits used in competition must be the same bits used in the warm-up immediately preceding the competition. Draw reins are not permitted at any time on the show grounds. Horse boots and/or polos are allowed in warm-up areas. The Show Management reserves the right to inspect any rider and their equipment at any time for compliance with the show rules. Non-compliance will be grounds for disqualification.

Schooling is permitted only when the Show Office is open. Please refer to the Tentative Schedule on the next page. Trainers may school competitor horses on Thursday and Friday only and must sign a Release at the Show Office prior to riding. Any violation to this rule may result in the disqualification of the competitor.

No coaching is allowed any time while the rider is competing. Any rider receiving coaching while in the competition ring will be disqualified whether the rider requested such assistance or not. Any visual or verbal communication with the rider is considered coaching.

Readers are not permitted for the Dressage/Equitation class.

Ring stewards are not there to assist the riders with their times or after whom they ride. The riders need to know in what ring they ride, their times, and the numbers of the riders ahead of them. Do not ask the stewards.

An adult must supervise all young children at all times.

Parking Five points may be taken off the final score of any rider whose vehicle is parked in illegal parking areas. Two-horse trailers will be allowed 15 minutes to unload; larger vehicles will be allowed one-half hour to unload. After these times, all vehicles will have to be moved to parking areas. All trailers must be parked in the Campground area. Parking permitted on one side of the barn ONLY.

Golf carts or any motorized vehicle (i.e. scooters) brought to the show may be operated only by licensed drivers.

Dogs must be leashed and kept quiet in stabling and riding areas.

Infractions of any rules may be cause for elimination or up to a 5-point penalty at the discretion of management.

Information:

Award Times - Management will do their best to inform riders about award times, but it is the riders' responsibility to be on time for awards. No awards will be mailed. Riders will pick up ribbons for the following classes and competitions at the Ribbons and Information Table (where scored dressage tests are located): Handler, Judging Sport Horse Conformation, Dressage Trail, Musical Freestyle, Prix Caprilli and Quadrille classes. The Leadline Class will be awarded in the ring at the end of the Class. .

Special Awards - Winners will be posted by the Show Office on the score board as they become available. Once winners are posted, they can pick up their award at the "Awards" Location. A photographic opportunity will be available.

Tentative Times - Times and important additional information will be posted on the [Dressage4Kids website](#) one week prior to the show, but are subject to change. Official times will be posted by 7 a.m. on each show day.
