Goulash Sautéed Veges Spotted Dog

One great way to use left over potatoes and meat from roasting venison, antelope or elk, is to make **Goulash**. This can be as elaborate or as simple as your prefer. Pull the meat from the bones and set aside.

Pour a little oil in your skillet to fry out a handful of sliced onions and potatoes. Add the meat, along with a can of tomato sauce or soup, or a package of dehydrated vegetables. Add as much water as needed to make a stew or sauce mixture.

As a companion dish, **sauté fresh vegetables**. Cut into good eatin' size any or all of the following veges: onion, carrots, green beans, peas, zucchini, yellow squash, etc. Pour a small amount in another pan or frying pan, and start with the onions. When they turn transparent, add the other vegetables and a small amount of water. Cover and (over a lower fire) allow the vegetables to sauté until tender.

A good way to end the meal is with a serving of **Spotted Dog** (Thanks to The Book of Buckskinning III).

6	slices Stale dry bread	4 Eggs
2	Cups Milk	1 Cup Raisins
⅓	lb Brown sugar	2 TBSP Cinnamon
1	tsp Nutmeg	1 small Onion, chopped
⅓	lb butter	2 Apples, chopped

Break bread into bite-sized pieces. Beat eggs well and mix with milk. Add raisins, sugar, and apples. Mix well. Add onion and spices. Melt butter in two cups of water, mix with bread pieces and add all to milk mixture. Pour into well greased Dutch Oven and bake until solid, about one hour.

Optional: Add shredded cheddar cheese. Add one-half cup brand or rum. Or omit onion.


