


Hansen 4th Annual Fragile X Golf Outing - Delivery anyone? John and Nick Hansen had fun keeping golfers hydrated and fed.




Laureen Majeske was awarded the National Fragile X Foundation Education & Awareness Award for significant contributions to the awareness of Fragile X.





On the Research Front - Progress, Progress, Progress! By Sally Nantais

Seaside Therapeutics released positive results in July (fragile X study) and September (autism study) on the Phase 2 study of STX209 (Arbaclofen). The fragile X study was a double-blind placebo controlled study with 63 enrollees, including a few from FXAM families.

The improvements were statistically significant in patients with more severe impairments in sociability. In the fragile X study 41 patients are still active, including my son Austin. While we've been on STX209 we've eliminated two meds and we've cut Austin's Abilify dose in half, now he is only on STX209 and Abilify.

The autism study was an open label

trial. The patients were only given the STX209 medication (no placebo was given) and 32 patients were enrolled. Within the autism study statistically significant improvements were reported in the irritability and social withdrawal subscale in the study.

A team of researchers at Emory University have identified a potential new strategy for treating fragile X syndrome, the most common inherited cause of intellectual disability.

The researchers have found that a class of drugs called

phosphoinositide-3 (PI3) kinase inhibitors can correct defects in the anatomy of neurons seen in a mouse model of fragile X syndrome.. Read more at:

Dr. Randi Hagerman, U.C. Davis, reported positive results with patients using Minocycline. This was with a group of families who volunteered to try Minocycline, a drug used to treat acne. The study has moved to a double-blind placebo controlled study. The study of Minocycline originated in a trial which is ongoing and sponsored by the FRAXA Research Foundation.



Individualized Education Program (IEP) Development Process

When you have your next IEP you are going to find that the IEP form has changed drastically. Don't let a simple form throw a wrench into the works, take the time now to familiarize yourself with the new form. A pdf version of the new IEP form is available at:

michigan.gov/documents/mde/IEPform_319500_7.pdf Changes have been made to more than just the IEP form, on the IEP Development Process page you'll find links to all revised forms (Notice of Meeting, Reevaluation/Annual Review and Amendment Form).

There are Quick Reference Guides and Podcasts broken down by individual sections of the IEP. For example, a guide and podcast is available on **Section 2:** Present Level of Academic Achievement and Functional Performance (PLAAFP), common to all IEPs, and one is available on **Section 3:** Secondary Transition Considerations, which is not included in young children's IEPs. Secondary transition services are required to be **in effect** when the student turns 16.

From Emotions to Advocacy By Pete and Pam Wright


